Robert and I spent the winter in Bullhead City, Arizona. Oh, the joy of being retired and able to relocate to a no snow zone for three months. Well, almost a no snow zone. Several years ago, we arrived in Bullhead the day before New Year's Eve and awoke the next morning to find it was snowing! It hadn't snowed in Bullhead for years, as this is a desert area south of Las Vegas. The citizens were overjoyed as some of the kids had never seen the white stuff. We snowbirds, as winter visitors to Bullhead are called, were astounded also. We were looking forward to sunshine and warm temps and found our cars covered in snow. Mother Nature showed us who was boss lady that year.

While in Bullhead, we play bingo at four nearby casinos...Avi, Lodge, Tropicana, and Riverside. They are a short drive across the nearby bridge to Laughlin, Nevada. The lovely ladies at the Tropicana know us now and aggravate the heck out of my husband. Imagine that; not that he doesn't deserve everything they dish out. On Tuesday and Wednesday at the Trop, besides the regular lucky



ball, the games include a lava ball. A bingo on the lava ball is worth a thousand dollars. We keep trying. We also keep an eye on the lucky cash balls at the Station casinos in Vegas, about an hour and a half away. The drive to get there winds through mountains and desert scenery, plus, we always stop at Railroad Pass Casino. The Pass is an older smaller casino, but we like the atmosphere and their inexpensive food that includes luscious strawberry shortcake.

The various Station casino lucky balls are often at ten thousand dollars and higher. The first game played at each is a video linked Jumbo Coverall. If anyone hits the jumbo jackpot, then the rest of the games that session pay a thousand dollars each. To win you must bingo at 48 numbers or less, but that number increases each week to a max of 53 numbers with a hundred thousand dollars or more for the overall payout. One sunny morning Robert and I decided to try our luck at Green

Valley Ranch as the cash ball there was \$110,000 plus. That's right...\$110,000 plus. I knew it would be crowded and wanted to get there super early. Robert thought it would be sufficient if we got there an hour beforehand. Well, we did that and arrived to find the line of players out the door with the entire bingo lobby area packed. We had no hope of getting inside, so we left and drove to Sunset Station nearby. The cash ball there was a mere eleven thousand and there were plenty of seats. Good thing we switched casinos because woo, woo. We hit the cash ball! No, we didn't. April Fool! We didn't win a darn thing because it was another lucky player's turn to yell bingo on the cash ball. Oh well. Hope springs eternal and we will patiently wait until it's our turn to hit it big. April Fool again! Patience is not something we practice. May Lady Luck blow you kisses as you dance out the door with dollars. Win big.

Bingo News

Big Potawatomi Payout

Imagine winning \$1 million playing Bingo. A man from Mukwonago, Wisconsin, did exactly that at Potawatomi Hotel & Casino in Milwaukee earlier this year. The lucky winner, who would only give his name as David H., nabbed the million-dollar prize by spinning the casino's All-Star Bingo Wheel after winning at Bingo. David H. was already guaranteed \$100,000 even before he spun the wheel, which he qualified for after winning Bingo in 48 numbers or less by finishing on the 48th number called.

Bingo Players Lend Support

Poker and Bingo players at Pechanga Resort & Casino in Temecula, California, were invited to help the less fortunate and receive some great perks in the process. Players teamed up with Ante Up Magazine and Blue Shark Optics for the annual Restock the Shelves program that helps replenish local food bank supplies following the holiday season. Pechanga poker players received 500 bonus tournament chips for daily tournaments if they brought in two canned goods, or 1,000 bonus chips for three or more canned goods. Pechanga Bingo players received a free early bird game pack with a session buy-in when they brought in two cans of non-perishable foods. By the end of the event, players had donated more than 4,000 pounds of food.

Fight at Bingo Hall

A fight broke out during Bingo at a Canadian nursing home after two female residents got into an argument over a seat and refused to back down. Authorities said the two women, ages 79 and 86, are residents at a long-term care facility at Rideau Lakes, Ontario, located roughly 45 minutes from the U.S. border. The women wanted to sit in the same seat during Bingo and neither would compromise. A “physical altercation” reportedly broke out, prompting other residents to get involved. Eventually, police were called. No one was seriously injured or charged, according to reports.

