ORDINANCE NO: 2015-35

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2015-12 KNOWN AS THE HEALTH AND SANITATION REGULATIONS, ESTABLISHING THE CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE MAINTENANCE OF LOTS AND FOOD AND FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE CITY OF SANDY OAKS, TEXAS AND PROMOTING THE HEALTH SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF SANDY OAKS, TEXAS; SETTING FORTH THE PURPOSE; DEFINITIONS; ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES FOR AMENDMENTS AND VARIATIONS; ESTABLISHING STANDARDS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION; AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Sandy Oaks seeks to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community by preventing death, injuries and property damage within the city limits; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sandy Oaks finds the need to maintain the surrounding environment of the City and protect the citizens of Sandy Oaks in regards to sanitation of the food and food establishments by adopting these provisions; and.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Chapter 342, subchapters A and B, Texas Health and Safety Code, the City may promote health, safety, morals and general welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sandy Oaks ("City") adopted Ordinance No. 2015-12 to promote health, safety and general welfare of the community by establishing Health and Sanitation Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the Ordinance 2015-12 to include regulations for the time for placement of trash receptacles within the City and prohibit the burning of trash and hazardous waste within the City.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANDY OAKS, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: DECLARING AMENDMENT. That from and after the passage and effective date of this Ordinance, Ordinance 2015-12 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2: TITLE. These rules and regulations shall be known as the "Health and Sanitation Regulations" of the City of Sandy Oaks, Texas."

SECTION 3. AUTHORITY. This ordinance is prepared under the Authority of Chapter 342, Subchapters A and B, Texas Health and Safety Code, to promote health, safety, morals, and the general welfare of the community.
