Hello Junior Brangus Exhibitors and Families,

It is time again to get ready for the Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association show to be held at the **Brazos County Expo Center Complex**, **5827 Leonard Rd**, **Bryan TX**, on **May 31** thru **June 3**, **2023**. This show is a great time for lots of fun, family, and fellowship with all the juniors from across the state and nation as the show is open to Jr. Brangus exhibitors outside of Texas as well.

We will have an online entry and payment again this year. The goal is to open entries by the first week in April.

Contest entry will be a separate online entry which will be announced after entry deadline and prior to the show.

One change this year, we will be serving lunch only on Thursday and Friday and a box lunch on Saturday at the Expo Center to keep things easy and convenient. Meal tickets need to be purchased when you register at a cost of \$60 per person. That includes the awards ceremony Saturday at 6:30pm and the 3 lunches Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Additional awards ceremony tickets for the Saturday evening awards (6:30pm) are \$30 per person.

The Texas Invitational "Standard of Excellence (SOE) Show" will be held after the conclusion of the TJBBA show on Sunday, June 4th. Juniors are encouraged to, but not required to participate in the Texas Invitational. To be eligible to show in the SOE Show, all animals must be DNA or parent verified through the IBBA (just like the TJBBA show). The SOE Show and the TJBBA both follow the IBBA show rules. - 1. Exhibitors must be paid members of the Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association between the ages of 7 and 21 without having reached their 22nd birthday by January 1, 2023, to be eligible to exhibit AND to participate in all TJBBA contests.
- 2. All animals must be registered with the IBBA and <u>original</u> registration papers must be in the name of the junior exhibitor on or before <u>April 26, 2023</u>. 100% ownership in the name of the junior, on the registration papers, must be maintained throughout the exhibitor's career in junior events. No partnerships, co-owned, or co-op entries will be accepted. Also, **NO PENDING PAPERS** will be accepted. (See Animals Eligible for Registration)
- 3. Papers will be checked at the show and original registration papers must be presented.
- 4. Prior to check-in, heads of breeding animals must be clipped of all hair, including top knots, and be free of scurs and/or slick spots.
- 5. All animals must be shown by the individual in whose name the animal is registered unless the individual has more than one entry in a class. An exception to this requirement may be allowed upon approval by the advisory board for TJBBA members participating in a 4-H or FFA event. Exhibitors participating in the 4-H or FFA event may have their animals exhibited by another TJBBA member in good standing. A parent or guardian of the absent exhibitor must be present at the TJBBA State Show at the time of exhibition. A written request for this exception must be made to the TJBBA advisor **PRIOR** to the commencement of the State Show for approval.
- 6. An entry fee of \$40.00 per head per class must accompany each entry. Payment will be online by credit card by May 1, 2023.
- 7. All entries will be under the control and direction of the show superintendents/advisors. The IBBA, TBBA, and TJBAA will not be responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by an individual. He or she shall indemnify the above associations and organizations against all legal and other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as damage or injury to any other persons or property, caused by the exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited by the exhibitor or any of the animals entered.

- 8. There is no limit to the number of animals that may be entered by an exhibitor.
- 9. Persons making entries in the show shall agree to abide by all rules and regulations of the IBBA, IJBBA, TBBA, and TJBBA.
- 10. Owned Heifer classes and Bred and Owned Heifer classes will consist of females born on or after May 1, 2021. Owned Bull classes and Bred and Owned classes will consist of bulls born on or after May 1, 2020.
- 11. Bred and owned classes shall be limited to animals owned and bred solely by the junior exhibitor. The junior exhibitor must be the breeder and first and continuous owner of the animal entered. Breeder is defined as the owner of record of the dam at the time of service. First owner is defined as the owner of record of dam at the time the calf is born. The blacks and reds will each have separate shows in both Bred and Owned and Owned shows this year. NO BACK-DATING PAPERS WILL BE ALLOWED!
- 12. A Cow/Calf Pair Division will be offered. The calf at side must be the cow's natural calf (no ET calves) and not more than 255 days of age by show date. The calf must be registered with the IBBA. There will be two classes:

*Cows calved January 1, 2021 to April 30, 2021

*Cows calved December 31, 2020 and before.

