About FSC

The Foundation Soccer Club (FSC) is a Christian-based soccer club in Mansfield, Ohio. We have been blessed by God with the ability to play and coach this beautiful game. We are to glorify God in everything we do, and that includes our behavior on the soccer field. "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (Colossians 3:17 ESV). Behavior on the soccer field should be a testimony.

Soccer (youth sports in general) should be an instrument to help kids develop positive character traits and life values. Soccer should be a safe, positive and meaningful experience for everyone. Kids should always see sports as fun and recreational. However, premier soccer is also a highly competitive sporting environment where teams are striving for improvement, victory and success. Balancing fun, recreation, intensity, skills, tactics, ethics, sportsmanship, and Biblical values within an enjoyable yet competitive arena should result in a successful and positive experience for everyone. We expect our players to grow in their knowledge of and respect for the game and in their desire to improve, and to build character that will last a lifetime and beyond.

In an effort to preserve and achieve these principles, the FSC has developed a Code of Conduct. This Code of Conduct is in conjunction with the guidelines established by Ohio North Youth Soccer, and was adapted from other successful soccer clubs including the AYSA. It shall govern the actions of coaches, players, parents and spectators. It is intended to provide behavioral guidance and establish expectations for everyone involved. It does not cover every possible occurrence on the soccer field; however, it shall serve as the basis for the FSC to evaluate behavior.

It shall be the responsibility of all players, parents and coaches to read, sign, and comply with this Code of Conduct. By signing this Code of Conduct, you acknowledge the terms and conditions and shall make

every effort to commit to them. Anyone refusing to sign or found to be in violation of the terms within this Code shall be subject to administrative action, up to and including removal of privileges to participate in or attend any FSC activities or events.

Foundation Soccer Club Code of Conduct

Players:

- Shall display good sportsmanship and team play.
- Shall respect and strive to play within the rules of the game.
- Shall make every attempt to be on time for every practice and game.
- Shall be prepared for every practice and game (ball, drink, equipment, meds, uniform, etc.).
- Shall respect all coaches, opponents, teammates, league officials, referees, and spectators.
- Shall listen and follow the instructions from all coaching staff and officials.
- Shall be supportive and encouraging towards teammates.
- Shall not question or argue a referee's or coach's call (no verbal dissent).
- Shall not use foul or abusive language.
- Shall not taunt or humiliate another player.
- Shall not abuse, mistreat or mishandle any equipment or property from any facility.
- Shall not become a distraction or detriment to any practice or game.

Parents:

- Understand that State League play time does not guarantee equal playing time. It is equitable play time (what the game and competition require) and is at the coach's discretion.
- Understand that regular season games are for player development (although winning is the goal, we look at developing all players) and all tournaments are for competition where winning is the goal.
- Shall strive to be positive role models.
- Shall make every attempt to get their child to practices and games prepared and on time.
- Shall display and instill in all players the principles of good sportsmanship and team play.
- Shall provide the players positive and encouraging support from the sidelines.
- Shall behave and control emotions in such a way that best serves the interest of the players.

PARENTS' Code of Conduct Continued.....

- Shall be responsible for any friend, relative or other spectator attending your child's event.
- Shall inform the coach of disabilities or health issues that may affect performance or safety.
- Shall respect (and make certain that their child shows respect for) the game, all coaches, players, parents, league officials, referees, and spectators.
- Shall avoid any verbal or physical confrontations with all coaches, players, parents, league officials, referees, and spectators from all teams and facilities involved.
- Shall give the players plenty of room on the sidelines and corners of the field.
- Shall be drug, tobacco and alcohol free while at any FSC event or function.
- Shall discuss the game or practice privately with the coaches in a civil fashion if necessary.
- Are encouraged to attend practices to see what is being taught and reinforce at home.
- Shall not question or argue a referee's or coach's call (no verbal dissent).
- Shall not ridicule, scold, humiliate or demean anyone at anytime.
- Shall not pace up and down the sidelines with the flow of play.
- Shall not use foul or abusive language.
- Shall avoid confusing the players by coaching or giving any instructions from the sidelines.
- Shall not yell at or converse with any player, coach or official during a game.
- Shall not discuss the game or the play of any players, coaches, or officials in a negative way in front of other players, parents, coaches or officials.
