

Eucharistic Renewal Meditation

"Presiding at liturgy to be well done - indeed, with art! --it is of fundamental importance that the priest have a keen awareness of being, through God's mercy, a particular presence of the risen Lord. The ordained minister is himself one of the types of presence of the Lord which render the Christian assembly unique, different from any other assembly. This fact gives "sacramental" weight (in the broad sense) to all the gestures and words of the one presiding. The assembly has the right to be able to feel in those gestures and words the desire that the Lord has, today as at the Last Supper, to eat the Passover with us. So, the risen Lord is in the leading role, and not our own immaturities, assuming roles and behaviours which are simply not appropriate. The priest himself should be overpowered by this desire for communion that the Lord has toward each person.(Desiderio #57)



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

5th Sunday of Easter Ye

Do you remember Big Bird singing, "Sunny day, Sweepin' the clouds away, On my way to where the air is sweet. Can you tell me how to get, <u>How to get to Sesame Street</u>?" In the gospel reading today, the place to get to is "The Father's House"! And Jesus tells us how to get there! But Thomas, as the good questioner that we know him to be (and as unlikely as it is for a man to ask for directions) asks Jesus, "How do we get to the Father's House; we don't know the way?" I love Jesus' answer to him, "Stick with me Thomas - I am the Way, the Truth and the life" (John 14:6) I bet we all have experience asking for directions. Haven't we all received those not so helpful answers like 'Go down there around the turn and take a left at the tree stump and look for the old Miller place by the school- it is right there!' Okay! But Jesus doesn't just shout out directions at us or give us confusing maps. No, He says, "Come with me – I'll show you". Like the good guide who says 'Fall in behind my car, I'm going that way; follow me & I will take you right there." Jesus doesn't just talk at us. He walks/drives with us to get there. There is no better guide than a friend who goes with us and points out the way, as we go. That is Jesus.

A story is told about the patron saint of parish priests, St. John Vianney. As he was moving to his first pastorate position at the French town of Ars, he asked a boy along the road which drive led back to the little town. The boy pointed to the village a couple hills over. St John Vianney replied, "*Thank you for showing me the way to Ars. If you come with me to Mass, I will show you the way to heaven.*"

But what do we know about that heavenly, 'Father's House'? Jesus says "In my Father's house *there are many dwelling places*" (Jn 14:2) Does that mean that each child of God has his/her own private room? No, I'd say that we already suffer from too much isolation and separation. (*Think of how enclosed everyone already is in their own little self-made private bubbles like exclusive Facebook friends circles or private chat groups, etc even <u>after</u> we raised so much noise about being made to keep in bubbles thru the virus lockdown periods! While Jesus does say that there are many rooms in the Father's House, I understand Him to mean not that we each have our own private 'kingdom room' to call our own. Instead, I understand Him to be saying that since each child of God is unique and unrepeatable, then God has a place or accommodation for each of us. Heaven is not about separating us off from one another in private rooms, (<i>How could you in heaven, since there is so much joy to share and good to give to one another*). Rather, heaven is about getting everyone together. I think the description 'many rooms' means to Jesus that every one of us has our unique place to fill in God's Presence (& everyone finds a place in God's house!) 'Many Rooms' means that it is not 'one-size-fits-all' when it comes to heaven. No, God in His abundantly varied creativity, He has a spot for everyone in heaven. (Think of God's incredible omnipotence to create up the diversity of human persons as innumerably unique, like the differently designed snowflakes or leaf shapes demonstrate!) God has heavenly arrangements to accommodate each one of His differently made and specially blessed children!

To appreciate a better sense of how blessedly diverse, God's creativity is and how it is manifest all around us in creation, I encourage you to read/pray the litany of praises called the 'Song of Three Children' in Daniel 3:56-90. It seems that nearly every species that God created is mentioned in this long list of creatures that glorify God. And every one of them has its place in God's kingdom (Psalm 136 also details God's diverse creation).

I recently ran across this rabbinic story that communicates the same message. There was a Jewish king who built a great palace with numberless chambers, but only one door was opened. When the building was finished, it was announced that all the kingdom's princes should appear before the king who sat enthroned in the last of the chambers. But when the entered they saw that there were doors on all sides. Each door opened to winding passages in the distance and again doors and doors ahead. They were bewildered. Then the King's son arrived, and saw that the labyrinth was a mirrored illusion. The Son saw through it all, and suddenly saw His Father sitting in the hall right in front of him. Lesson: *It took a son (who belongs) - a child, to see straight through the maze of differences and see the one Father seated in the center of the palace (House).* Peace, Fr Brian
