Congregational Council Minutes August 8, 2021

ATTENDANCE: All were present except Jenny Scott, Allison Swygert, and Buddy Hydrick (hospitalized).

CARES AND CONCERNS: Praying for Earl Sease after pacemaker insertion, Hazel Bockus in hospital awaiting nursing home placement, Kim Addy's grandfather on hospice, and Angie and Buddy Hydrick.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Approved with addition of dishwasher issue under Support Team and removal of Teach Team saying they had minutes attached.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES: Approved with no corrections **REPORTS**:

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. She will be having a Bible Study on Wednesdays in September. Additionally, she will offer a New Members class on September 20th, October 3rd, and October 10th during Sunday School hour.
- Treasurer: Written report received for July 2021.
- Financial Secretary: Written report received for July 2021.

Team Reports/Recommendations:

Support: The dishwasher in the Fellowship Hall isn't pumping water out properly and splashing. It is connected on the same circuit breaker as the ice machine and the dishwasher is causing breaker to flip off. A new dishwasher would be about \$400 and also need a dedicated circuit breaker. It's used maybe 4 times annually so it will be added to the Building Renovation wish list.

Outreach: Written report received from July meeting. The Food Pantry distributed 95 setups in July. The Red Cross blood drive is August 22nd and the workshop Dementia Through the Lens of Grace is August 29th. Mrs. Dot Mathias has asked that her Exercise Class be under the Outreach Team. She typically has 22 community participants.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Building Renovation & Repair Task Force: Motion to send an informational letter to the congregation and schedule a meeting on August 29th after worship to discuss the information and receive feedback from the congregation.

APPROVED

- 2. Procedural Audit Inquiry: Motion to send audit inquiry to Finance Team for further discussion and consideration. **APPROVED**
- 3. SC Beekeepers Association: They will notify us if they accept reservation request of Fellowship Hall on first Tuesday of each month.
- 4. Parsonage: The family renting the parsonage will leave on August 31st. There is currently no interest in someone else renting the parsonage.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Cemetery Committee recommends that Zack Keisler & Company be the only grave digger to open grave sites in Mt. Hermon Lutheran Church Cemetery. Should a family choose a funeral home that does not use Zack Keisler & Company, then Mt. Hermon will notify the funeral home that we have our own

grave digger. The funeral home will prepay Zack Keisler & Company \$600 with certified funds before the opening of the grave. The check will be delivered to Mt. Hermon Lutheran Church. After the grave is opened, Mt. Hermon will notify the funeral home that the site is ready for them to set up for the burial. Motion that we accept Cemetery Committee's recommendation. **APPROVED**. Cemetery Committee also reports that Norman Hook requests to remove the large oak tree located on the outside of the cemetery near the Hook family burial plot at their own expense. Motion that we accept Norman Hook's request. **NOT APPROVED 6-3 vote.** Motion that we allow the Hook family to trim the oak tree at their expense to improve their family burial plot. **APPROVED**.

- 2. 2022 Spending Plan Requests: Each team should submit their budget requests to the Finance Committee in August for planning 2022 church budget. The Finance Committee will then meet in September to plan budget to submit to council for review at October meeting. The budget will then be sent to the congregation for approval in November.
- 3. Annual Congregational Meeting: The Annual Meeting will begin on November 7th following worship with the submission of nominations for council. A list will be distributed with those ineligible to serve.
- 4. Background Checks: Updating policy on whose responsibility it is to update files.
- 5. Motion from Robin Ellisor to require masks and social distancing between pews in church services per CDC and DHEC guidelines. **NOT APPROVED 6-3 vote.**
- 6. Next meeting September 12th at 6 pm with devotions by Karen Nicholson.


