



#### THE COMMISSIONING PENNANT

At the moment the commission pennant is broken, a ship becomes the responsibility of the Commanding Officer, who, together with the ship's officers and crew, has the duty of making her ready for any service required by our nation, whether at peace or at war.



For centuries the commissioning pennant has been the symbol of a man-of-war. It is believed to date to the 17th century, when the Dutch were at war with the English. Duty Admiral Marten Harpertzoon Tromp hoisted a broom at the masthead to symbolize his intention to sweep the English from the sea. This gesture was answered by British Admiral William Blake who hoisted a horsewhip, indicating his intention to chastise the Dutch. The victorious British thus set the precedent for a long, narrow commissioning pennant to symbolize the original horsewhip as the distinctive symbol of a ship of war.



The modern U.S. Navy commissioning pennant is blue at the hoist with a union of seven white stars and a horizontal red and white stripe at the fly.



The ceremony today symbolizes a tribute to the ship preparing for its decommissioning, the time-honored end of a ship's life. As of decommissioning, the commissioning pennant, ensign and jack are hauled down for the last time as a dedication to the total operational success of the ship and the crew who sailed it.

# Thomas B. Fargo Vice Admiral, USN Deputy Chief of Naval Operations (Plans, Policy and Operations) (N3/N5)

Vice Admiral Thomas Boulton Fargo was born in San Diego, California, in June 1948. The son of Navy Captain and Mrs. William B. Fargo, he attended high school in Sasebo, Japan and Coronado, California and graduated from the United States Naval Academy in June 1970. VADM Fargo's most recent assignment was as Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Central Command and Commander, United States Fifth Fleet.

Trained in joint, naval and submarine commands, VADM Fargo has served in a variety of challenging shore and sea duty assignments. At sea, his assignments were in both attack and ballistic missile submarines. His Executive Officer tour was aboard USS PLUNGER (SSN 595) from 1982 to 1984 and he commanded USS SALT LAKE CITY (SSN 716) from 1987 to 1989, during which the ship received the Navy Unit Commendation and Battle 'E'. He simultaneously served as Commander, Submarine Group SEVEN; Commander, Task Force SEVEN FOUR; and Commander, Task Force ONE FIVE SEVEN in the Western Pacific, Indian Ocean, and Arabian Gulf from 1992 to 1993. Selected to Flag rank, he then served as Director for Operations (J-3), U.S. Atlantic Command from 1993 to 1995, during the Haiti and Cuban Contingency Operations. From 1995 to 1996, he was assigned as Director, Assessment Division (N81) for the Chief of Naval Operations.

Ashore, he has served as Aide and Administrative Assistant for the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Submarine Warfare (OP-02), as the Naval Aide to the Vice Chief of Naval Operations, as Executive Assistant to the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Naval Warfare (OP-07), all located in Washington, D.C., and as Executive Assistant to the Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet. VADM Fargo also served as the Head of Submarine Assignment Branch and as Executive Officer Detailer at the Naval Military Personnel Command.

VADM Fargo is a 1989 recipient of the VADM James Bond Stockdale Award for Inspirational Leadership. He is entitled to wear the Distinguished Service Medal (two awards), the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit (three awards), and various personal, service and campaign awards. Additionally, VADM Fargo has been awarded the Military Order of the Emirates, First Class and the Order of Bahrain, First Class.

VADM Fargo is married to the former Sarah Cannon of Wauchula, Florida. They have two sons, Thomas, Jr. and William Cannon.



# John B. Padgett III Rear Admiral, USN Commander, Submarine Group Two

Rear Admiral John B. Padgett III graduated from the United States Naval Academy in June 1969 and earned a master of science from the Georgia Institute of Technology in June 1970.

Following nuclear power and basic submarine training, Rear Admiral Padgett served aboard USS PUFFER (SSN 652), deploying to the Western Pacific and completing submarine qualification while serving as Main Propulsion Assistant, Communicator and Weapons Officer.

Rear Admiral Padgett served as Engineer Officer aboard USS WILL ROGERS (SSBN 659), followed by assignments as Chief Staff Officer for Commander, Submarine Squadron FIFTEEN Representative, Pearl Harbor.

