# THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

This week I am caring for our two oldest grandsons, Aiden (9) and Ethan (6), while Marge is in South Africa. And just today, Ethan lost his first baby tooth. The entire episode was epic. I was in the garage when he came out and announced he had a loose tooth, wiggling it with his tongue. By the time I got inside, big brother Aiden had taken it on himself to pull that tooth. He had Ethan backed against the wall, and like a MASH surgeon he had his grubby unwashed fingers locked around Ethan's tooth trying to lever it out. I thanked him for the



effort and reassigned the task to Ethan himself. To assist we gathered at the computer to watch a few YouTube videos of kids pulling their own teeth. That changed his attitude from dread to gleeful optimism. He chose the string option. I doubled a piece of sewing thread from Ouma's sewing room and secured it around the tooth, which was now bent forward and ready to surrender. He grabbed the string in a tight fist, and with one hearty yank the tooth popped out. Ethan went bounding through the house in jubilation. We had to face-time mommy, daddy, and Ouma, all of whom promised that the Tooth Fairy would stop by tonight.

Isn't that the way it's supposed to be. Every day is full of blessings and adventure. November is always a time of sharing memories and giving thanks. I write these personal reflections with a spirit overflowing with gratitude for the four joyful years at FCC Weston— a journey that is rapidly coming to an end. But as I think back, my mind is a cup running over with good memories of all we have done together—the patriotic moments like the July 4<sup>th</sup> parade; nostalgic traditions, like the live nativity, caroling on the church steps, and the Christmas Eve candlelight service; fun moments like Mother's Day and Father's Day, and the children's parade on Palm Sunday; traditional fellowship events like the annual Chili Cook-off and the community Thanksgiving Service; outreach victories like gathering canned goods and clothing for Samaritan Inn; and unique spiritual moments like baptisms in the Dimocks' pool. And I will remember your eager support of my trip to Zambia last year with a medical team called Mission Regan.


So, anticipating another wonderful Thanksgiving season, I say God bless you all. And as the song goes, "Thanks for the memories."

# **HYMN OF THE MONTH - "GIVE THANKS"**

This became one of worship leader Don Moen's most famous songs, however, it was not written by him. Following the introduction of the song during a worship service at the Williamsburg New Testament Church in Virginia in 1978, a military couple reintroduced it to a congregation in Germany. The song eventually caught the attention of executives at Integrity Music. When Integrity's Hosanna! Music copyrighted the song in 1986, the author was unknown. After the *Give Thanks* album was released, the song was brought to the attention of original writer



Henry Smith, who contacted Integrity with authorship information. Integrity later included songwriting credits on all subsequent releases, along with a writer-publisher agreement. As of 2010, the song has been recorded by over 50 companies and published in songbooks around the world.

# **OCTOBER BOARD MEETING SYNOPSIS**

- The minutes were approved from the September board meeting.
- Marilyn Chamberlin presented the financial report. One bill was paid two times in the same month just because of how the bills hit our account. Income was \$7,971.65 and expenses were \$5,947.41.
- Les Massey presented the updated constitution and by-laws. Board members need to read over the revised constitution and by-laws and submit final changes to Les Massey.
- Kimberly Tisserand has contacted Texas Aerographics and received a layout design of the sign. The signs will be ordered this week. The bottom of the sign needs to be at least 5 feet tall and possibly adding hooks at the bottom to put changeable informational signs up on the signs.
- Scooter Cave presented quotes for remodeling and fixing items at the church. Artisan Construction Group and Scott's Home Remodeling submitted quotes for painting the inside of the church, replacing doors, kitchen remodel and servicing the front steps and leveling of the church. The church needs to be leveled before any work can be done. We will get a second bid from Cunningham for leveling the church. Kimberly Tisserand will contact both companies regarding their quotes.
- Live Nativity will be on December 13-14, 2019.
- Members of the New Minister Committee will be Andy Dimock, Marilyn Chamberlin, Karen Chilton, and Danielle Chamberlin.
- Next meeting will be November 3, 2019 at 9:30 am.