Litterbox Bingo Helps Stray Cats

The first annual Litterbox Bingo, hosted by Family Bowlaway Fun Center in Butler, Pennsylvania, raised more than \$4,000 for two cat rescue organizations. The sold-out event drew 149 pre-registered players, plus walk-ins, who came to support Homeless Cats of Butler, a group that traps, spays and neuters stray, feral and colony cats in the community; and Stray Solutions Animal Rescue, which helps find foster homes for rescued cats. In addition to 13 games of Bingo and many door prizes, more than 85 gift baskets were raffled off during the event. Cat litter, cat food, other cat supplies and cash were also donated by participants.



Fake Blood Pressure Readings

A Department of Veterans Affairs outpatient clinic in Virginia has been recording fake, incorrect blood pressure readings of veterans who came in for care. A 139/89 reading was routinely entered during blood pressure rechecks. Why that number? Because a higher number would have triggered follow-up care.

Once again, it was the VA’s Office of the Inspector General that caught the pattern. Eight weeks later, the OIG discovered that nothing had been done to correct the problem. They stepped in again and wrote five recommendations for improved care, and more than 800 veterans have been notified to return for blood pressure screenings.

It’s not the first time this has happened. Last fall it was a VA clinic in Kentucky, and the blood pressure reading was 128/78. In that case the OIG discovered that by entering that particular reading, it would turn off the automatic note to physicians about whether or not the patient needed lab work, referrals or medication. It was a ploy to save work on the part of the medical staff. The OIG discovered, by calling veterans, that often no blood pressure reading had even been taken. What made it worse was that the fake readings triggered staff performance bonuses.

We need to step up and manage our health care. Take a pad and pen with you to appointments and take notes: your weight, any medications you’re to take, the results of any lab work ... and your blood pressure reading. Keep these notes in a file. Compare them to previous appointment notes. If you see a pattern -- in this case, if your blood pressure is the same from visit to visit -- ask questions. Get a message to your doctor and let him know.

High blood pressure can lead to heart attack, stroke, kidney disease and more. Take care of yourself.

places where I worked, at church, at the store. They were there because these operations were always interested in improving and were open to ideas from people “outside” daily functions.
I couldn’t tell you the last time I saw a suggestion box. And if you think about it, that’s pretty strange. When did businesses and organizations stop being interested in input that could make their operations better? Is it like the Bingo worker said? People in charge hate suggestions?
I say: Bring back the Suggestion Box! We should start a campaign! — **Roger J., Indiana, via email**
Hi Roger,
Wow, I don’t think I’ve seen a suggestion box in 20 years. And I think I know why.
I worked in an office many years ago where my boss made a big deal during a staff meeting about putting in a suggestion box. The box was to be used by people who had ideas or observations they would like to share, while remaining anonymous. The goal was to improve systems and create another open line between staff and management.
Long story short, it was a bomb. From the start, people used the box to lodge complaints, snitch on coworkers, criticize management, offer “humorous” suggestions, and complain about the food in the cafeteria.
At several weekly staff meetings that followed, the boss explained as gently as possible that the suggestion box was not created for

complaints, but for constructive input on business operations. After that, people reworked their complaints to read as constructive suggestions, like “It would boost productivity and company morale if the cafeteria didn’t serve such crappy food.”
After that, little else was said about the suggestion box. Over the next few months it was moved to places of less and less prominence, until finally it disappeared—which I’m sure was at someone’s anonymous suggestion.
Keep in mind, though, that while the physical suggestion box may have faded into history, it still is very much alive in the virtual world of email and toll free 800 numbers.
Email can be sent with much the same anonymity as the suggestion box once promised; all you need is the recipient’s address.
My suggestion is to poke around a little until you find an email address for the Bingo hall you attend and fire off a brief but constructive message with your observations. With luck, the right person will get it. And with a little more luck, maybe they’ll make the improvements you suggest.

