Player Calls Cops on Hall Capacity

Upton Bingo in Cape Coral, Florida, got an unexpected visit from the police after reopening under the governor's post-Coronavirus phase-one plan, which allowed the Bingo hall to operate at 25-percent capacity. At full capacity, the hall seated 473 people. That meant that under the plan, 118 people were allowed in the hall. When it was revealed that there were actually 133 people there (15 more than the 25-percent limit) someone called foul and then called law enforcement. Police arrived, inspected the hall, observed that the owners were following all phase-one safety guidelines and approved the slightly oversized occupant number without issuing a citation.

Zoom Bingo

As cities continue to take proactive measures to slow the spread of the coronavirus, more Americans are working remotely. Consequently, videoconferencing tools like Zoom and Microsoft Teams have become a normal part of the new telecommute workday for tens of millions of people. And these video conferencing tools aren't just for the home office; they are also good for virtual gameplay with friends and family. There are innumerable games available. Among them: Bingo—currently one of the more popular video conference games because it transitions well to the virtual setting and is conducive to both small and large groups.

It's easy to craft Bingo cards at home, there are online number generators to help streamline the process, and some apps provide a recap of numbers already called to minimize confusion.

Feel Good Bingo

This spring, a workgroup from **Communities That Care (CTC)** Marinette and Menominee counties, Michigan, came up with a new way to promote health during stay-at-home orders: Communities That Care - Feel Good Bingo. Participants downloaded a Bingo card online and did activities designed to promote mental, physical and emotional health as outlined on the card. As players completed lines on the card, they were entered in prize drawings. CTC guides communities through a proven five-phase change process. Using prevention science as its base, CTC promotes healthy youth development, improves youth outcomes, and reduces problem behaviors.

Parking Lot Bingo

Masonic Lodge 289 in Grand Rapids, Ohio, has been sponsoring a social-distancing community Bingo event twice a week in a parking lot in downtown Grand Rapids. Players park in the lot and play Bingo for free from their car seats as the caller sits in a van and calls the numbers over a loudspeaker. Winners signal Bingo by honking their car horns. Prizes are candy bars, delivered from a safe distance using a six-foot gripping wand.



VA's Emergency Preparedness

The Department of Veterans Affairs has a disaster preparedness team called the Disaster Emergency Medical Personnel System (DEMPS).

Part of DEMPS is the National Emergency Medical Response Teams: medical and nonmedical volunteers on call for two months at a time who are able to deploy within 48 hours. Whether it's a flood, earthquake or other natural disaster, once a Presidential Declaration is issued the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) jump in. That's when the VA's DEMPS programs can be activated.

The VA isn't just helping veterans during this coronavirus crisis. Per its fourth mission (to support the country in emergencies), the VA started up its 3D printing network to test

designs of medical equipment. Along with the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), it's creating 3D prototypes of face shields, masks and ventilators.

Additionally, at the request of FEMA, the VA has made 1,500 beds available across the country for nonveterans who need acute and intensive care. In some places it's sent additional medical staff to state veterans homes, given clinical support to the homeless loaned a pharmacy trailer to a medical center and built a hospital with 1,000 beds. As of this writing, DEMPS has moved into Louisiana to help with the explosion of coronavirus cases, and the VA is seeking medical professionals to help with intensive care units as well as biomedical technicians with ventilator experience.

If you have a nonessential medical need, call your VA facility and talk to them. You might decide to postpone your visit for a little while. Or perhaps you can be seen via Telehealth, either on your tablet or computer.

She then presented the Bingo director with a plaque and the players gave the director, caller and workers a round of applause. After that, the director took the microphone and thanked the girl, then turned to the players and thanked all of us for spending the dollars which they used to fund so

many groups in need.

It was a very nice little event that only took a few minutes, but I'm sure did a lot of good for the players and the volunteers in the hall. Like me, there were surely plenty of grumpy people there that night who were unhappy with their lack of winnings. But seeing that young girl representing her organization and expressing appreciation for the Bingo hall's—and our—support did so much to boost our spirits and remind us all what charity Bingo is for. — **E.G.**, **Texas**

What Older Diabetics Should Know About Coronavirus

Dear Savvy Senior,

My husband and I are both in our late sixties and have diabetes. We would like to find out if our diabetes increases our risk of getting the coronavirus. — **Concerned Diabetics**

Dear Concerned,

Currently, there's not enough data to show that people with diabetes are more likely to get coronavirus (COVID-19) than the general population. But if you do happen to contract the virus, your chance of developing serious complications are much higher. This is especially true if your

diabetes isn't well-controlled. Here's what you should know.

