ELECTION NEWS

2 CANDIDATES FOR SCHOOL BOARD NOW ON BALLOT (AUG 6) – As of close of business today, appointed incumbent Jan Nimick has joined Barby Lichti Wunsch on the ballot as a candidate for the school board – the Templeton Unified School District (TUSD) Board of Trustees. Wayne Petersen remains the lone candidate for a seat on Templeton's town council – the Templeton Community Services District (TCSD) Board of Directors. ***Please note that at least 3 candidates for each board must run in order for an election to take place.*** Two seats are up for election on both boards (TCSD and TUSD). The deadline to file to run is August 10th (if an incumbent in a seat up for election isn't running, the deadline will be extended to August 15th – for non-incumbents only).

NEWS FROM 1st DISTRICT SUPERVISOR JOHN PESCHONG – Every Friday, 1st District Supervisor John Peschong sends out an update with news from San Luis Obispo County to share with his constituents. Here are 2 more items from last Friday's report.

COUNTY ASKS FOR INPUT ON STORM WATER PLAN – (AUG 3) The San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District received a grant to develop a region-wide Stormwater Resources Plan with the intent to encourage the use of storm water and dry weather runoff as a resource to improve water quality, reduce localized flooding, and increase water supplies for beneficial uses and the environment. A series of public workshops will be held through August and September to get input on the final plan and list of projects. PLEASE CONSIDER RUNNING FOR LOCAL OFFICE – The nomination period to run for a seat on either the Templeton Community Services District Board of Directors or the Templeton Unified School District Board of Trustees **begins on Monday, July 16th and runs through August 10**. Two seats are up for election on each board and a minimum of three candidates for each board must step forward for an election to be held. If two or less file, they will automatically be seated without an election.

PUBLIC WORKSHOP ON WATER & SEWER RATE CHANGES AUGUST 30 – The Templeton Community Services District (TCSD) provides drinking water service to approximately 2,800 accounts including homes and businesses. TCSD also provides sewer conveyance, treatment, and disposal to about 2,200 accounts. TCSD's water and sewer utilities rely on rates paid by customers to fund the costs for operations and maintenance. These utilities do not receive any property tax revenues. After a great deal of careful study, the District has proposed an adjustment in both water and sewer rates to maintain a balanced budget. The public is invited to attend a workshop to learn more about the proposed rate adjustments on August 30 at 6:30 pm in the Templeton Community Center (Women's Clubhouse at 601 S. Main). The DRAFT rate study can be viewed at the District's website at www.templetoncsd.org or in the District office (5th & Crocker).