13. **Percentage Show:** Heifers entered in this division will be at least 50% Brangus and must have at least one parent registered with the IBBA. An IBBA certificate must be presented at checkin verifying that they have at least one registered parent. This show will only be open heifers born after May 1, 2021. (Contact the IBBA office for information on obtaining certificates. **Ownership deadlines will apply.**)

ENTRY DEADLINE IS MAY 1, 2023

- 14. All cattle entries will be listed in the program in order of age from youngest to oldest. Individual classes will be divided based on the number of entries. No class will be larger than 10 head.
- 15. Barn facilities will be available Wednesday, May 31, 2023 at 8:00 AM. NO ANIMALS OR EQUIPMENT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN BEFORE THIS TIME!
- 16. Cattle check-in will be 5:00 pm to 7 pm on Wednesday May 31, 2023.
- 17. Entries must be in place by 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday May 31, 2023.
- 18. RV and Trailer hookups are available. Please contact the Brazos County Expo Complex (979-823-3976) for more information and pricing.
- 19. The exhibitor is responsible for the feeding and care of his or her animals. Each exhibitor is responsible for keeping his or her stall area clean at all times.
- 20. Sullivan Show Supply will be on site during the State Show for all show supply needs. You may view their website at www.sullivanshowsupply.com.

- 21. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within thirty (30) days and registration papers will be required on all animals. These documents will be checked beginning at 5:00 pm on May 31, 2023. Females 20 months of age and older MUST have a certificate of pregnancy. All bulls 15 months and older must have fertility examination papers.
- 22. Exhibitors unable to handle or control their cattle will not be allowed to show.
- 23. Entries will be released after the conclusion of the show. Any exhibitor not in attendance for the awards program on Saturday, June 3, 2023, WILL FORFEIT ALL AWARDS.
- 24. Meal tickets can be purchased for the week at \$60 per person and this will include lunch served Thursday and Friday and a box lunch on Saturday plus the awards ceremony on Saturday. Exhibitors who wish not to purchase the full week meal ticket may purchase the Saturday award ceremony meal for \$30 per person.
- 25. All exhibitors will be required to wear the official 2023 TJBBA show T-shirt during the owned show on Saturday, June 3, 2023. Each exhibitor will be provided with one T-shirt at no cost. Additional T-shirts may be purchased at \$20.00 each. At the time of entry, please indicate the number of T-shirts being purchased and the sizes for each shirt. If the exhibitor is attending the 2023 National Junior Brangus Breeders Show in Chickasha, Oklahoma in June, please be sure to take your 2023 TJBBA T-shirt with you to be worn during the opening ceremonies.
- 26. If you need to purchase additional stalls within the barn stalling area please mark the online entry form accordingly so that we can be sure to try to accommodate your needs.
- 27. Shavings may be purchased from the shavings office at the Brazos County Expo Center, or you may bring your own. There are no restrictions on shavings this year. The \$10 per head cleaning fee charged by the Expo has been added into the TJBBA entry fee this year.
- 28. **Tie Outs:** Tie outs will be available. Exhibitors are responsible for supplying your own bedding for your ties outs. The Expo has NOT had straw available in the past.
- 29. Pens: Please contact Gina Gill @ 903-754-6791 for more information on obtaining pens. Pens MUST BE PAID upon arrival. NO EXECPTIONS. Pens differ in price depending on size and location.

NEW THIS YEAR!

Steer Show

STEER Show THE TJBBA STEER SHOW WILL BE OPEN TO: Brangus, Red Brangus, Ultrablack, Ultrared, or any Percentage steer. Percentage animals must be at least 50% Brangus, Red Brangus, or Ultra Genetics. ALL STEERS must be DNA Parent Verified by the time of check in to prove they are at least 50% Registered Brangus, Red Brangus, or Ultra Genetics.

GUIDELINES FOR THE TJBBA STEER SHOW

- Steers must weigh in at the assigned time for steer weigh in on the TJBBA Schedule.
- Steers will be split into two divisions prospect and progress. Steers less than 1,000 pounds will show in the prospect division and steers over 1,000 pounds will show in the progress division.
- Class winners in the prospect division will be selected for Champion and Reserve Champion Prospect Steer.
- Class winners in the Progress division will be selected for Champion and Reserve Champion Progress Steer.

SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TJBBA STEER SHOW

- 1. Owner of record on all steers entered in the Steer Show must be active members of the TJBBA in good standing.
- 2. All animals must be registered with the IBBA and original registration papers must in the name of the junior exhibitor. The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
- 3. The registration number, permanent animal identification number (brand or tattoo), birth date and at least one registered Brangus, Red Brangus, or Ultra parent must be listed on the entry form.
- 4. All steers showing at the TJBBA must be polled or dehorned/free of horns. Slick spots are permitted.
- 5. Prior to check in, heads of the animals must be clipped of all hair, including top knots.
- 6. No steer may be shown that has been artificially filled with any amount of liquid at any time once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The individual involved with an animal being artificially filled will be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that particular show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids orally, if so needed without disqualifying animal(s) from exhibition.
- 7. All animals must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification except for the grooming and treatment of the hair and trimming of the hooves. No graphite, hair, cotton twine, etc. may be applied. Tail ties and hairness used on the tail and switch are the only exceptions.
- 8. DNA parent verification is required on the Brangus side of the pedigree prior to check-in.

Paint allowed in Junior Show only. The Texas Invitational Open Show on Sunday does NOT allow paint.

