On May 21st, we'd love to take you to a beach that is new to the BBC,

The Coquina Gulfside Park on Anna Maria Island.

According to the Conde Nast Traveler magazine in 2015, Coquina Beach has the best island beach sand in the U.S. and the fifth-best in the world. Unusual for a beach park is its shaded walk and picnic areas, offering a great escape from Florida's heat.

For those of you a bit more adventurous, there's Coquina Bay Walk right across the street. Although the entire trail system is less than a mile—and you don't need to walk the full distance--it might be fun to explore. The trails offer great views of the bay from observation decks hidden away in the mangroves—you feel like you're peeking out of tunnels! Climb to the top of the spoil piles for a sweeping view of the bay and the gulf. Degree of difficulty – reportedly 1 out of 10!

Yes, there is a café at Gulfside Park which is eager to exchange fresh food for delectable dollars! As you can see, it's a bit small so we'd want to stagger our visits. They were delighted to learn that we are coming. You can see their extensive menu at:

First, we'll drive by the COLORFUL Villages of the Arts, (where you may need a good pair of shades!), as well as The Bradenton Riverwalk,

Then spend an hour on your own at The Manatee Village Historical Park, where you can learn about early Florida pioneer life at the Wiggins General Store, the Fogarty Boat works, the Settlers House, the 1887 Church and the 1860 Courthouse.
