
Gloria's daughter Tina has graciously provided the ladies with nail polish which they are thoroughly enjoying – thank you!

10-7 – On this day in 1986 President Ronald Reagan signed a bill making the rose the national flower of the U.S.




10-8 – Proverb for the day – Nothing improves the taste of pasta more than a good appetite – Italian Proverb.


10-16 – Warm October, cold February.
