<u>ARMENIAN CHRISTMAS TO BE</u> <u>CELEBRATED</u>

In the Armenian Church, "Armenian Christmas," as it is popularly called is officially celebrated on January 6th and it is a Major Feast Day. Historically, all Christian churches celebrated Christ's birth on January 6th until the fourth century.

Because January 6th falls on a weekday this year, in Yettem we will be celebrating on Sunday, January 10th. Armenian Christmas is a culmination of celebrations of events related to Christ's Incarnation. Theophany or Epiphany (or Astvadz-a-haytnootyoon in Armenian) means "revelation of God," which is the central theme of the Christmas Season in the Armenian Church.

Traditionally, we have held a luncheon following services on that day. This year, because of the strong possibility of inclement weather, we will not be able to host such a dinner. Depending on the weather on that day, we will either hold services outside or only stream services because of restrictions on in-person inside worship.

We are pleased to inform our faithful that with the blessings of the Diocesan Primate His Eminence Archbishop Hovnan Derderian and in collaboration with the Department of Social Services of the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin, the Western Diocese is starting a new humanitarian initiative. This mission will be centralized on providing support to displaced families of Artsakh as a result of the war.