Diabetic Risks

Health data is showing that about 25 percent of people who go to the hospital with severe COVID-19 infections have diabetes. One reason is that high blood sugar weakens the immune system and makes it less able to fight off infections. Your risk of severe coronavirus infection is even higher if you also have another condition, like heart or lung disease.

If you do get COVID-19, the infection could also put you at greater risk for diabetes complications like diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA), which happens when high levels of acids called ketones build up in your blood.

Some people who catch the new coronavirus have a dangerous body-wide response to it, called sepsis. To treat sepsis, doctors need to manage your body's fluid and electrolyte levels. DKA causes you to lose electrolytes, which can make sepsis harder to control.

How to Avoid COVID-19

The best way to avoid getting

sick is to stay home as much as you can. If you have to go out, keep at least 6 feet away from other people, and wear a mask. And every time you come back from the supermarket, pharmacy or another public place, wash your hands with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds.

Also wash your hands before you give yourself a finger stick or insulin shot. Clean each site first with soap and water or rubbing alcohol.

To protect you, everyone in your house should wash their hands often, especially before they cook for the family. Don't share any utensils or other personal items. And if anyone in your house is sick, they should stay in their own room, as far as possible from you.

The CDC also recommends that you stock up on medications and diabetes testing supplies to last for at least a month. The same goes for grocery supplies and other household necessities.

Also know that Medicare is now covering the cost of telehealth visits, so if you have questions for your doctor, you can ask by video chat or phone instead of going into the office.

If You Get Sick

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are a dry cough, fever, shortness of breath, and sudden loss of the senses of taste and smell. If you develop any symptoms that are concerning, call your doctor about getting tested.

If you find that you have contracted COVID-19, the first level of care is to stay home and check your blood sugar more often than usual and check your ketones too. COVID-19 can reduce your appetite and cause you to eat less, which could affect your levels. You also need more fluids than usual when you're sick, so keep water close by, and drink it often.

You should also know that many over-the-counter medicines that relieve virus symptoms like fever or cough can affect your blood sugar levels one way or the other. So, before you take anything check with your doctor.

And be aware that if you start experiencing severe shortness of breath, high levels of ketones or DKA symptoms like severe weakness, body aches, vomiting or belly pain, you need to see your doctor or get to an emergency room right away.

In fact, Pollak played a memorable poker hand in the World Series of Poker Main Event back in 2012. It happened on Day 5 of the tournament with 134 players remaining. The hand

began when Kirill Rabtsov raised to 52,000 from under the gun and Omar Saeed called from the button.

Pollak, who had 369,000 in chips, reraised all in from the big blind. Rabtsov jammed over the top, and that inspired Saeed to get out of the way.

Pollak tabled Qd Qc, and Rabtsov had the same hand with Qh Qs.

There was a 95.7 percent chance of a split pot (also known as a "chop"), while each player had a mere 2.2 percent chance of winning outright. The only way that would happen was if the board offered four cards of the same suit to give one of the players a flush.

The Kc 9h Kh flop delivered two hearts, which meant Rabtsov was freerolling. He could make a flush if two more hearts came, while Pollak no longer had a chance to hit a flush. In other words, Rabtsov still had a chance to win the pot - albeit a mere 4.6 percent chance - while Pollak could only hope for a chop.

The 3h turn made things interesting, as Rabtsov saw his odds of making the flush jump to 20.5 percent. The math still favored a chopped pot, but in this particular hand, on poker's biggest stage, a bad beat was in store. The dealer burned one final time and put out the 2h on the river to give Rabtsov a winning flush. Pollak wound up busting out in 134th place for \$52,718 in prize money.


"When three hearts came, my heart sank to my shoes," Pollak said years later. "If you gotta go, you gotta go. That was my time to leave the tournament. You have to tell that story for forever."

With nearly \$70,000 in lifetime tournament earnings, Pollak

is one of the more successful and experienced poker-playing celebrities. Few have done as well in the WSOP Main Event as he did that year.

Even so, Pollak is still looking for that big breakout score - the sort that Hollywood royalty Ben Affleck and Jennifer Tilly enjoyed in years past. You may not be aware that Affleck won the 2004 California State Poker Championship for \$356,400, while Tilly captured a gold bracelet when she won the 2005 WSOP Ladies Event for \$158,335.






