#### THE STORY OF RED RIBBON WEEK

The first nationwide Red Ribbon Week started in 1988 in honor of Officer Enrique "Kiki" Camerena, who lost his life trying to stop illegal drugs. Officer Camerena wanted to make a difference in this world; even though, he was only one person. After college, he served in the Marines, became a police officer, and eventually joined the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration to work undercover investigating illegal drugs. On February 7, 1985, Officer Camerena was killed by drug dealers. Officer Camarena's friends and neighbors then started wearing red ribbons to show support for him.

Three years later the red ribbon became the official symbol of Red Ribbon Week.

Specific information about classroom parties will be sent home closer to October 31<sup>st</sup>; however, information about Stepping Stones Academy's school policy is included below to help answer basic questions. Party time for every class is the last part of the day, so students will complete academic work during the rest of the day.

**Pre-K – 4<sup>th</sup> grades** – These group may wear costumes for their parties, but are to come to school in school uniform. Time will be given before the party for students to change into costumes. Students will then walk through the classrooms to show their costumes. Treats will be handed out by Mrs. Jones and Mrs. Schenkel at the end of the parade. Students will then return to classrooms for class parties. **Costumes must be** 

school-appropriate and may not include any type of weapon.

**5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grades** – National Junior Honor Society is hosting a Disney themed dance for 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders from 1:00-3:00 p.m. on October 31<sup>st</sup>. ### K-8<sup>TH</sup> GRADE AWARDS ASSEMBLY NEXT FRIDAY, OCTOBER 27<sup>TH</sup>

**September Perfect Attendance Award** – Students attending school each day during the month and have no more than one unexcused tardy and one early departure earn this award. Excused tardies do not affect this award. Students receive a certificate, Mustang money, and are invited to participate in the No School Uniform Day on Friday, October 6<sup>th</sup>.



- 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Perfect Attendance Award Students attending school each day during the quarter and have no more than one unexcused tardy and one early departure earn this award. Excused tardies do not affect this award. Students receive a certificate, Mustang money, and extra recess. The extra recess time is scheduled for Tuesday, October 24<sup>th</sup> from 2:30-2:50 p.m. The names are also entered in a drawing for a \$25 Visa gift card.
- **1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Honor Roll Award** Students earning all A's and B's in graded academic classes receive this award. Students receive a certificate, Mustang money, and a Homework Pass.
- **1**<sup>st</sup> **Quarter Academy Award** Students earning all A's in graded academic classes receive this award. Students receive a certificate, Mustang money, and a Homework Pass.


