Alpha and Omega

In considering the words Alpha and Omega, let us find from where they originate. Alpha, the first word of the Greek alphabet, with Omega, the last letter, are used in the Old and New Testament to express the eternity of God. Including both the beginning and the end. Rev. 1:8, Rev. 22:13. These letters became a favorite symbol of the eternal divinity of our Lord. Alpha and Omega are used metaphorically to denote the beginning and end of anything.

When we consider Jesus as the beginning and the ending, the first and last, let us think when was the beginning. No one knows when this beginning started—no record is given either by sectoral history or by the Bible. In Gen. 1:2 we find, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth, and the earth was without form and void," yet it doesn't say when that took place. The Apostle Paul's description of Jesus says "He lived and was before all things." Col. 1:15, 16, 17, "Who is the image of the invisible God, the first born of every creature. For by Him were all things created that are in Heaven, and that are in Visible and invisible, Earth. whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers. All things were created by Him, and for Him, and He is before all things, and by Him all things consist.

Jesus alone can bear witness to a knowledge of pre-existence before He left the throne of God to come down to this earth full of sin to put on His fleshly body. In putting on this body of flesh, He became, God manifested in the flesh. Jesus was with God in the beginning, when He came to earth it was not to do His own will but the will of His Father. Heb. 10:9 "Lo, I come to do thy will, O God." Also in John 5:36 "For the works, which the Father hath given Me to finish, the same works that I do bear witness of Me, that the Father hath sent Me."

Was not the life of our Lord one of continuous manifestations

of Divine God given power over all diseases, and infirmities; meeting the every need of the masses of suffering humanity. Healing the sick, even stopping the funeral procession by placing His hand on the bier and the dead was raised to life. He spoke and the winds and sea obeyed His voice. His entire life was a ministry of good will and love to all humanity. The Chief Priests and Pharisees, looked upon Jesus' life as a failure as the great men of today do, but even down to His ignominous death we see victory and power and after two thousand years when all His contemporaries have passed away, and are forgotten, His life stands out among men and within men as the inspiration of all love and all goodness. Surely the greatness of God was manifested in

In John 8:56, 58 we have a fitting testimony of Jesus as the Alpha who was before all things. Jesus said "Before Abraham was I am. In John 17:5 "Glorify thou Me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was." Also in St. John 1:1 and 14 we find in the beginning the word was with God then the word was made flesh and dwelt among us. In going back in the old Bible, Prov. 8:22, 36 a passage of scripture that gives us the life of Jesus before He came to put on His earthly body. "The Lord possessed Me in the beginning of His way, before His works of old. I was set up from everlasting from the beginning, or ever



the earth was. When there were no depths. I was brought forth; when there were no fountains abounding with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills was I brought forth while as yet He had not made the earth, nor the fields nor the highest part of the dust of the world. When He prepared the heavens, I was there, when He set a compass upon the face of the depth. When He established the clouds above, when He strengthened the fountains of the deep. When He gave to the sea His decree that the waters should not pass His commandant; when He appointed the foundations of the earth; then I was by Him, as one brought up with Him; and I was daily His delight; rejoicing always before Him.'

THE WORD OF GOD MADE FLESH

John 1:1. In the beginning the word of God was with God, then in verse 14, and the word was made flesh and dwelt among us. (And we beheld His glory, the glory of the only begotten of the Father.) Full of grace and truth. Jesus being born of the virgin Mary, the incarnation of God in the flesh. Those words spoken by the angel to Mary in Luke 1:28-38 constitute one of the most sublime portions of God's Holy Word.

The birth of Jesus was not to absorb the divine into the human, but rather a combination of the human with the divine. He was human, yet He was the divine Son of God. Jesus was the seed of the woman, but was untainted by the tendency to go astray from God, He always did the will of God. Bringing His human manhood into absolute subjection to the whole will of God.

NAMED BEFORE BIRTH

Thou shall call His name Jesus. For He shall save His people from their sins, Matt. 1:21. God gave His Son the name Jesus. The Hebrew word Jesus means Saviour, Christ means the anointed of God. Jesus Christ—Saviour anointed of God. Isaiah prophesied the coming of the Saviour, he said, they shall

Whet the Edge

For a text let us read Ecclesiastes 10:10. "If the iron be blunt, and he do not WHET THE EDGE, then must he put to more strength: but wisdom is profitable to direct."

The preacher here has given us a beautiful picture of what to expect when a professor of Christianity fails to keep prayed up monthly, yea daily, yes and even momentarily.

