THE PARABLE OF THE GOOD SAMARITAN

The Parable of the Good Samaritan — Luke 10:25-37 NRSV

25 An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" 26 He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" 27 He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." 28 And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

29 But wanting to vindicate himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" 30 Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. 31 Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. 32 So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33 But a Samaritan while traveling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. 34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. 35 The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.' 36 Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" 37 He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Our summer worship series focuses on the journeys we take and the people we meet along the way. I began thinking, "How does this relate to who are our neighbors?" There is no better story to examine who our neighbor is than the parable of the Good Samaritan.

In her 2015 book *The Short Stories of Jesus* New Testament and Jewish Studies professor Amy-Jill Levine argues that religion is meant "to comfort the afflicted and to afflict the comfortable." She further suggests, "If we hear a parable and think, 'I really like that' or, worse, fail to have it challenge us, then we are not listening well enough."

The difficulty for us is that Jesus' parables are so familiar and beloved, we don't tend to read them as "afflictions." We have heard these parables many times. We believe we know them inside out and backwards. This becomes a problem when these parables do not challenge us and make us go out into the world to become the hands and feet of Jesus. Many of us are guilty of reading the parable, nodding in agreement, and walking away unchanged.

Jesus in his usual manner answers the question with a question, "What does the law say?" The lawyer gives the correct answer, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind; and you shall love your neighbor as yourself."

The lawyer still a little confused asks, "Who is my neighbor?" Let's be blunt here. The question the lawyer is really asking is "Who is **not** my neighbor?" The lawyer, like many of us, has a fear of the other — someone who is not like us.

What if Jesus' parable is more than a good-example-to-follow story? What if it is a reversal story — a story intended to upset our categories of good and bad, sacred and profane, benefactor and recipient? If we too easily and comfortably identify with the Good Samaritan in this parable, we are missing the point. Maybe the whole point of the Samaritan is that he is **not** us. To put this in more contemporary language, the Samaritan is the "Other."

Is there anything we can do in our 21st century lives to recover the scandal at the heart of this parable? Because its heart is a scandal. Think about it this way. Who is the last person on earth we would ever want to deem "the good guy?" Who is the last person we would ever want to ask for a favor — much less owe our life? Whom do we secretly hope to convert, fix, impress or control — but never ever need?

"Who is my neighbor?" the lawyer asked. Our neighbor is the one who surprises us with compassion, Jesus answered. Our neighbor is the one who upends all our entrenched categories and shocks us with a fresh face of God. Our neighbor is the one who mercifully steps over the line separating us from them and teaches us the real meaning of good.
