HOUSTON-HOLICKY-SITTER VETERANS FORUM

MC: Col. Bill Parrish, USMC Ret.

HHS Veterans' Forum meets next on Tuesday April 9, 2024.

Location will be Publix, 2250 John Rolfe Pky, Henrico, VA 23233. We will be in the Community Meeting Room on the 2nd floor.

Guest speaker will be Robin Hutton, author Sgt Reckless (USMC), America's War Horse. Her bio is on the following page.

Doors open at 1115, the program begins at 1150, and the program will conclude by 1300. Lunch may be purchased from the Publix' Deli.

The Houston-Holicky-Sitter Veterans' Forum is an informal forum for veterans of all branches of the armed forces. Col. Joseph J. Holicky, Jr. (USMC, ret.) and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Col. Carl L. Sitter (USMC, ret.) began having lunch together in the mid 1970's following their retirements. Over the years other veterans and local active duty Marines joined them for lunch. In the early 1980's Lt. Col. L.W. "Chip" Houston (USMCR, ret.) became part of the leadership team and served as its Master of Ceremonies for over 25 years. Today nearly 100 veterans meet each month to carry on the HHS tradition and to hear prominent guest speakers address military history, national security issues, and other topics of interest to veterans.

HHS is apolitical, and promotion of political interests is prohibited. HHS is a not-for-profit group, but it is neither a 501c3 nor a 501c4 organization.



Robin Hutton has spent her adult life working in major event productions and the motion picture business. She was the writing and producing partner of Tom "Billy Jack" Laughlin for over thirty years until his death in 2013. Currently she is President of Angels Without Wings, Inc., a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation that spearheaded the development and dedication of six national monuments to Sgt. Reckless, the famous Korean War horse.

Her first book, *Sgt Reckless: America's War Horse*, was a *New York Times* Bestseller, as well as the 2015 Equine Book of the Year from American Horse Publications, and a 2016 Gold Medal winner from Military Writers Society of America. Her latest book, *War*

Animals: The Unsung Heroes of World War II, was a 2019 Gold Medal winner from Military Writers Society of America. The heroes in this book inspired a new project, the Animals in War & Peace Medal of Bravery and Distinguished Service Medals. The inaugural ceremony for this medal was held on November 14, 2019 in Washington, DC on Capitol Hill, and on March 6, 2024 the fourth annual medal ceremony took place. This ceremony also launched the Animals In War & Peace Museum - a traveling museum to commemorate these war animals who fought side-by-side with our military war heroes.

AWARDS: Ms. Hutton received three Certificates of Appreciation from the Veterans of Foreign Wars, as well as an award from the Department of Defense's Korean War

60th Anniversary Commemorative Committee. In 2014 she was named "Patriotic Citizen of the Year" by The Military Order of the World Wars and The Military Order of the Purple Heart for her charitable work. She also received the Ambassador for Peace Medal from the South Korean Government. On November 13, 2019 she was awarded the very first Sgt Reckless Award, a new medal presented by the National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame where a new monument to Sgt. Reckless stands.

In 2020, *Sgt. Reckless: America's War Horse* was chosen as a selection on the Commandant of the Marine Corps' Professional Reading List. In 2022, Robin was named the 2022 Writer of the Year by the Military Writers Society of America.