How to Slow Down Cognitive Aging

Dear Savvy Senior
Are there any proven strategies to preventing cognitive decline? I have a family history of dementia and worry about my own memory and cognitive function as I grow older. — **Almost 60**
Dear Almost,
For most people, starting in their fifties and sixties, the brain’s ability to remember names, multi-task or learn something new starts declining. While our genes (which we can’t control) play a key role in determining our cognitive aging, our general health (which we do have some control over) plays a big factor too.
Here are some healthy lifestyle strategies – recommended by medical experts – that you can employ that can help stave off cognitive loss and maybe even build a stronger brain.
Manage health problems: Studies have shown that cognitive problems are

related to health conditions, like diabetes, heart disease and even depression. So, if you have high blood pressure, high cholesterol or diabetes you need to treat them with lifestyle changes and medication (if necessary) and get them under control. And if you have a history of depression, you need to talk to your doctor about treatment options.
Exercise: Aerobic exercise increases blood flow to all parts of your body, including your brain, to keep the brain cells well nourished. So, choose an aerobic activity you enjoy like walking, cycling, dancing, swimming, etc., that elevates your heart rate and do it for at least 30 to 40 minutes three times a week.
Eat healthy: A heart-healthy diet, like the Mediterranean diet, will also help protect the brain. A Mediterranean diet includes relatively little red meat and emphasizes whole grains, fruits and vegetables, fish and shellfish, and nuts, olive oil and other healthy fats. Also keep processed foods and sweets to a minimum.
Get some sleep: Quality, restful sleep contributes to brain health too. Typically, adults should get between seven and nine hours of sleep daily. If you have persistent problems sleeping, you need to identify and address the problem. Medications, late-night exercise and alcohol can interfere with sleep quality and length, as can arthritis pain, sleep apnea and restless leg syndrome.

Scouting the Blackjack Tables

I'm amazed at how many players I see enter a casino and plop themselves down at the first empty seat at any blackjack table. What they should be doing instead is scouting the blackjack tables. The reason is the blackjack playing rules, the number of decks of cards, the payoffs for a blackjack, the table limits, and even how the dealer shuffles the cards, are not always the same from one table to the next. What follows are some tips on what you should be looking for when you scout the tables so that you can play the best blackjack game available in whichever casino you visit.

6-5 payoff for blackjack

Always make sure that the table pays 3-2 for a blackjack,

not 6-5 (or worse, even money). In some casinos, the cloth layout will specify if blackjack pays 3-2 or 6-5 or there may be signage on the table that specifies what the payoff is. Here is something to keep in mind: You do NOT want to play any blackjack game, even a single-deck game, if a blackjack pays 6-5. (Reason: The house edge increases by 1.4% when the casino pays 6-5 instead of 3-2. This is a rip-off and you should avoid playing all 6-5 games.) If you are not sure what the payoff is for a blackjack, ask the dealer before you sit down and play.

Dealer Hit or Stand on Soft 17

Most players know that the dealer must hit their hand if it totals 16 or lower and stand if it totals 17 through 21. However, on some tables, the rules may specify that the dealer must hit soft 17, and on other tables, stand on soft 17. You are better off (by roughly 0.2%) playing on a table where the dealer stands on soft 17 (rather than hit). Check the layout or table signage for the soft 17 rule and if you have a choice, play on a table where the dealer stands on soft 17. (Again, if you are not sure if the rule is stand or hit soft 17, ask the dealer.)

Continuous Shuffling Machine

In the old days, the dealer hand shuffled the cards, or automatic shufflers would shuffle multiple decks of cards after the dealer dealt roughly 70% of them. Nowadays many casinos have reverted to Continuous Shuffling Machines (CSM).

The CSM is a combination auto shuffler and dealing device. After every round (or sometimes two), the dealer will place the discards back into the CSM where they will be automatically shuffled with the unplayed cards in the CSM (usually a CSM holds four to six decks of cards). You can tell if a table is using a CSM by watching what the dealer does with the discards after each round. If she isn't stacking them in the discard tray, she probably is placing them into the CSM. And that's not good for players. Why? Because when a casino uses a CSM, there is never a pause in the action and, therefore, the casino can deal roughly 20% more hands per hour. That increases the number of hands that a player's bankroll is exposed to the house edge. It is better to avoid all CSMs and instead play on tables where the dealer manually shuffles the cards, or uses a traditional auto shuffler that shuffles all the cards.

Betting Limits

If you are a low roller, you shouldn't be betting \$25 a hand. Every table has a sign that specifies what the table minimum and maximum betting limits are. Therefore, check out the tables to find betting limits you feel comfortable playing. If all the low-limit tables are crowded, it is best to wait until a seat opens rather than take a seat at a \$25 minimum table.

