#### Final Field Trip - Learning & Fun!

The 8th grade went to Lancaster for a religion field trip on a beautiful spring day in May. Our first stop was to the Lancaster Mennonite Information Center where we watched a movie to learn more about the unique way of life and faith of the Amish and Mennonites. Then we had a tour of



the Biblical Tabernacle which is an intricately designed life-size reproduction of the original Old Testament tabernacle from the Book of Exodus. Next we went to the Ephrata Cloister to enjoy a picnic lunch on their lovely grounds. The Cloister is one of America's earliest religious communities. It was founded in 1732 by German settlers seeking spiritual goals rather than earthly rewards. Gathered in unique European style buildings, the community consisted of celibate Brothers and Sisters, and a married congregation of families. At the zenith, about 300 members worked and worshipped at the Cloister. Today the Cloister is a National Historic Landmark. We toured the buildings and learned about this community's history and way of life. We all had a very enjoyable and educational day.

Plan for Growth and Improvement - OBJECTIVES: It has been decided to focus our Plan for Growth and Development in three areas: Reading, Mathematics, and Discipline. Three Action Plan Teams have been formed and they are analyzing the data to develop a seven-year improvement plan in these areas. The objectives for these plans are in the process of being developed and then will be approved by the Middle States Association before the plans themselves are created.

#### What we are in the process of completing. . .

<u>Plan for Growth and Improvement - ACTION PLANS:</u> Once the objectives have been approved, the Action
Plan Teams will actively begin creating the seven-year plans. In the meantime, they have already begun the discussion concerning the formation of the plan.
