




We Have a New Name! Effective September 1, the former Offices of Faith Development and Youth Faith Development will be referred to as the Office for Evangelization and Catechesis. This change better reflects the movement of the universal church toward acknowledging that catechesis and evangelization go hand in hand as we accompany adults, youth, and children on their journeys of faith. It will also put us in sync with the National Office for Evangelization and Catechesis at the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops. What will not change, however, is the work which Trevor and Ellen do – Trevor will continue to support youth ministry and Ellen will continue to support children and adult catechesis for the English sector of the archdiocese.

Tending the Soil, Tending the Sower, 2021

This year's catechists formation will take place on September 18th at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church, Riverview beginning at 8:30 a.m. and finishing by 2:00 pm. This year's presenters will be Trevor Droesbeck (*Faithful Voices: Conversations with Canadian Young People*), Claudette Derdaele (*Listening, Attending, Preparing, and Hearing*), and Margot McAloon-Parker from the Diocese of Saint John (*Accompanying Families: Wisdom from the New Directory for Catechesis*). While of particular interest to catechists working with children, the day is open to all those who work in the ministry of catechesis, i.e. marriage preparation, RCIA, baptismal preparation. Pre-registration is necessary and may be done through the diocesan website: www.diomoncton.ca → Pastoral Offices → Children's Catechesis → Formation Opportunities. 2021-2022 Faith Development Registration

Registrations for the biweekly sessions of faith development for St. Augustine's and St. Lawrence O'Toole will be taking place on Sunday, Sept. 12th from 12:15 – 1:15 pm in the church basement of St. Augustine's. Our faith development program is available for children entering grade 1 thru grade 6 in school this September.

Please use the door at the top of the stairs in the parking lot, proceeding downstairs to the basement. In keeping with our Covid-19 protocols, we ask that you maintain proper social distancing while gathered in the basement. We also ask that only one

parent/adult be present for the registration so to minimize the number of people enabling us to maintain the proper social distancing during the registration.

Online registration forms are also available by visiting our website at www.qasmoncton.com opening the tab for Faith Development and use the form for faith development. You can submit the form online or print the form (using the word or pdf document) and drop it off at our office or place it in the collection basket at mass. Please be advised that, in accordance with our diocesan policy, there is a fee of \$30 per child or \$50 per family (2 children or more) to be paid at the time of registration. We can only accept cash or cheques made payable to St. Augustine's. No debit, credit or etransfer available. For those registering online, payment will be accepted at our first session. Please note that, at this time, registration will only be taken for our biweekly faith development program.

SAINT AUGUSTINE'S: The geothermal heating and cooling deal was signed on August 11th and work started this week. This project is expected to take four to five months.

Therefore, we take this opportunity to remind parishioners we started a fundraising campaign three months ago to ensure we have a safe, comfortable and energy-efficient building to pursue our mission for many more years. In addition to the geothermal project, the other key capital expenditures are: Energy-efficient lighting, replacing the front steps, paving the parking lot, and refinishing the pews and exterior doors. Your Campaign Fundraising Team

set a goal of \$400,000; with \$45,600 raised to date, we have \$354,400 to raise.

Our goals include getting more parishioners on pre-authorized debit (PAD) and to increase their weekly contribution by 20% and/or to give one-time donations. Campaign envelopes are at the back of the church.

We thank those who have already contributed.

The Province of New Brunswick is now in the Green level.

Restrictions in our churches are as follows.



You are no longer required to call and register for Mass. You may enter and seat yourself. Masks are no longer mandatory but we respect those who choose to wear them for health or safety reasons. Physical distancing is not required, thus, the church can be filled. Singing may resumed as before Covid-19 without restriction. Parish gatherings and catechetical groups may now be held without restriction as to number and distance.

The following restrictions are to be maintained: Holy Communion: For the time being, as a matter of prudence, we will refrain from distributing communion in the cup or receiving on the tongue. The sign of peace will be exchanged by bowing or making other gestures without contact.

We will have to continue to be careful as Covid-19 is always with us. We are encouraged to practice health measures such as handwashing, coughing in your elbow, or staying home when sick and wearing a mask if you so choose. The virus is still with us and we should all expect to see cases as normal travel returns.

Good, evil come from the human heart, not the outside world, Pope Francis says

The line that separates good from evil is found in the human heart, not just in diligently following religious rituals and laws, Pope Francis said.

The outside world is not what "makes us saints or not saints, rather it is the heart that expresses our intentions, our choices and the desire to do everything for God's love," he said before praying the Angelus Aug. 30 with people gathered in St. Peter's Square.

The pope reflected on the day's reading from Deuteronomy (4:1-8) in which Moses urged people to observe the Lord's commandments without adding to or subtracting anything from them and from the Gospel according to Mark (7:1-23) in which Jesus criticized hypocrites who honor God "with their lips" but not with their hearts.

"You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition," Jesus said, adding that it is not the outside world that defiles people, but "the things that come out from within are what defile," including evil thoughts, theft, murder, adultery, greed, envy and arrogance.

Pope Francis said, "The boundary between good and evil does not lie outside of us, but rather inside of us." Jesus teaches that religious rituals of purifying the body and objects do nothing without the conversion and purification of the heart, the pope said.

"Without a purified heart," he said, "one can never have hands that are truly clean and lips that speak sincere words of love," mercy and forgiveness.



A heart that is hardened or closed to God leads to a "double life" and hypocrisy, he said. Going through the motions in "the external observance of the law" is not enough to be a good Christian, he said.

"The literal observance of precepts is something sterile if the heart does not change and if it is not translated into concrete acts: opening oneself up to God and his Word in prayer; seeking justice and peace; coming to the aid of the poor and the oppressed."

Think of the scandal and harm done to the church by those who call themselves "very Catholic and go to church often, but then, in their daily life, they neglect their family, speak ill of others and so on. This is what Jesus condemns because this is a counter-witness" to Christianity, he said.

The pope asked that everyone pray to receive "a pure heart, free from every hypocrisy" so that every Christian can "live according to the spirit of the law and achieve its end, which is love."



WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

In 2015, Pope Francis declared September 1st as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. Coinciding with a celebration instituted by the Orthodox Church, it is also a day of ecumenical prayer and unity.

FINANCIAL UPDATE - OUR LADY OF MERCY CHURCH

Fr. Angus and your parish council congratulate and convey our sincerest thanks for your generosity which has led to a stable financial position for our "great" little parish. Financial statements as of May 2021.

BALANCE SHEET = Your Parish has in excess of \$99,000.00 in our Bank Account. PROFIT & LOSS STATEMENT: May 2021, Gross Revenue was \$5590.00 and the total monthly expenditures were \$3454.17 giving us May SURPLUS of \$2132.83. At the same time last year, we had a deficit in May of \$1107.43. Our most favourable statement is our position from January 1st to May, 31st, 2021. During this 5-month period our Revenues exceeded Expenses by the sum of \$13,315.40. In the initial year of the Pandemic, 2020 by the end of May, our Parish was in a Deficit position of \$4551.98.

Personally, I want to thank Fr. Angus who has been most fair and reasonable when I inquire of him for authority to make unanticipated expenditures and to ALL of my colleagues on Parish Council who are equally dedicated as I to insure fiscal stability for our Parish. "Mike" Sullivan, Chair, PC




