Annually, the Month of the Francophonie is celebrated in March, with a series of cultural events around the world to promote francophone cultures and the French language. According to the International Organization of La Francophonie, (www.francophonie.org) there are an estimated 300 million French speakers worldwide. They report that globally, French is the 5th most widely spoken language, the 3rd most widely used business language, and the 4th most widely used language on the Web. Two Los Angeles Consulate Officers will be available to perform the following two specific functions:

- to receive passport applications, and
- to receive voting proxies

Spring is (finally) in the air! After an unusually cold and rainy winter, the warmer weather is approaching. Traditionally, we have annually celebrated the first day of spring on March 21. However, in 2019, spring will begin with the Vernal Equinox on Tuesday, March 20th, (and not to be too technical) at 5:58 p.m. Eastern Time. Throughout France, there are a number of special events and festivals in March, too many to list here. Some are already in progress. The Dunkirk Carnival commemorates the time in the early 17th century when fishermen went away for many months to fish for cod near Newfoundland and Iceland. Before they left, they enjoyed a big party. Today, in addition to the other parades and festivities, about 450 kilos (1,000 pounds) of smoked herrings are thrown down from the balconies for the celebration. Fortunately, the herrings are wrapped.

month of La Francophonie

The goal of La Francophonie Month is to promote the French language in the context of cultural diversity. Numerous cultural activities, contests and lectures are organised each year around the word.



According to the International Organization of la Francophonie, the term Francophonie appeared for the first time around 1880, when a French geographer, Onesime Reclus, used it to designate all people and countries speaking French. We now speak of Francophonie with a lowercase "f" to designate the French speakers and Francophonie with a capital "F" to represent the institutional mechanism organizing relations between Francophone countries. The Francophonie is first and foremost women and men who share a common language, French. In 2018, there were around 300 million speakers on five continents.

March 20 is the International Day of La Francophonie

Since 1990, Francophones and Francophiles from all continents have been celebrating the International Francophonie Day every 20 March.

This event was created in 1988 to celebrate the French language and its 220 million speakers worldwide. This is an opportunity for everyone to celebrate by expressing their solidarity and desire to live together, in their differences and their diversity!

The date of March 20 was chosen in commemoration of the signing, on March 20, 1970 in Niamey (Niger), of the Treaty establishing the Agency for Cultural and Technical Cooperation (ACCT), the first French-speaking organization.


