Clubhouse floor update- Perfect Floors replaced about 30% of the floor. Standing water was found under the floor, possibly from excessive water being used during mopping. The flooring is being discontinued and Perfect Floor donated the remainder of their stock to Colonial Acres.

Skunks and Raccoons are the main culprits. As stated in the rules and regulation book, Cans out after 5:00p.m. on Sunday. Bags out by 8a.m. Monday morning.

MEET THE CANDIDATES- Each candidate was given the opportunity to introduce themselves, give an over view of who they are, their background, why they're running for the board, and to answer questions from the members present at the meeting.

 crew mowed too early. Jim explained that staffing issues caused the one time only
 change in the mowing schedule start time.

- *Laura Gola observed leak in Clubhouse kitchen ceiling following rain event. Will have investigated.

Cleaning: Ceiling fans, window, and window screens added to cleaning schedule twice yearly.
