DUES REMINDER 2019 Association Dues will be \$75

After a majority of association members responded positively to a poll on Nextdoor regarding an increase in the boulevard maintenance, an official vote was held at the Annual Meeting in March. It was unanimously decided to increase our boulevard maintenance and adjust the dues to cover the new costs.

Old Assessment: \$50- Provided spring and fall cleanup of end caps. Homeowners maintain boulevard in front of their homes during growing season to keep it presentable.
New Assessment \$75- Provides spring and fall cleanup of end caps. Plus, several maintenance visits as needed throughout the growing season to ring and mulch tree bases, apply weed treatment for grass, fill in ruts, seed grass, and replace trees.

Fall Leaf Collection



City leaf collection runs from September 30 through November 29. Leaves can be placed at the curb in open hard containers, in compostable bags, or merely raked to the curb for pick up along with garbage and recyclables on Sunday nights. We ask that all neighbors periodically rake or blow the leaves and collect sticks or branches from the boulevard sections in front of their homes to place in their weekly leaf and compost collection.
