


Q2 How important is local agriculture to you?







Q4 Do you ever buy local (Town or Washington County) agricultural products at the following places?






Q12 How many acres of land do you currently farm?


Q19 Does your operation include value-added products or processing?






Q25 How many acres of land do you rent to farmers?


Q26 Does the land you rent to a farmer receive an agricultural assessment to reduce your property taxes?

Q27 What agricultural activities take place on your land (Check all that apply)?




