# Reflection from our Chaplin Sr. Lisa

## Keep Hope Alive

As I reflect on the situation in our world today. I am reminded of the words of our new Shepherd, Archbishop Pérez: "We will navigate the difficult waters of this challenge as a united human family, for after all is said and done, we are people of Hope!" It's easy to say we are "people of Hope," but what does that mean for each of us in our own circumstances? Some of our LAOH sisters are self -quarantined, many are worried that they will contract the virus or spread it. Many are struggling financially. How will I pay my bills? How will I get the food and medicine I need? How can I keep my spirit and faith alive when I feel the darkness enveloping me? We are all facing unchartered waters.

For me, I have to go to my ministry each day and provide for 38 elderly, physically and mentally fragile women. They need food, medicine and most of all a sense of safety and Hope. How can I give them Hope? The first thing to remember is that it is not I who gives Hope, but God gives Hope to me and then through me to others. I choose to Hope. God is providing all the grace we need to weather this storm no matter how long it lasts. Take notice of the fact that the word Hope is capitalized in the Archbishop's statement. Hope is capitalized because it is a theological virtue. Hope is not an intellectual or emotional act, it is an act of the will, a conscious choice. Emily Dickinson's poem comes to mind when I think of hope as an emotion. She says, "hope (no capital) is a thing with feathers that perches on the soul." The emotion of hope is fleeting. It flies away like a bird. The virtue of Hope is the choice to believe and trust that God is taking care of us in the detail of our lives. After all, He has counted the hairs on our heads...and right now I have "coronavirus hair" and that's a lot of hairs to count.

In his 2007 encyclical on hope, *Spa Salvi*, Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "The one who has Hope lives differently." These words remind us that "Hope is not a fleeting emotion, much less an attitude that fades when life is hard, but a resilient stance toward life marked by trust, confidence and perseverance. Hope empowers us to live differently because a Christian understanding of Hope is rooted in the unshakable conviction that God loves us and wants our good." Remember Paul's declaration in Romans: "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (8:31). To live Hope is to take those words to heart and to keep Hope alive even during these uncertain times.

My Spiritual Director always says, "Do the truth and the light will come." Choose to Hope, stay positive, and live in the truth of Hope. Choose to trust God and light and peace will follow. So when one of my ladies asks me when this will all end and she'll be allowed out, I am honest but positive. This will end. We don't know when, but we need to live in HOPE one day at a time. So check in on your family and friends, from a distance, and use social media and the phone to connect. Remember what Theresa of Avila said, "All things are passing; God alone is changeless."

One more thing, say or sing a Hail Mary while you wash your hands for our loved ones and our human family. I sing it to the theme song of "Gilligan's Island." Give it a try. Until we meet again (literally), I hold you in my heart and in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Hope of God.
