

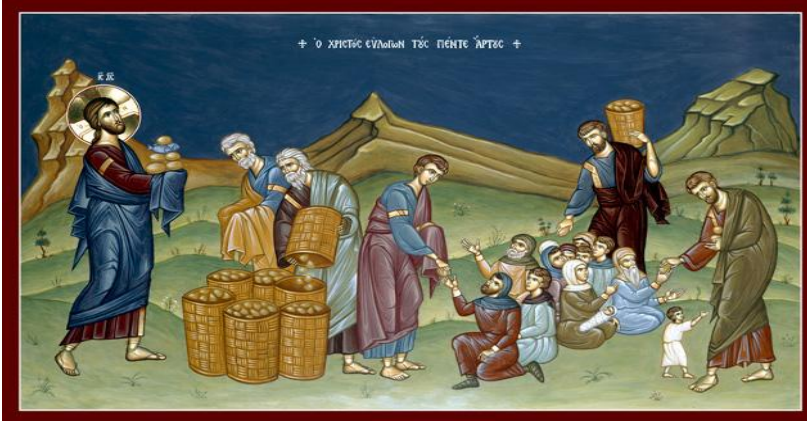

**Corpus Christi Sunday Year C Luke 9:11-17**



“Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, “Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here.” He said to them, “Give them some food yourselves.” They replied, “Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people.” Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, “Have them sit down in groups of about fifty.” They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.”

## Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

Corpus Christi Sunday Year C Luke 9:11-17

***“Give them some food yourselves”*** (Luke 9:13) Jesus challenges the disciples, inviting them to solve a problem that they have brought to Him. They first tell Him the crowd is hungry after the day-long conference with Jesus and that the crowd needs to be dispersed to go eat somewhere. Yet, Jesus basically tells the disciples, “YOU can do something about that!” Have you ever been on a committee and after suggesting an urgent action-item, the chairperson turned to you and said, “Yes, we should do that and ***you are the exact person to lead it!***” I like how Jesus, as the perfect teacher, uses this situation as a learning experience for His disciples. Or, like a good coach, Jesus will walk His disciples through this dilemma, leading them step by step to its resolution. His first step is to show them that they have more potential (options) than they realize. So, he asks, “Bring me what you have-apply yourself.” They didn’t think they could do a thing initially, which is seen in the beginning by their defeatist desire to simply just dismiss everyone. Yet, Jesus says, “Wait, let’s take stock of what you can do first.” They reply that they only have “Five loaves and two fish” (Luke 9:13). But, ***it is something to start with.*** So Jesus takes the next step which is to break the problem down into smaller parts, “Have the people sit down in groups of fifty” (Luke 9:14). We have all faced problems that initially seemed overwhelmingly huge and so we wilted just facing its size. Until, we started to break it down into more ‘doable’ tasks. What do they say about the ‘Hardest step of the longest journey is the first one’? I may not be able to run a 26 mile marathon today, but I can first run 4 miles, then next week 5 miles, then 6, until finally the full 26 miles is achieved. So, Jesus calls His disciples to break down the unmanageable huge problem into its parts and start plugging away at them, one by one. Jesus tells them to put the people into smaller, friendlier, ‘easier to feed units’ of fifty people. And of course, Jesus’ next step reveals, as with any problem, that the real secret sauce to its solution is ‘taking it to Jesus’, being willing to let Him solve it with what we have to offer Him (trusting-having faith in His action to supply the rest). Jesus solves all things for us (but uses what we provide so as to include us in its solution). And Jesus’ last step is to be conserving and look forward, as He tells them to gather up the leftover fragments (Luke 9:17). There are more meals ahead, of course, and so Jesus may be gently reprimanding them that they will now have more to start with next time (*learn from every experience*), or can even stretch this miracle out into the next morning’s meal at least. Or His command to not let any scraps go to waste, may be Jesus teaching them to always keep an eye toward recycling resources like the Boy Scout motto says, “Be Prepared.”

But as always, Again, Jesus teaches through words and through actions. It wasn’t just in His earlier classroom instruction time that Jesus taught the crowds (Luke 9:11 ‘He spoke to them of the Kingdom of God’). No, afterward, Jesus gives an additional ‘hands-on’ demonstration lesson of the Kingdom by providing such a luxuriant picnic banquet on the hillside in which the disciples ‘co-op’ (co-operate) with him. Ever the good teacher, Jesus offers an internship of His teaching as work on the job experience, “The kingdom of God looks like this, and operates like this.” I don’t know if Jesus’ disciples took actual notes with a stylus pen or not, but for sure the disciples retain the experience of having faced a challenge and overcoming it with Jesus guiding them by their side. With Jesus, we can overcome mighty challenges too, if 1) we assess what we do have, 2) take & offer what we have to Him and 3) follow through by acting in faith on His commands.

But there is one final lesson here with this miraculous feeding story: Jesus abundantly gives to us, ***for a purpose***. That purpose is for the multiplication and advancing of His gift to others too. Jesus in Matthew 10:8 tells us, “Without cost you have received; ***without cost you are to give.***” And in Luke 6:30 He says, “Give to everyone who asks of you” followed by the words, “lend expecting nothing back” in Luke 6:35. Later in the First letter of Peter, the apostle will also say, “As each one has received a gift, ***use it*** to serve one another” (1 Pet 4:10). Why such free giving? Because it is Jesus and He always multiplies and grows His goodness through such trusting actions of His followers for the benefit of others. Jesus assures us that such trust in Him, will always bear fruit. Yet, we also offer such generous giving of ourselves to others because Jesus commanded us to: In John 13:15, He says, “*as I have done for you, you should also do.*” In John 15:12, He says, “*Love one another as I have loved you.*” And I think we can easily hear Jesus also telling us, “*Forgive, as I have forgiven you*” and “*Give as I have given to you!*” When we think we can’t do it, Jesus as a good teacher will assure us, “I’m right here-keep at it-We will do it together”. Such a practice of offering our best to Jesus will see us through all things! Peace, Fr Brian

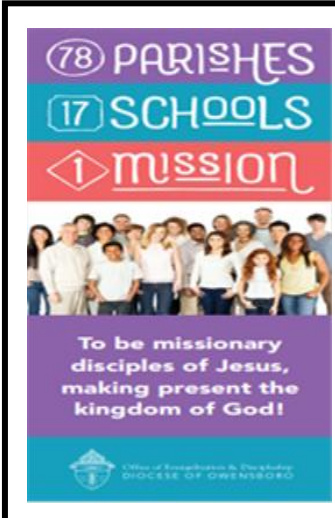
