From the Desk of Rabbi Daniel Polish

F. Scott Fitzgerald was wrong. I don't mean about his underlying anti-Semitism which leeched out in his writing from time to time. Of course he was wrong about that too. But I am thinking about how

wrong he was when he said, "There are no second acts in American Lives".

We are about to observe our High Holy Days. And they are all about second acts. We take a hard and honest look at ourselves. Nothing wrong with patting ourselves on the back for what we did right. But we also have to be honest with ourselves about the things that we did that we are not proud of. And we get the chance to leave those things in the old year.

We are called on to do Teshuva. We evaluate ourselves, acknowledge our shortcomings, and apologize to the people we have wronged. And most importantly we are called on to change the patterns of our behavior. And if we do our "work" right, we are given the opportunity to start anew. We enter the new year as a "second act".

Our tradition gives us a great gift, the opportunity to clean our slate and start afresh. So I encourage you to take advantage of this great gift. May your work of Teshuvah go well. And may your second act be productive and joyous.

Cantor Hirschenfang joins me in wishing each of you a New Year of health, fulfillment and peace.

Notes from Cantor Gail Hirschenfang

Beautiful Music at the High Holy Days

I am happy to let you know that this year's Shir Chadash High Holy Day worship will be infused with wonderful music, as always. As some of you are already aware, I will not be joining you for this

year's High Holy Day services, but I know they will be exceptional. To help get you in the mood, I would like to share with you some biographical information on some of the extremely talented musicians that will be singing and playing for our service.

First and foremost, we will have many selections and anthems sung by members of our outstanding (and fearless!) Shir Chadash Choir. Our choir is comprised of several temple members who are extremely musical and deeply committed to enriching our worship experience with their time and talents. I am certain they will sing, as they always do, with true heart and soul.

Our musical director and pianist for the High Holy Day season will be Ruthanne Schempf. Ruthanne has played for us for many years and is deeply familiar with the liturgical music of Rosh Hashanna and Yom Kippur. Ruthanne has a deep affinity for our music and will work diligently with our choirs, both professional and lay, and our cellist. Many of you may not be aware that Ruthanne is a Professor at SUNY New Paltz in the Department of Music. She is also a member of the Pone Ensemble for New Music. Ruthanne holds a D.M.A and M.M. in Piano from the Manhattan School of Music. Ms. Schempf is an active chamber and solo musician and has performed throughout the United States. She is also a faculty member of the Interlochen Arts Camp where she can be found every summer. She has taught at Marist College and was the pianist for the Cadet Glee Club at West Point.

In her tenth year now, Brittany Sokolowski has been the soprano in our High Holy Day quartet. Brittany is a graduate of SUNY Purchase Conservatory of Music and holds her degree in Vocal Performance. She has participated in several operas during her time at Purchase. Brittany has a great facility for languages and is conversant in French, Italian, German, and Arabic. Following her time at SUNY Purchase, she taught French at Woodstock Day School. Brittany is a talented singer and musician. Both her father, Charles, and her brother, Christopher, have sung our High Holy Day services in past years.

Teresa Hitchcock also attended SUNY Purchase Conservatory of Music and holds a degree in Vocal Performance. An outstanding student, she had leads in many of the school's productions, including Rosalinde in *Die Fledermaus*, the witch and mother in *Hansel and Gretel*, and the Mother in *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. Teresa has also been with us for many years and brings a soulful and beautiful sound to her mezzo soprano singing.

New to Shir Chadash this year is our tenor, Ross Schwaber. Ross holds a master's degree in Vocal Performance from Hunter College. A talented opera singer and pianist, he teaches private students in voice, piano, and language diction. Ross sings with various opera companies in and around NYC. He is on the faculty of Trevor Day School as a music instructor. Ross has performed a great deal of Jewish music and has sung duets with his friend, Cantor David Rosen of Westchester. Ross' voice is exciting and his musicianship outstanding.

Our bass this year is the very talented Kent Smith. Kent is an Associate Professor of Music at SUNY New Paltz and runs their voice program. Many of his voice students have won prizes and awards. He holds a BFA from Carnegie Mellon University. Kent's vast musical career includes singing opera, operetta, and musical theatre. He has been a soloist with many opera companies including the New York City Opera, Lyric Opera of Cleveland and the Caramoor Music Festival.

In November of 2017, while on sabbatical from SUNY New Paltz, he performed the role of composer, Virgil Thompson, in the opera, *The Mother of Us All*, performed at the historic Hudson Opera House. Kent is also a gifted pianist and has played services for us on a few Friday nights.

For the last many years, those of you who have attended our beautiful Kol Nidre services have experienced the gifts of cellist, Susan Seligman. Susan has been playing cello since the fourth grade and it seems she hasn't put it down since. She has been the principal cellist for the Hudson Valley Philharmonic since 1984. She has taught at Vassar College and is now a Professor of Music at SUNY New Paltz. She has played with the Innisfree Piano Trio on occasion as well. Susan has played Kol Nidre services for Shir Chadash for close to a decade and it was particularly touching when she would bring her father to services with her.

Although I cannot worship with you this year, I know our music will be in very capable hands! I extend my wishes to all of you for a happy and healthy 5779!

- 5. Student Teacher Training Program for teens who would like to continue their Jewish Education.