Rear Admiral Padgett was then assigned as Executive Officer aboard USS FLASHER (SSN 613), deploying to the Indian Ocean and Western Pacific. He then transferred to Idaho Falls, Idaho, where he was a member of the staff of the Senior Officer Ships' Material Readiness Course.

Following prospective commanding officer training, Rear Admiral Padgett relieved as Commanding Officer, USS OMAHA (SSN 692), in December 1986. During his tour, the ship completed a regular overhaul at Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard and deployed to the Northern Pacific and Western Pacific.

In February 1989, Rear Admiral Padgett was assigned as Executive Assistant to the Assistant Chief of Naval Operations (Undersea Warfare) and then as Commander, Submarine Squadron ELEVEN. In July 1992, he served as the 75th Commandant of Midshipmen at the United States Naval Academy. Following selection to Flag rank, Rear Admiral Padgett was assigned as Director of Combat Operations Staff and Deputy Director, Operations and Logistics, United States Strategic Command. His most recent tour was with the Chief of Naval Operations as Deputy Director, Submarine Warfare Division (N87)



### David A. Duffié Captain, USN Commanding Officer, Simon Lake (AS 33)

Captain Duffié graduated from Valencia High School in Orange County, California, and reported to the United States Naval Academy in June 1971.

Following graduation and commissioning with a Bachelor of Science degree in Systems Engineering in June 1975, he received nuclear power and submarine training until January 1977.

His first assignment was USS NARWHAL (SSN 671) from January 1977 to July 1980. He served as Engineer Officer on USS HENRY CLAY (SSBN 625B) from July 1980 to July 1983. He then served as Director, Officer Department at Nuclear Power School, Orlando, Florida until July 1985. Captain Duffié served as Executive Officer and was on the precommissioning unit of USS LOUISVILLE (SSN 724) from August 1985 to November 1987. He was then assigned to the Bureau of Naval Personnel in Washington, DC where he served as the head of Submarine Assignment Branch and Executive Officer Detailer until November 1989.

Captain Duffié had command of USS HELENA (SSN 725) from August 1990 to July 1992. During his command tour the HELENA received the CINCPACFLT Silver Anchor Award, the Engineering "E", and the ASW "T". Additionally, he received the 1992 Naval Submarine League Admiral Darby award for command excellence. Following his command tour, he reported to the COMSUBPAC staff as the Prospective Commanding Officer (PCO) Instructor from July 1992 to July 1994. He attended the National War College at the National Defense University at Ft. McNair in Washington, DC where he received a Master of Science Degree in National Security Strategy from August 1994 to June 1995. He then served as Chief of Actions on the Joint Staff at the Pentagon. He assumed command of USS SIMON LAKE (AS 33) on 12 July 1997. During his command tour the ship has received the Battle Efficiency "E" for 1997 and 1998, Ney Runner-Up (1997/1998), Battenburg Cup finalist for 1997 and 1998, nominee for the SECDEF Maintenance Award, and the Navy Unit Commendation for his deployment to the Arabian Gulf. He is currently under orders as a Navy Fellow on the Council on Foreign Relations.

Captain Duffié is entitled to wear the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit (two awards), Navy Commendation Medal (five awards), Navy Achievement Medal (two awards), Navy Unit Commendation, Meritorious Unit Commendation, Battle Efficiency "E" Ribbon (four), Armed Forces Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Navy Expeditionary Medal (four awards), National Defense Ribbon (two awards), and the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (four awards).

Captain Duffié is married to the former Janet O'Donnell. They reside in Brooklyn, NY. Captain Duffié has three children; Jason (20), Jennifer (17), and Vanessa (4).



### Simon Lake Submarine Inventor (1866 - 1945)

Simon Lake, born September 4, 1866 son of John Christopher Lake, an inventor and foundry owner, attended public schools in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Toms River, New Jersey, and was graduated from the Clinton Liberal Institute at Fort Paine, New York. After a course in mechanical drawing he became a partner in his father's business.

Since his childhood, Lake's main ambition was to build submarines for the Navy. His first submarine, ARGONAUT, was built in 1894. He was not a wealthy man and had a difficult time of financing the building of his boat. Since the submarine was still considered experimental, the United States Government held trials to see if the Lake submarine or that of his rival inventor, Holland, was to be adopted. Neither was considered satisfactory at the time and Lake's much improved submarine PROTECTOR was built in 1901. PROTECTOR was the first successfully tested even-keeled submarine.