All animals must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification except for the grooming and treatment of hair and trimming of hoofs. NO powder,

graphite, hair, cotton twine, etc. may be applied. Tail ties and hairness used on the tail and switch are the only exception.

NEW CLASS BREAKS

New Class Breaks for Junior and Senior Heifer and Bull Calves Born September 1 and AFTER (All Show as 1 division) "Calf Division".

All Cattle born September 1st and after will be weighed and classed according to **weight**. Official weights will be taken the day prior to the show, by the Show Committee.

There will be three different weigh periods, the day before the B&O show, the owned show, and the Futurity Show. Animals will weigh according to when their first show is. For example, if an animal is showing the B&O or Percentage show then they will weigh the afternoon before that show and do not have to weigh again, but Futurity only cattle will weigh the day before the Futurity show. Cattle cannot weigh early.

Breaking Classes:

- Cattle will be shown as one division and labeled as the "Calf Division"
- The first class will be cattle less than 400 lbs
- There will be no more than a 50 lb variance within a class (with the exception of class 1)
- Maximum of 10 hd per class
- A group of 3 show committee members will break the classes
- The WDA along with DOB will be written on weight cards and displayed on back of show harness. Scrotal Circumference will also be provided on bulls.
- **It's the exhibitor's responsibility to get cattle on the scale at posted weigh in time.-

ALL CONTEST PARTICIPANTS MUST BE A CURRENT TJBBA MEMBER AS OF JUNE 1, 2023

<u>Team Fitting Contest</u>....-not for points in all-around-This contest will be open to any current TJBBA member, whose dues are paid for 2023.

Teams will consist of <u>three</u> members from <u>different age groups</u>. Novice (7-10), Junior (11-13), Intermediate (14-16) and Senior (17-21). Novice, Junior and Intermediate participants may only compete on one team. Seniors may compete on a maximum of 2 teams.

Teams of 3 exhibitors and you get to pick your own team members. If you don't have a team, but would like to participate, please let a TJBBA board member or Advisor know at Contest Checkin Wednesday Evening and we will help put you with a team.

- 1) Each team will be responsible for bringing a heifer to use in the competition. Heifers are not to be groomed; but, should be washed and dried. Animals will be checked before entering the competition area.
- 2) Each team must provide their own fitting equipment. Once the contest begins, no team member may leave the area and no additional equipment may be brought into the fitting area where chutes will be provided for the teams.
- 3) All team members and fitting equipment must be in place at least 5 minutes prior to the announced starting of the contest.
- 4) Each team will be allowed 15 minutes to fit their animal. IN HEATS ONLY ONE SIDE WILL BE FIITTED SO THAT DURING FINALS THE OTHER SIDE CAN BE FITTED.
- 5) Each team member must fit, use the clippers and blower.
- 6) All fitting and grooming techniques must be within the accepted practices of the Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association and the International Junior Brangus Breeders Association.

- 7) Once the animal has been groomed and time is called, one member from each team will take the animal from the chute for the judges to select the teams to go forward to the final round.
- 8) Judging will take place from a panel of 2 judges. The contest will be assessed at a total of 50 points. Points will be awarded as follows:
 - Ability to Fit—20 points
 - Organization of Supplies & Equipment—5 points
 - Participation of Each Team Member—20 points
 - Overall Effect—5 points
- 9) Judges will place their top three teams and the winners will be announced at the awards banquet.
- 10) Additional information on the team fitting contest will be provided at Opening Ceremonies.

NEW THIS YEAR The Senior division will be Extemporaneous. They will be given a topic and have 30 minutes to prepare and use a maximum of 3- 3x5 note cards. Senior Speech must be a minimum of 2 minutes and a maximum of 6. Contestants in each division will draw for the order

in which the speeches will be presented to the judges. Note cards are allowed. Junior and Intermediate division contestants will not have a limit on the number of note cards they use. Excessive reference to note cards may result in deductions from a contestant's overall score. Judges will be furnished with a typewritten copy of the contestant's speech. Judges will be allowed to ask questions. A timekeeper will record the time used by each contestant in delivering the speech, noting under and over time, if any, for which deductions will be made. **Typed speeches will be collected at contest check-in.**

Skillathon_....-for points in all-around

Divisions: Novice (Age 7-10), Junior (Age 11-13), Intermediate (Age 14-16), Senior (Age17-21)

Description: The Skill-A-Thon contest is a written contest in which TJBBA members between 7 and 21. Questions will range from general Brangus to general agriculture information. Contestants will go from station to station answering the questions on their answer form. There will be different question sets for each of the age divisions. These question sets will vary in knowledge level and skills proficiency depending upon the age division and all age divisions will be ran simultaneously.