Number of Decks

In general, the fewer the number of decks of cards, the

better the game is for players. However, you have to check all the rules. For example, a single-deck game that pays 6-5 for a blackjack is a terrible game, whereas if it paid 3-2 for a blackjack, it's a very good game. Player-favorable rules include being allowed to double-down after pair splitting, being allowed to double down on any two cards, being allowed to re-split pairs, being allowed to surrender your hand, and, of course, the dealer standing, rather than hitting, soft 17.

Be a smart player and scout the tables before you sit down and play.

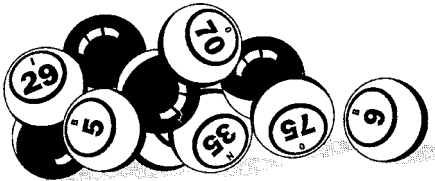

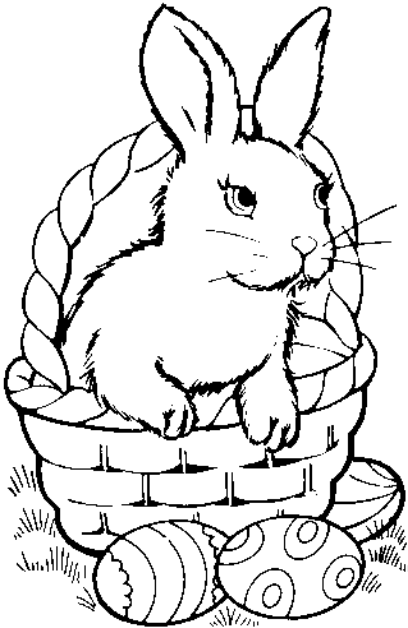

Poker Talk



Be Smart in Your Evaluation of Starting Hands

Starting-hand selection is a critical but frequently overlooked aspect of Texas hold ‘em, especially for novice players.

My recommendation for entry-level players (and for all players, really) is to play hands that are likely to be stronger than your opponents’ hands. That may sound overly simplistic, but the basic logic behind this sensible approach is that you will make the best hand more often than your opponent.

In the early levels of no-limit hold ‘em tournaments, you can do well by playing a fairly tight, aggressive style of poker. That said, you should not play too tightly, because that will result in you blinding out and getting no action from opponents due to your snug image.

Assuming you have a fairly deep chip stack, you should play only premium hands — pocket pairs 6-6 or better, and A-Q or better - from early position. As you get closer to the button, you can add more starting hands such as 2-2, Q-J, A-3 suited, 9-8 suited and so on.

The reason you should loosen up your starting-hand

requirements as you get closer to the button is that you are more likely to have position throughout the hand. To sum up position in one sentence: Position lets you control the size of the pot, allowing you to play smaller pots with marginal hands and larger pots with strong hands.

As the blinds get higher and your chip stack starts shrinking in terms of the number of big blinds you have in it, you will have to increase your level of aggression a bit, perhaps raising a very wide range of hands from late position.

If I have around 30 big blinds and the action is folded to me, I will raise the button with any pocket pair, an ace with any other card, K-5 or better, J-8 or better, and almost any two suited cards.

You have to make sure you are always paying attention to your opponents’ stack sizes as well. If your opponents have shallow stacks of 18 big blinds or fewer, you actually have to tighten up a bit because they will be more inclined to go all in over the top of your initial raise. At that point, you have to play hands that have good showdown value, which cuts out hands such Q-8 and 4-3 suited, as those hands tend to lose once all five cards are on board.

In games with smaller stakes, if you’re prudent about hand selection, you should expect to play fewer hands than your loose, splashy opponents. While playing a reasonable range of cards might make you feel as if you’re not part of the action, you will win a much larger portion of the hands you play compared with everyone else. You can also expect to have great results in the long run while most of your opponents are losing.

What’s New in Nevada

ROCK GROUP IN RESIDENCE
Although the gig is only scheduled to last for nine shows, Steely Dan is slated to be in what is being called a “mini-residency” at the Venetian Theater in Las Vegas. Even though the group’s co-founder, Walter Becker, died several years ago, the group is still going strong. Tickets for the April-May performances range from \$142 to \$321. The dates are from April 25th through May 11th.

