We have rural agriculture farms, pumpkin farms, beautiful rivers and lakes, bike trails, urban shops, Rustic roads, historical Frank Lloyd Wright buildings, views of the Lighthouse and beaches on Lake Michigan, quilt stores, downtown shops, local historical museums, UGRR sights and an active art & music scene! *We are asking businesses and local citizens to participate in this event by creating an event, putting quilts in storefront windows, on porches, fences and clotheslines throughout our whole county or offer a “coffee special/lunch special” at a local restaurant.*
