# **State says** inmate site lacks basic security

The Largo re-entry center has a history of escape because it's easy.

LARGO — The cameras were in the wrong places, the lights didn't illuminate some key areas and the back fence has been all too easy for an immate to hop.

A nine-page report from the state Department of Corrections found plenty of flaws at the Largo Residual Re Largo Residual Re Entiry Center, where two recent incidents led to immates being charged with violent crimes. The facility lacked some of the most basic security measures, according to the report.
