## THE STORY OF RED RIBBON WEEK

The first nationwide Red Ribbon Week started in 1988 in honor of Officer Enrique "Kiki" Camerena, who lost his life trying to stop illegal drugs. Officer Camerena wanted to make a difference in this world; even though, he was only one person. After college, he served in the Marines, became a police officer, and eventually joined the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration to work undercover investigating illegal drugs. On February 7, 1985, Officer
 Camerena was killed by drug dealers. Officer Camarena's friends and neighbors then started wearing red ribbons to show support for him. Three years later the red ribbon became the official symbol of Red Ribbon Week.