We are acquainted with the axe and its use. This instrument is designed primarily for the purpose of cutting wood for fuel, construction and the progress of man. On the other side an axe can be very destructive. Someone not accustomed to using one can mar a log by not cutting it properly, that otherwise could be used in constructing something useful and pretty; also severely cut themselves or others. May the Ruler of the niverse help us to use the axe, slunt or whetted, in construction, not destruction. A few years ago I was cutting wood and posts in the cedars. Rocks were everywhere and I could sharpen my axe to a razor edge, yet just one miscue into a rock and the edge was blunted. The Master uses us today as axes to build a spiritual house. Not that we should harm one another but that the hewing and cutting should form us so we can be fit together in a beautiful building, showing forth the Glory of His Majesty. I noticed as I went on cutting, without whetting the edge after striking those rocks,

it left a mark on the wood everytime I struck the wood and wasn't cutting near as easy as before the gap was there. May the God of Heaven help us to "whet the edge" and not leave marks to mar our work of progress in this race of life. My, how truly the preacher spoke when he mentioned, "he must put to more strength if the iron be blunt." You and I can plainly see that fact. People work very hard and seem to get nowhere. Master help us to "whet the edge." How much more we could accomplish for the Gospel with the edge sharp and the same effort.

Now comes the question, "How can I whet the edge?" Beloved PRAY THROUGH. This is the only answer as far as I am concerned. Obtain that marvelous Power, not of man, not by men, not by one's own goodness, but by the allowing of Christ to become supreme in our life that self may decrease and Christ may increase. "But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provisions for the flesh to fulfill the lusts thereof." Romans 13:14.

I don't say these things to bemean anyone but rather that we may find an avenue, in more of Christ and less of self, to do more for HIM who gave His all for us.

The last portion of our text says, "But wisdom is profitable to direct." Then Lord administer to us wisdom. "If any man lack wisdom let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally and up-

braideth not: and it shall be given him." James 1:4. Help us Jesus to let wisdom direct and may we keep prayed through and the edge whetted. People by the thousands are away from Christ, wasting their lives in sin and wrong living. Many a life will be wrecked on the rock strewn coast of sins finished product. Are you and I going to fail to accept the challenge thrown at us and not "whet the edge?" Man is weak and his efforts meager but the Power of Christ through us can help our fellowmen. Peter said to the beggar, "Silver and gold have we none, but such as we have, in the name of Jesus arise and walk." In 1st Corinthians 9:25-27 Paul leaves us a beautiful picture if we desire to be among the best Christians, run a good race, help our fellowmen, and gain the crown of life. "And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly: so fight I, not as one that beateth the air; but I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.'





How To Kill A Church

Killing people is a crime; but "killing" a church seems to have become the Christian's avocation.

To murder anyone means to put him out of existence, in so far as life and usefulness in this world are concerned. And this is just what many people are guilty of doing with churches. They do not mean to harm such centers of spiritual culture, nevertheless, they are responsible for their slow death.

Here are some recipes for killing a church, but may we avoid them as we would a loathesome pestilence!!

Do not go to church, at least, if you do, do not go twice on Sunday, especially if you are healthy and able to have no legitimate excuse for being a "oncer." Surely 1½ hours out of 168 making a

week, are enough to give to religion!

If you do go to church, whatever you do, go late. You see, it is only a church and does not matter. Of course, at your office or work, punctuality is necessary. But with a church, well, you can saunter in just when you like. Fifteen minutes behind time is a mere trifle.

Whenever you go, be careful to go with a gripe. Make up your mind to be unpleasant and have an unpleasant time. Determine that there will be plenty to grumble about in the tempo of the singing, or in the preaching.

When you go, and have chosen your seat at the end of a pew, whatever you do, allow no one to dislodge you. When others want to share the pew, don't move along, that is too much bother.

Let others have the inconvenience.

Once you are in a service, do not commence with a silent prayer asking that your soul may be blessed. Rather say to yourself, "What is the use of coming here?" Let it be evident, to yourself anyhow, that you are only in church because, for decency's sake, it is the correct thing to do.

If you are a member of any place of worship, never accept of-fice. Stand aloof and criticize those who do. Let your attitude be, "There is always so much work for me to do outside the church, that I have no time for religious activities."

And, whatever you do, never pay in advance for your religion. Wait until you get your money's worth, and then wait a bit longer.

Of course, it is necessary to pay in advance for a football ticket or theatre ticket, but church dues are

not so important.

See to it that you never encourage the preacher. If you do happen to like a sermon he preaches, say nothing about it. Many a preacher has been ruined by flattery. Do not let your minister run that risk, or else his blood may be upon your head. Such a responsibility is too terrible to contemplate.

Never hesitate to tell the preacher's failings to any strangers who drop in. You see, they might be a long time finding them out.

And if the church you sometimes attend appears to be harmonious, without any contribution on your part to its unity, call it apathy or indifference or lack of zeal or anything under the sun

except what it is.

