

In this 6-hour online workshop you will create 9 different disappearing blocks to make this beautiful sampler.

## You will need:

$2 / 3$ yards of $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide light fabric for the background (these are to be cut as described below before the workshop). $2 / 3$ yards of $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide medium to dark fabric or scraps to make the blocks described below.
1 yard of $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide light fabric (either the same as the background or a complimentary color) for the sashing and binding. Pattern "Making Magic, A Disappearing Block Sampler Quilt" available for download at: questioningquilter.com/shop

Your fabrics should all be small prints that read as solid. These blocks could have an issue with high contrast prints.
In order to make all these blocks in the time allotted, the squares, half square triangle blocks and 4-patch blocks need to be prepared ahead of time.

Background fabric (light):
(4) $61 / 4 " \times 6 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares (for 4-Patch Blocks)
(12) $41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4$ " squares
(4) $3^{1 / 4 \prime \prime} \times 31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(8) $63 / 4$ " $\times 63 / 4$ " squares (for Half Square Triangle Blocks)
(2) $43 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 43 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares (for Half Square Triangle Blocks)

Primary Fabric (medium to dark):
(4) $61 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares (for 4-Patch Blocks)
(7) $41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(5) $31 / 4 " \times 31 / 4 "$ squares
(8) $63 / 4$ " $\times 63 / 4$ " squares (for Half Square Triangle Blocks)
(2) $43 / 4$ " $\times 43 / 4$ " squares (for Half Square Triangle Blocks)

## Sashing (to go in between the blocks):

(8) strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ width of fabric

Make two 4-Patch Blocks.
Using the $61 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 4 "$ squares of background and primary fabric. Make two 4 -Patch blocks as shown here.


## Make the Half Square Triangle Blocks:

Use the (8) $63 / 4 " X 63 / 4 \prime$ squares of light fabric and (8) $63 / 4 " X 63 / 4 "$ of dark fabric and make (16) Half square triangle blocks. Trim to $61 / 4 " \times 61 / 4^{\prime \prime}$.

Use the (2) $43 / 4 \prime$ X $43 / 4 \prime$ squares of light fabric and (2) $43 / 4 " \times 43 / 4 "$ of dark fabric and make
 (4) Half square triangles blocks. Trim to $41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$.

There are two methods to make the Half Square Triangle Blocks (HST Blocks). 1. Cut the squares into triangles along the diagonal and sew one light triangle to one dark triangle. 2. Place a light square on top of a dark square right sides together, draw a line down the diagonal of the light square and sew a scan $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on either side of the line. Cut along the drawn line. This will create 2 HST Blocks at once.
Press the HST Blocks open and trim to either $61 / 4 \prime$ X $61 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ or $414^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{4}$ " depending on the size square you used.
Because you are making this in your own home, you should have all the normal other supplies like matching or neutral thread, scissors, rotary cutter, mat, rulers, seam ripper, pins, iron, etc. already on hand.
