March Reflection

John 14:22-23 - Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will reveal yourself to us, and not to the world?" Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them.

It used to be a running joke in the Christy household that we were going to sign my Nana up for the television show Hoarders. If you haven't seen Hoarders, it is a show all about people who never throw anything away, and they keep just about every single item that they have ever owned. All these items stack up around the house, and eventually people get called in to clean out the house. Watching the show one is struck by a sense of disgust and amazement that people could allow their homes to descend to such states.

We used to joke about the show hoarders, because my Nana was a hoarder. Now certainly her house never looked like the houses on the show, she kept a very clean home, but Lord help you if you opened the basement door. Because her basement was more or less floor to ceiling boxes most of them crushed, molded, and containing nothing but trash.

In fact, when Eric Rudolf was on the run, my Nana and G-Dad lived in Murphy and the joke was that when they moved they would find Eric Rudolf trapped under boxes smothered by years of unused Christmas decorations. I say we joked about it, but yet no one would have been surprised if he was under boxes because I'm not kidding you could not walk down there.

Even though no one touched those boxes for four years Nana always knew exactly what was in each box. And every single box meant something to her. I remember specifically when Nana and G Dad were moving back to Lake Junaluska he was pleading with Nana to throw away some boxes, and she said if there were any she didn't need they would throw them away. G dad grabbed a box that was sitting at the bottom of the stairs and said, "How bout this one." It was a box that simply contained odd sized pieces of ribbon, and Nana refused to throw it away because she felt that it might come in handy down the road, never know when you are going to need to make a mouse a scarf, and besides as she said, "we cut those ribbons tying on bows for the bags that we sent to the orphanage in Africa, I can't throw them away."

You see I saw, G daddy saw, I'm pretty sure everybody saw just a box of junk a box of trash, Nana saw the children that she met in Africa. It wasn't just a box to her.

Now I don't want you to think that I am giving you an excuse to go out today and start hoarding, but I think it is amazing how differently we can see and perceive things. To some people a box is simply a box, to others that box contains memories that they fear will be lost without a physical reminder.

We find ourselves today in the very appropriately named Farewell Discourse in John. This discourse begins in chapter 13 and ends in chapter 17. This is a time when Jesus really seems to let his guard down, and he speaks openly to the disciples. So often when the disciples go to Jesus with questions they are met with parabolic answers, or redirections, often they are told that they are not asking the right question. However, the teaching capacity of Jesus' ministry is quickly coming to an end, and he does something in these chapters that he does not typically do, he begins to offer responses to the disciples questions.

Our Scripture today contained one of these burning questions and the question that is posed by Judas is one that I would suggest carries more weight and more relevance today than it did even in the first century. Judas, who John is very careful to tell us is not Iscariot, asks a question of Jesus, he says, "Jesus, how is it that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world." I have to give Judas his due, he does have a point: How is it that some can so clearly see who Jesus is while others' vision remains clouded? Right before the farewell discourse the Pharisees cornered Jesus and said, "Tell us plainly are you the Messiah?" and Jesus says, "You have seen me you have heard me, what do you think." How could they not see that Jesus is the Messiah? Why is it that some can see Jesus for who he really is, living and active, for the life that he brings, and for the ways that he changes our lives, for the ways that Christ breaks into our lives and calls us to himself, while others will see Jesus simply as a historical figure, someone who has no bearing on their lives whatsoever today?

I think the answer to this question lies in the response that Jesus Christ makes to Judas, "Those who love me will listen to my voice. Whoever does not love does not keep my word." I believe the reason that you can put two people in a room and they will have two completely different reactions to the name Jesus Christ is because we have failed to do our job as disciples. We have stopped listening to the voice of Jesus and we have sunk to speaking about Jesus on the world's terms. We talk about Jesus as if we can prove Jesus, as if our faith is only rooted in empirical evidence. We think that if we can prove Jesus, everyone will listen.

But that is where we have gotten it wrong, and in fact this plan has backfired in a big way. For today the church is known more for what we are against as opposed to what we are for. Arguing, screaming, yelling, those things don't create disciples. We don't have to prove Jesus; Jesus has already proven himself through the resurrection. This is why Jesus doesn't say, those who love me will argue best for me, he doesn't say you will know my disciples by their rhetoric and their debate skills, and there is a reason we don't sing they will know we are Christians by the way we prove our evidence, by the way we prove our evidence, by the way we prove our evidence.

No Jesus says those who love me will listen to my voice. How do we do that? I honestly think it is as simple as being attentive to what Jesus calls us to do. By loving the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind, and our neighbors as ourselves. By loving others as Jesus Christ loves us, by feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, visiting the sick and imprisoned, clothing the naked. By taking communion, by living lives shaped and formed through prayer, and by regularly gathering as a body to worship. If we are listening to the voice of Jesus, this is what we do. I said it was simple, I didn't say it was easy.

But the good news is if God didn't think you were up to the task of discipleship he wouldn't have called you as his child. As we prepare for this season of Lent beginning on Wednesday, may we not simply hear the words of Jesus, may we not simply think about the words of Jesus, may we **Listen to** his words, and may our lives bear witness to the goodness, grace, and mercy of God.

Please mark your calendar to join your church family for these fun fellowship events.




On Saturday, March 29, will have our **Breakfast**Community Breakfast. Serving times will be from


