The official Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776 and announced our independence from England. The actual signing of the document did not occur until August 2, 1776 in Philadelphia.

On July 8, 1776, the 'Liberty Bell' was rung in the Pennsylvania State House (Independence Hall), in Philadelphia, summoning citizens to the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence (history.com). Even the Liberty Bell has a biblical reference on it. It says, "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof" (Leviticus 25:10, KJV).

In a recent article contained in Boat US magazine, I learned of a service for boaters in

which a "Marine Weather Router" is used to direct seafarers to safe destinations during perilous journeys. The routers communicate with vessels via various radio systems. satellite phones and the internet. Often the router is on-line with a boat captain 24/7 due to immediate perils. One such example is the story of a captain of a 38-foot Cruiser in the South Atlantic. The captain sailing alone was in a storm that lasted 45 days during his then 1,000-mile journey. He contacted his router and advised him of the severe seas. low fuel and supplies and the need of a safe port. His router directed him to a port but, the captain was advised not to come into port due to the coronavirus. Again, his router directed his charge 1,500 miles east to Cape Town, South Africa and upon reaching there was denied landing due to coronavirus. Thus the saga continued as the captain was rerouted to St. (denied entrance), the Ascension Islands (denied entrance) and finally to the

Virgin Islands where he made harbor. His odyssey assisted by his Router finally ended after 75 days and travelling 3,400 miles.

Who is your Router? Do you need directions travelling as Jesus' disciples? Is Holy Scripture your Router? The captain had reasonable resources, reasonable until the extended storms and low fuel and supplies that he sought help. Today as we slowly return to normalcy, we will have opportunities (as the Holy Spirit leads us) to share God's salvation.