If there happens to be a few zealous workers around make a tremendous protest against the church being run by a clique. Let it be nown that you feel that people should never take religion too seriously. Over a baseball game, we are expected to show some enthusiasm, but religion should be taken moderately.

All the above "recipes" need no further comment. They express some of the reaction we encounter as we keep our eyes and ears open. May we be found among the number who can say, "I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord"! God grant us grace to kill everything detrimental to true church life and work! Individually and collectively, may we strive to make the church we represent a greater spiritual force in this churchless age of ours.

Text. Heb. 10:37. "For yet a posed every commandment, promlittle while, and He that shall ise, and work of God, Christ, and come will come, and will not the Holy people of God. The devil doesn't know the day, nor

This precious promise of the return of Jesus, was no doubt given, as a message of hope, cheer, and comfort for the people of God to stand on and abide in during the time of trouble, sorrow, falling away, and the period of perplexity and confusion that is to precede the return of Jesus.

Some modern Orthodox Churches teach that the world is getting better all the time, and that finally through their Creeds the world will be educated to their ideas of religion and then Jesus will come back to dwell with the world, thus taught in their ways.

Let us settle this once and for all. "The world is not getting better, its people in general are not better, its ideas are not better, knowledge has been increased, but not the knowledge of God to the average person, for true religion is hid from the wise and prudent. The Orthodox religious world have rejected the great truths of the Gospel, turned their back on the whole Armour of God, and today are seen in Apostacy rejecting the promises of Christ, ready to compromise with sin, make a covenant with death and yield themselves to satan. Don't look for a revival of true Christianity amidst any churches or federation of churches, council of churches or any body of people that denies the Power of God to transform the lives of sinful men or deny the Power of God to sanctify and purify the hearts and souls of men or that teach against the experience of Divine Healing and the Baptism of the Holy Ghost and the other fundamental Doctrines of Jesus Christ.

Why is the world to see such a terrible time of trouble, confusion in religion, perplexity, and distress just preceding the return of Christ? Why is the sea and the waves to roar? Why is Hell to rage? Why is satan to work with all power, signs, and living wonders? From the foundation of the world satan has fought and op-

Report From Alaska

Every letter we receive from friends of the faith is a thrill to us here in Alaska. Mail means so much.

The paper was received sometime back and it was a real blessing to us. I, for one appreciate the paper more than ever. It helps us keep up with our co-laborers in the Lord that we do not hear directly from. May God bless and prosper the paper in every way.

We appreciate very much the missionary offerings from the churches that were sent to us.

On the small building we plan to use for Sunday School and Church, we seem to have come to a standstill on it for several reasons. Hope to get started back on it soon and have it ready about November 1 for Sunday School and Church. We are very anxious to get started in regular services.

God continues to bless in every field of endeavor up here. We have more invitations for services than we have been able to fill lately. Brother Bob Palmer has brought a series of three lessons on the Coming of the Lord at one of the churches in Palmer. We are to have services at two children's homes as soon as we can get to them. We find out more every day the class of people that our broadcast reaches. It is a thrill for men to tell us that never darken any church that they enjoy the broadcast.

Brother Leonard Turner and I flew over to Talkeetna to get him some wood. We were rained in for several days. Talkeetna is a real sourdough town. It is about 70 miles off the road. Some of the gold miners came down out of the hills for the winter while we were there. We sat around the fire out of the rain and listened to their tales. It was really interesting. Every night as we got into our sleeping bags and went to sleep it . was to the howl of husky male mute sled dogs all around at the houses of the town and we woke

up to the same tune. It sure was lonesome.

Most of the people there are either trappers or miners, although the C. A. A. has an airfield and control town with six families there.

Brother Turner and family plan to move soon. It will be real mission work in the raw, all of our people should hold them up in prayer. His plane will be a real blessing as it will give a contact with the outside world. If storms, etc., do not hinder, they will get their mail once a week. A small rail line runs through the town.

Talkeetna is around 30 years old and as far as we can find out never had a church. The kids there think Jesus Christ and God are just some more good curse words. A lot of the white men have native wives and there are a lot of half-breed children. I feel if those children can be taught about Christ it will be worth all the hardships.

We will probably be moving to Anchorage before long. We love our place up here, and rent will be very high there, but in order to keep the broadcast going we must get to town. We feel we want the good news to keep on the air at any cost.

Rev. Algernon Benona Stanberry of Katy, Texas, was born and reared in the State of Missouri, and passed away Wednesday, October 8, 1947, at the age of 79 vears. Rev. Stanberry entered the ministry when a young man, and served for 62 years in active religious work, giving his full time to the ministry. Early in life he did evangelistic work in many states, his brother O. O.