NOT SO SUPER BOWL
The recent Super Bowl may have been a TV ratings and on-the-field disaster. So are the numbers coming from gaming regulators. According to the bean counters, gamblers in Nevada bet a lot less on this year’s game. When all the numbers are in, the totals will likely show that about \$13-million LESS was bet this time around than last year. Nevada has over

200 sportsbook locations. It should be pointed out, though, that this was the first Super Bowl on which fans in other states could legally place bets.

SKYWALK AT THE ‘STRAT’
There are published reports that the soaring Stratosphere in Las Vegas has filed for a permit to build a new attraction atop the 1,149-foot tall hotel/casino. The new attraction will be a skywalk, similar to the one built by the Hualapai Tribe at the Grand Canyon. The permit seems to indicate that the skywalk will afford incredible-but-scary views of Las Vegas through a glass floor that will hang out from the tower. By the way, the Stratosphere has changed its name to simply The Strat.

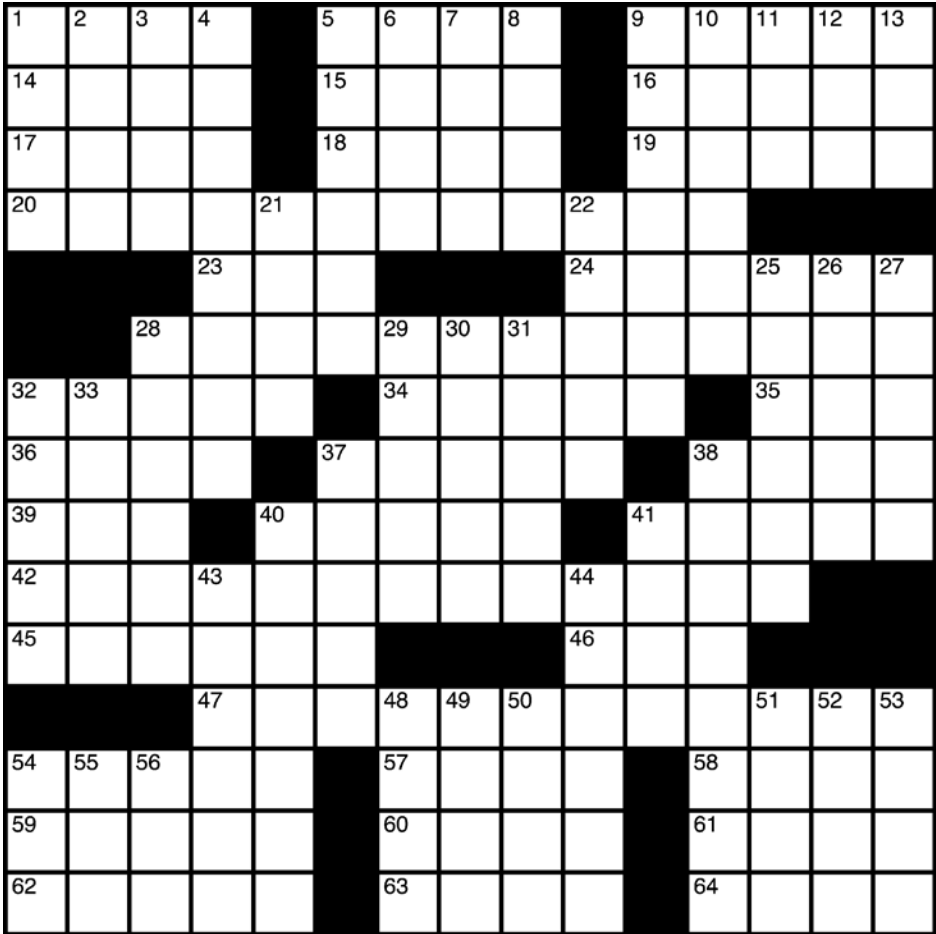

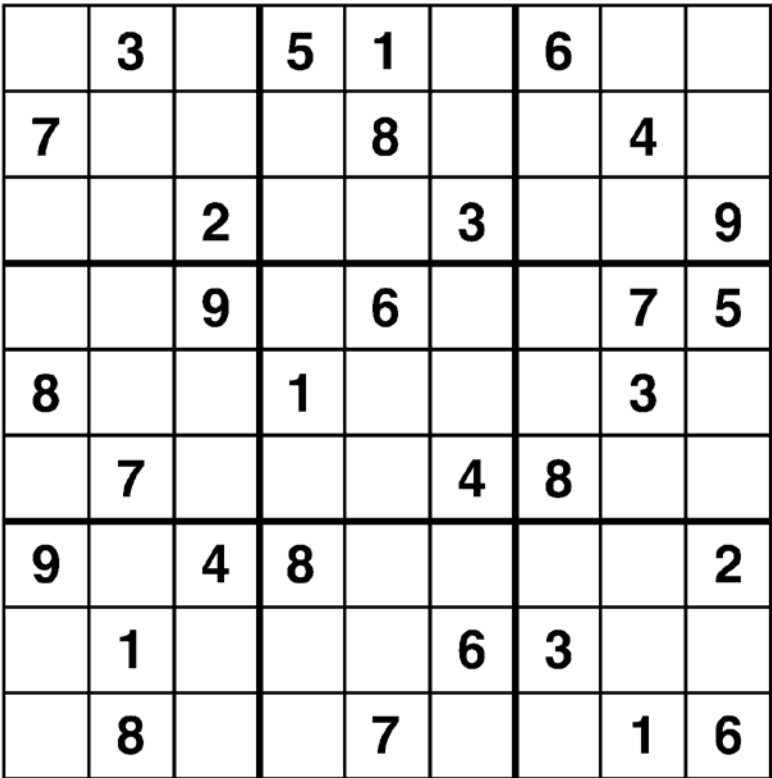

Game Day Salad

Dear Ask Annie,
I am entertaining the ladies I play mahjong and cards with at lunchtime. They love salads. Can you suggest a salad that would impress them? — **Kathy K from Jacksonville, Ga.**

Dear Kathy,
One of my most favorite salads is the Tarpon Springs Greek Salad with a scoop of potato salad. I have lived in Florida for 45 years. The original restaurant that created this recipe no longer exists, but the salad is still available in many restaurants in the Tarpon Springs area. This recipe serves six. Double or triple it, as necessary. Serve with a fresh loaf of Italian bread. Add a sweet dessert and I am sure you will impress the ladies. I would suggest making the potato salad a day ahead of time. The potato salad is served cold, not warm. Make the salad dressing a day before too. — **Annie**

