With concurrence of the members present, the District Meeting of the members of Arizona Republican Legislative District 23, held at Fountain Hills School District, Learning Center, 16000 E. Palisades, Fountain Hills, was called to order at 7:01 pm by Chairman Joe Meli. There were 90 PCs and guests signed in for the meeting. The Invocation was given by Dr. C.T. Wright.

The singing of God Bless America was led by Judy Rutkowski.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Arch McGill.

All elected officials present were introduced.

The meeting began with the House of Representatives Candidate Forum moderated by 2nd Vice Chair Rich Rutkowski. Candidates participating were Michelle Ugenti, Jay Lawrence, Effie Carlson and Bob Littlefield. A period of Q&A followed candidate self-introductions and the forum concluded with candidate closing statements.

The business meeting followed the forum.

Minutes, Lynne Breyer

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented. With no discussion, the motion passed.

Chairman's Business, Joe Meli

Joe thanked Marilyn Byerly for taking the AZGOP badge photos last month.

Joe asked the assembly, "Why are we here tonight? We are here for one purpose only as PCs and that is to get our Republicans elected." Joe spoke about Congressman Schweikert's view that the PCs are the most important part of the Republican party with the power to defeat the Democrats and their personal attacks on Republicans. Schweikert said, "I beg you: do not engage in the partisan bickering inside the party. Be it among candidates. Be it among PCs. Because if we do this, we essentially aid the left. Do not engage in the destruction of character inside the party" and serve the party to do the job we are charged to do. The

assembly, by voice vote, agreed in answer to Joe's question if this LD was ready and willing to do that. Our number one priority as PCs is to win elections for Republicans and that is what we must focus on doing. We need to serve the Party!

First Vice Chair, Nancy Ordowski

Nancy announced that voters often leave the state for cooler weather and we need, we want, them to vote. It is against state law to forward early ballots. If anyone knows of voters who will be leaving the state and won't be in the state to vote in the Primary, they can do the following and we will put this out on Constant Contact for you to have it in writing:

1) They have to write a letter to the Maricopa Election Department with their name, their address and their voter ID requesting the ballot be sent to a temporary address. It must be signed. It has to be sent to the attention of Kristi Pasarelli at the County Offices, 111 S. Third or 510 S. Third Ave, Phoenix. You should not use the mailed cards that we got in the mail as that will provide a permanent address change.

Nancy has been working with AZGOP to get i360 set for our district. Training is set for Area Directors and Precinct Captains. Area Directors are to be working with their Precinct Captains and Precinct Captains are to be working with their PCs. Training session is Thursday, June 19, 6:00-8:00 pm, Mustang Library Conference Room. Come prepared with smart phone or tablet if you have them. Call PCs to know how they want to use i360. They have tried to make it as user friendly for our PCs as possible. It's an easy program to use and it gives us the tools to elect our Republican candidates.

Second Vice Chair, Rich Rutkowski

Joe introduced Rich by saying he has done a fabulous job with all the forums and candidates. Rich also thanked Marilyn Byerly for doing a great job with the photography for the AZGOP badges. The July 10th meeting location is still to be determined. Watch for an announcement on that. The program will be the LD23 State Senate candidates, Rep. John Kavanagh and Jeff Schwartz. Andrew Walter, candidate for Congress in CD9 and perhaps one more candidate are expected to participate, pending confirmation.

Vote to accept the 2014 Budget:

The previous board did not make a budget in October 2013 as required by the Bylaws so Gayla had to start with January financials going forward through May using actuals and budgeting the remainder of the year through 2014. It is easy to see based on the variance column where the district is at any given time during the year. The Balance Sheet is also a part of the financials. Discussion was held. A motion was made and seconded to pass the budget. The motion passed.

New Business

1) Joe Meli discussed the recent Executive Guidance Council (EGC) meeting - In attendance were Joe Meli, Nancy Ordowski and Rich Rutkowski. Joe delivered a report on what occurred in that meeting. There was a discussion on spending our efforts on CD9 to unseat Democrat Kyrsten Sinema, which is considered by Congressman Schweikert and LD23 Leadership to be vital. Everyone is asked to participate in the effort to support one of the two candidates in the Primary and the Republican nominee in the general since LD23 does not have a contested Congressional race.

A straw poll was taken: Doug Little placed 1st in the election for ACC. Clean elections forms are in the lobby. Doug still needs \$5s and would appreciate help from our PCs.

2) Water Issue, Nancy Ordowski

Nancy attended a meeting at the Capitol in a Senate Hearing Room. Congressmen Schweikert, Gosar, Salmon and Franks were in attendance along with Congressman Lamar Smith from Texas. A panel of 9 individuals spoke from the realty board, ranchers associations, Arizona water projects and other organizations. The EPA has a clean water act in place and now they have a proposed change to take over more water in places like dry washes, ditches, water remaining in gravel pits after rain. For people whose homes back up to a dry wash who put dirt in that wash, they can be fined. Businesses of all kinds, including ranchers, will need to apply for a federal permit to use the water. Anyone caught using that water without a permit, will be fined \$37,500 per day per incident. Ranchers cannot move cattle from one field to another field if the cattle have to walk across a dry wash without a permit. For materials for road building and maintenance, they will need to apply for a permit to do the work which will slow down all work and the costs will be passed on to taxpayers. Information has sent out that Nancy will forward to the PCs so all can be adequately informed how to use links to do some research and post comments to the EPA. The deadline is in October and Nancy is concerned that we will get focused on the elections and will forget about this issue so she will be sending reminders. We need to keep the pressure on the EPA through the election season.

3) Candidates and their literature will be available after the meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn at 8:58.
