the fourth day - sharing and perspectives

Whether we know it or not, each of us has a "rule of life." Simply stated, a rule of life is just that...a practice or a belief that rules how we spend our lives.

At times, urgency may rule our lives, with its accompanying sense of overwhelming stress that leaves us emotionally and physically depleted at the end of the day. These can be times when we neglect the care of our bodies and those who are most important to us, including our spouses and children.

At other times, the rule of life may be desire for the things and habits that do not ultimately bring satisfaction, but becomes a kind of addiction that is almost impossible to break. This "rule" deceives and destroys, whether it is addiction to substances, other people, or money.

The only rule of life that leads to wholeness, fulfillment, joy and peace is the one found in spiritual practice. Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord our God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind...and You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 23:34-40) Finding ways to live this rule in the midst of the daily struggles we face is the challenge that you and I have to confront intentionally and diligently. It means always keeping our minds and hearts alert to what God may be doing in the tasks and people that cross our paths. It means discerning the urgent from the important, and making sure that our choices are always filtered through love.

Perhaps the one part of Jesus' great commandment that I too often forget is the last part about loving others as I love myself. Often my "rule for life" forgets that I too, am loved by God, and therefore I must love myself by taking care of myself. Many more times than I would like to admit, I do not attend to this loving task, and I end up wasted and spent, and therefore unable to live with the joy and peace that God wants for me and for others through me.

Today, I ask for God to remind me that loving God, others and myself is my rule of life. I ask for opportunities to be intentional about expressing that rule today. How about you?

Jesus Jesus ... Can I Tell You How I Feel, You Have Given Me Your Spirit ... I Love You So

Jesus commissioned believers to continue His work on earth—sharing the good news about God the Father's saving grace (Matt. 28:19). Following this command isn't easy when we come across people whose lifestyle is distasteful to us. It often feels more convenient to befriend someone who shares our values. Yet a lost man or woman may be led to restoration through a Christian friend or acquaintance.

Jesus got involved with men and women whom society avoided. He ate dinner with tax collectors (<u>Matt. 9:10; Luke</u> <u>19:5</u>) and gently spoke His message of hope to an adulterous woman (John 4:7-<u>27</u>). And to anyone—disciple or Pharisee—shocked by His associations, the Lord explained that He "did not come to call the righteous, but sinners" (<u>Mark 2:17</u>).

In Proverbs 29:6, sin is compared to a trap that ensnares its victim. With despair and confusion as constant companions, the captive doesn't know the way to freedom. But believers do. And we are to share the message as Jesus did: "You who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness" (Gal. 6:1). The Greek word for "restore" refers to the setting of I bones—a very painful process. So we are to tenderly point men and women I in the direction of God's forgiveness, His mercy toward wrongdoers, and the Holy Spirit's help in overcoming temptation.

If Jesus were on earth today, He'd be ministering to the needy, the addicted, and the downtrodden. To be like Him, let's encourage others to confront their sin so they can be freed from its grasp. Charles Stanley
