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Grays Harbor District Report

Arrivals YTD December 31, 2017 were 109 for a total of 258 jobs. In December we had 10 arrivals for 26 jobs. Captain D'Angelo was on duty in December and Capt. White is on duty in January. We anticipate 6 arrivals in January to start the year. We finished the year better than forecast due primarily to better than expected agricultural shipments and additional roro traffic.

Activity Report

Continue to work on a helo service agreement with Brim Aviation for incidental trips. We have received a proposed MOU from BRIM, which we are currently reviewing. Also we have been working with Pilot boat operator, Knutson Towboat, to address pilot boat operation issues raised by pilots.

Vessel Traffic Risk Assessment (VTRA)

The VTRA workshop is scheduled for January 25, 2018.

U.S. Coast Guard Annual Facility Inspection

Continue to have issues with vandalism on one of the Nav aids first reported by Capt. White in early November. Working with local law enforcement to try and catch the vandals.

Business Development

Renewable Energy Group (REG) formally withdrew crude oil storage from their shoreline permit application with the City of Hoquiam. They had previously announced this intention and have been working on new renewable energy projects at their site at the Port. So, while the formal withdrawal was met with much fanfare by the media, QIN and other stakeholders, this is not new news and is consistent with prior reports.

Contanda asked City of Hoquiam to be co-leads with DOE for a new proposal for refined fuels and chemical storage on their lease at the Port of Grays Harbor. They have not formally withdrawn crude oil handling from the shoreline application but the current list of commodities does not include crude oil.

In addition to a lease on the former Rayonier pulp mill site we are working with WSDOT for a lease on surplus property adjacent to PGH Terminal 4 for short term auto storage. This will allow us to make better use of the Terminal for surges in auto or OHOW shipments.

International Trade

Marine Terminal 4 handles new cargoes, thousands of autos in 2017



Local contractor Rognlin's, Inc. used four cranes to lift a record heavy piece of over-high, over-wide equipment at Terminal 4 last month.

Increased auto imports, capable handling of oversized project cargoes and efficient management of space resulted in increased jobs and opportunity at the Port of Grays Harbor's Terminal 4.

Terminal 4 has been abuzz with activity this past month with thousands of autos being processed as well as unique pieces of over-high, over-wide equipment being handled.

Last month, six roll-on/roll-off (ro-ro) vessels called Terminal 4, discharging imports and loading export autos as well as hundreds of pieces of over-high, over-wide equipment bound for various Pacific

Rim Countries, including the heaviest piece the Port has ever handled which required four cranes from local contractor, Rognlin's, Inc. to load, as well as several unique components for an aquarium being built in China.

"While it's exciting to see all of the activity at the terminal, it's even more exciting to see all of jobs the activity supports in action," explained Deputy Executive Director Leonard Barnes. "From longshoremen and local contractors, to teamsters and truck drivers, hundreds of jobs are generated by the cargoes coming and going at Terminal 4."
