

From Rally Hosts, Jim and Ginny Passe and Jim and Brenda Payne

The Spring 2017 Rally was held April 26-30 at Catherine's Landing RV Park in Hot Springs, Arkansas. We had 53 people, including nine guests, and 28 coaches at this event. The rally was co-hosted by Jim and Ginny Passe, and Jim and Brenda Payne. As a team, the hosts were known as the "JP Squares" (JP²). As non-Texans, the Squares custom designed the rally



bags with symbols of Arkansas on one side and Louisiana on the other. The bags contained the usual Chamber of Commerce information, maps, travel guide, list of attendees, small gifts, and pocket size rally agendas. In addition, a small commemorative cooler was provided with each rally bag.

We kicked off the Wednesday evening activities with a complimentary cocktail social sponsored by Trane A/C. This was followed by a terrific catered dinner of fish and chicken tenders cooked on-site with all the "fixins" by Bubba's Fish and Seafood Catering. D-lish! After dinner we were entertained by Jackie B and Me. The musical duet had folks dancing or singing along in no time. Day one, Squares have just begun!

Thursday morning began with a wonderful catered breakfast from **The Daily Dish** with pancakes, scrambled

Once in the Village, they toured a private collection of antique cars of all varieties and listened to the individual history of

Right there in Hot Springs is the largest manufacturer of rubber bands in the world. The tour included a presentation on the history of the family-owned business, a show-and-tell on the rubber material used, where it's from, and how it's blended with other material. This was followed by a very interesting factory floor tour through the manufacturing process. Production is tracked in pounds, not units.

Meanwhile, the ladies were off enjoying their busy day. After the



membership meeting, they traveled through hill and dale to the deep woods studio of **Forest Path Gallery** to see and hear about the making of unique turned wooden vessels and carved specialty items. The artist was



excellent in presenting his unique pieces of art work. Some of the ladies left with examples of his fine work. Then it was back to civilization and a wonderful lunch at **Belle Arti** in downtown Hot Springs, followed by shopping on historic Central Avenue.

Next, the guys and gals met back together at the **Bath House Row Visitors Center** and were treated to a private "behind the scenes" presentation of the history of "The Springs of Hot Springs" by the National Park Historian. It was both an entertaining and informative presentation enjoyed by all.

After this, we walked next door to the **Superior Bathhouse Brewery** to first

motor grader products being built there along with understanding the quality metrics in place to help insure the goal of continuous product improvement. With that being said, it was made clear the most important goal of all is to send all employees home safely to their families after every shift. This facility has been very successful in meeting all their goals, so much so that Caterpillar has announced the moving of medium wheel loader manufacturing to this facility from Illinois. Following this presentation, the men were equipped with headphones and safety glasses and escorted to the shop floor where they were shown every step in the production of Cat's motor grader product line. It was truly interesting for the men to see and understand what it takes to be the world leader in this market segment, and to know this process is replicated in every Cat facility worldwide. Following the tour, the men stopped at a fun diner to enjoy lunch, some even ordered fried bologna sandwiches! Yum.

Meanwhile, back in Hot Springs, the ladies were having a great time of their own. They started with a drive to **Fox Pass Pottery** where they were given a full demonstration on "throwing" a bowl on the potter's wheel, as well as, an example of a hand built piece. They toured the glazing room and kiln area.

This business has been located in this rustic and tranquil setting for 44 years. They are famous throughout the coun-

try for their pottery. They said pieces with flaws are taken out back and used for target practice, rather than have their name on less than perfect products. From the amount of items the ladies bought in the showroom, it would seem they enjoyed the visit.

From there the ladies traveled to **The Grand Lagniappe Shoppe**, a boutique clothing, gift shop and tea room, to enjoy a lovely lunch while being treated to a style show. The models were fun and friendly. After

lunch there was plenty of time for shopping in this unique eclectic boutique.