Study guide: San Antonio study guide and general Brangus knowledge. https://beefskillathon.tamu.edu/

Rules: If entries do not meet the following requirements, they will be disqualified, and scoresheets will not be graded.

- •No talking between participants is allowed in the Skill-A-Thon area.
- •Participants may quietly ask their table monitors questions on clarification of instructions only.
- •Participants will be given a time limit at each station. Time will be announced by the moderator.
- •When the moderator calls time, participants must move to the next station. No one can advance before time is called.
- •Participants may ask table monitors to read questions or parts of questions for them.
- •All equipment and materials must remain at the station. You may NOT handle materials and equipment.
- •Scoresheets must be clearly marked, and writing must be legible.

Evaluation Criteria: Scoresheets will be graded with tiebreaker questions tallied only in the event of a tie.

All-Around Champion Competition

At the 2023 Texas Junior Brangus Breeders State Show, points will be tabulated in four (4) major event categories to determine an All-Around Champion in each of the divisions: *Novice* (7-10), *Junior* (11-13). *Intermediate* (14-16), *Senior* (17-21). Each contestant must compete in all five (5) of the events listed below to qualify for the All-Around competition. The five (5) events are as follows:

- *Showmanship
- *Photography
- *Public Speaking
- *Highest Placing Animal Exhibited
- *Skillathon

Points will be awarded on the first five (5) placings in each of the four (4) events:

Grand and Reserve Champions in the show ring competition will be awarded extra points. Grand Champions will receive an extra ten (10) points. Reserve Champions will receive an extra five (5) points. In the show ring competition, points will be calculated on a contestants' highest placing animal regardless of how many he or she exhibits.

Queen and Sweetheart Contest

The TJBBA Queen and Sweetheart contests are open to all female members of the TJBBA who have paid dues for 2023. Contestants must also be current residents of Texas. Queen contestants must be 14-21 years of age, and Sweetheart contestants must be 10-13 years of age. All ages are as of January 1, 2023. Both Sweetheart and Queen will be required to attend Ft. Worth and Houston Livestock Shows (show day only if not participating) and the TJBBA State Show in 2023.

Applications must be returned by the <u>Cattle Entry Deadline, May 1, 2023</u>. Each Queen and Sweetheart contestant must prepare (and bring to Bryan) a scrapbook that includes pictures and clippings of all activities in which she is involved in. Please bring a color **8"x10" framed** photo to be placed on display. All contestants will be interviewed on **Wednesday, May 31, 2023**, by an impartial panel of judges. New this year--<u>Contestants will be ranked 1,2,3,4,5 as follows:</u>

Voting takes place by secret ballot at the general membership meeting of the TJBBA at the State Show. Only current TJBBA members are allowed to vote.

TJBBA Director Applications

Director applicants are required to be at least 13 years of age as of January 1, 2023. Applicants must have participated in at least one (1) TJBBA State Show prior to the 2023 State Show. The election of three (3) new directors, each of whom will serve a three-year term, will take place at the general membership meeting of the TJBBA on Thursday, June 1, 2023. Current paid members of the TJBBA, who are residents of the state of Texas, **MUST** return an application by the **Cattle Entry Deadline**, **May 1**, 2023, if interested in applying for the board.

Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association Director Duties & Responsibilities Commitment Agreement

Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association Directors are required to read the following agreement outlining the requirements of the directors and officers and recognizing said officer's and director's commitment to fulfill their outlined duties as stated in the TJBBA Constitution.

- Each **Director** will be responsible for acting in an appropriate behavior at all TJBBA activities and for setting an example for others to follow (Ex: No profanity. No underage drinking. No tobacco products.)
- Each **Director** will adhere to the dress code set out by the Board of Directors.
- Each **Director** will be responsible for obtaining award sponsors for shows designated by the TJBBA Advisors.
- Each **Director** will be responsible for selling the minimum number of \$2000 in ads for the TJBBA Show Program.
- Each **Director** will attend all board meetings held throughout the year as well as others so designated. If unable to attend the President and Adult Advisors **MUST** be contacted in writing prior to the meeting. If two (2) meetings within one (1) year (starting with the state show and ending with the state show) are missed, the director will be subject to dismissal from the Board of Directors by a 2/3 vote.
- Each **Director** will serve as a member service representative for ALL members of the Texas Junior Brangus Breeders Association and communicate with interested junior breeders in their area.
- Each **Director** will strive to improve and strengthen the entire organization through leadership development and personal goals by participation in as many beneficial opportunities that are available.
- Each **Director** is expected to actively participate and voice his or her opinion during board meetings and contribute **positively** to discussion being held.
- Each **Director** is responsible for keeping an open channel of communication between other directors. Board members are urged to communicate with adult advisors and other directors at least once a month
- Each **Director** will be responsible for obtaining a navy blazer, white button-up shirt, and khaki pants. These will be worn to major Brangus functions and in the show ring during major shows.