American naval authorities were slow in considering PROTECTOR and she was sold to Russia. Lake spent the next seven years in Europe where he advised on submarine construction as well as designing and building. On return to the United States he founded the Lake Torpedo Boat Company which built submarines for both the Austrian and American governments. His first submarine for the United States Navy was USS G-1 constructed at the Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Company under a subcontract from the Lake Torpedo Company. Commissioned on October 28, 1912, the G-1 set a record by submerging to a depth of 256 feet. Soon the United States Government adopted the Lake type of submarine to be built in its Navy yards under royalty to the Lake company.

There was universal recognition of the efficiency of his underseas craft and his influence on designs of the United States Navy submarine has endured over the years to reach the era of atomic and hydro dynamic design. Simon Lake's interest was not in the military uses of underwater craft but, rather, throughout his life he attempted to convince the world of the commercial and peaceful uses of the submarine. Although his boyhood dream never came true, he went on to create many significant salvage and marine inventions and served in an advisory capacity during World War II. As the inventor of the first even-keeled submarine, Simon Lake was one of the greatest factors in the development of the submarine and, before his death, on June 23, 1945, he had seen many of his early visions become reality.




### A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

USS SIMON LAKE's (AS 33) keel was laid on January 7, 1963 by the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton, Washington and was commissioned November 7, 1964. With CAPT James B. Osborn in command SIMON LAKE sailed for Pearl Harbor, Hawaii for a shakedown cruise returning to Bremerton for a six-week yard availability period. Upon completion of the availability SIMON LAKE departed for Charleston, South Carolina where she tended submarines until July 11, 1966. She then sailed to Holy Loch, Scotland, where she relieved USS HUNLEY (AS 31). SIMON LAKE served in Holy Loch for nearly four years, departing for Bremerton in May, 1970. That July SIMON LAKE completed her first overhaul which lasted until March 1971.

SIMON LAKE returned to Charleston April 9, 1971 and served there until she relieved USS HOLLAND (AS 32) in Rota, Spain in December 1972. On January 8, 1977 SIMON LAKE got underway for Charleston to undergo a complex overhaul. Following her overhaul she relieved the USS HUNLEY (AS 31) as the resident tender of Charleston. On July 7, 1979 SIMON LAKE relocated to King's Bay, Georgia where she became the first tender at the newly established refit site. Her outstanding repair work resulted in her receiving the 1982, 1984 and 1985 Battle Efficiency awards. In August, 1985 she conducted a homeport change to Pascagoula, Mississippi to conduct an overhaul. She returned to Charleston in October 1986 where she completed routine upkeep's until May 1987. She then relieved the USS HUNLEY (AS 31) in Holy Loch, Scotland and received the 1988 and 1991 Battle Efficiency award and was awarded the Meritorious Unit Commendation in 1992. While homported in Holy Loch, USS SIMON LAKE steamed an average of 350 days a year.



In March 1992, SIMON LAKE returned to Norfolk to conduct an extensive overhaul. After completion of the overhaul in March 1993 she departed for her new homeport, La Maddalena, Italy where she turned over with the USS ORION (AS 18) and has served since. For superior service to the fleet, she received both the Battle Efficiency and Meritorious Unit Commendation awards in 1994. In March 1998 SIMON LAKE transited the Suez Canal enroute to the United Arab Emirates where she supported OPERATION SOUTHERN WATCH in the Arabian Gulf. Her outstanding performance during 47 availabilities led to her receiving the Navy Unit Commendation medal and Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. In June 1998 she returned to her homport in La Maddalena, Italy. SIMON LAKE's performance during her last two years of service were particularly noteworthy. Not only did she receive the awards associated with the Arabian Gulf but she was nominated for the SECDEF maintenance award, received the 1997 and 1998 Battle Efficiency awards, the 1998 CNO Safety Award, the 1998 Golden anchor award and she became the first surface ship to receive both the Enlisted Surface Warfare pennant and Officer Surface Warfare pennants.

During her 36 years of dedicated service, SIMON LAKE provided all aspects of logistical and repair support for an average of 45 submarine and surface ship availabilities consisting of over 5000 vital repair jobs annually.