TARPON SPRINGS GREEK SALAD WITH POTATO SALAD

Potato Salad:
1.5 # bag white potatoes (any variety), halved
2 eggs, hard boiled, halved and sliced
4 scallions, sliced
½ cup low-fat Greek yogurt
1 teaspoon mustard
1 tablespoon white vinegar
2 tablespoons low-fat mayo
½ teaspoon salt/freshly ground pepper

Greek Salad Dressing:
¼ cup olive oil
¼ cup red wine vinegar
1 teaspoon dried oregano
1 teaspoon dried basil
½ teaspoon garlic powder
¼ salt/pepper

Greek Salad:
2 heads of romaine hearts, torn into small pieces
½ cup thinly sliced cucumber
½ cup halved cherry tomatoes
¼ cup black Greek (Kalamata) olives
12 pepperoncini peppers
¼ cup very thinly sliced red onion
½ cup crumbled feta cheese

Make the potato salad. Place the potatoes in a large stock pan and cover with water by 1 inch. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and cook until potatoes are just tender. Remove and rinse with cold water to stop the cooking. Halve the cooled potatoes and place in a large bowl along with scallions and chopped hard boiled eggs. Whisk together the Greek yogurt, mustard, vinegar, salt/pepper and mayo. Season to taste, then toss with the potatoes. Spread potato salad in a large salad-serving dish and set aside.

Whisk together the ingredients for the Greek dressing. Season to taste, adding more salt/pepper if needed and set aside.

Toss together the romaine lettuce, cucumber, tomatoes, olives and peppers. Add 3 tablespoons of the dressing and toss well; stir in the feta cheese. Then add the salad over the potato salad. Drizzle with remaining salad dressing (you may not need all of it) and serve immediately. Serve by scooping all the way to the potato salad at the bottom with the salad on top.
