Was Jesus a Normal Child?

This is one reason the people in His own home town could not accept Him as the Messiah, and neither could His immediate family at first. Not that He was an ornery, self-pious brat, but because He grew up just like everyone else. He was the kid that lived down the street and played with your child.

The next thing we know about Jesus is when He was 12 years old. His family was in Jerusalem for the Passover. For three days they did not know where their child was. Where did they find Him? He was sitting at the feet of some scholarly Jewish teachers. This was something extraordinary for a 12 year old boy to be doing. Evidently, by the time Jesus reached this age, He must have started to be different from the other children. He even astounded His earthly parents to the place they did not totally understand their son. In spite of this, He was not a disobedient son. Luke 2:51, "Then he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them." Jesus set forth a pattern that all of our teenagers should possess.

We need to accept Jesus with the faith of a child, but we are not meant to remain spiritual children. Let's look through the eyes of children, but let's mature into the Christians God wants us to be.

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
