Ahoy Mateys,


Are we there yet?!?




Greeting Fellow Club Members,

From The Bridge

From the Bridge May, 2016

The season is here and, from our houseboat, we are always noticing people who simply don't either have a clue about their boats or don't care about those effected by their boating. Neither is acceptable. Thus,? I thought I would climb on my soapbox and talk common sense.

The most common issue that rings true almost everywhere is people thinking if it says 7 knots, they can go that fast without regard to their wakes. The rule is always - repeat always - it's the size of the wake you create - that's what rocks people at marinas and anchorages. You also have to understand that your wake will follow you even further when there is a following tide.

Fueling is one of the most dangerous of times. Generally, when we fuel, we have a policy that Linda and the dogs go for a walk off boat. It's just simpler and eliminates any extra risk. Of course, Asia true when you first start you boat up, run your blower for 5 minutes. I like to open the engine room hatch on the first startup of a cruise and after fueling - nothing senses the smell of fuel like your own nose!

On waterways, your navigation skills and course planning should always be defensive yet direct. I constantly see people passing on one side, many times way to close, then cut in front of our course within a few minutes - causing their wake to become an issue, when planning ahead would have dictated one course without the added wake.

Fuel is much cheaper, but it's still a big item. Planning your course, selecting land markers in your course and running in strategy lines for each leg can save time and a bunch of money.

Where we keep the boat in Friday Harbor over the summer, we are next to the Seattle Yacht Club outstation. It is effected by both wind and tidal currents, yet we watch in amazement as people don't even stop Outside the marina to make up their lives down fenders. Also, I don't think they pay any attention to the tides - it takes two seconds to observe the tides action by the buoy just outside the Moorage. On top of that, once they get between the rows of slips and the tide/wind starts effecting their landing plans, they go straight to powering their engines and thrusters, rather than going slow and using their gears. My old adage in boating is that, when in doubt, go slowly!!

A final thought is when you look at where you want to go and the weather conditions, both actual and predicted, if you even have the slightest doubt, don't go!
