I was reading devotions from "These Days," thinking about May, and there were two messages that I want to share with you. The first one is about Jesus' statement from John 14:14, NRSV (New Revised Standard Version). "If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it." I also read two other scriptures: one from the NIV (New In-

tures: one from the NIV (New ternational Version) and from the CEB (Common English Bible). Here is what I found: There was some difference. The NIV says: "You may ask

says: "You may ask me for anything in my name and I will do it." And the CEB says: "When you ask me for an-

ything in my name, I will do it." Definitely something for you

to ponder!

The second devotion is about Core Values. The writer is Sara Lewis from Ocean City, Maryland. Her message is about living and praying with our Bible. She has three ideas for you to pray, and these are likely to be prayers that you have heard before. The first one is, "The Fruits of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22-23." You might remember them being about love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These always remind me of my children as they loved the song, "Fruits of the Spirit," and we sang a lot, and I often sang to them, "Have Patience, don't be in such a hurry."

The second core value listed is the "Full Armor of God, from Ephesians 6:14-18." Remember hearing about fastening the belt of truth and the breastplate. Read this core value and think about how important it is for you.

The third core value listed is the "Whatever's, from Philippians 4:8." This is important, especially when we are so busy, we have difficulty focusing on the positives. You may remember this,

"whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, praiseworthy and think (pray) about such things." We all have times that we do not have the words to pray. These core values help us find those words, especially during times that are difficult and as well as times of joy. Let us all remember that whether we are struggling, or when life is going smoothly or somewhere in

between, our God is with us

always.

Let's go back to May as it is a delightful time. Take time to ponder on what you like most about spring and truly enjoy our longer days, spring weather, being able to take walks, sitting on the porch, and beginning to plant seeds. Our God is an

awesome God!



MAY MISSION FOCUS

Access to transportation is a major factor in getting out of homelessness or making

homelessness more comfortable. For example, getting to social services, traveling to work or seeing a doctor can be much harder or even impossible without public transit.

So for the month of May, the Mission & Outreach Committee has decided to collect bus passes! The cost of an adult ticket is \$1.50 (75 cents for elderly, disabled and youth) or \$5.00 for a day pass. We have a goal of collecting 500 bus passes to help support the 950 homeless people in the F - M area.
