Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. These common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.

Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9 Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly. A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teachings approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

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

First a farmer came by with his cart. He grumbled because someone had left a large stone in the road which caused him great difficulty; painstakingly he skirted the stone but did not remove it.


Next, one of the king's soldiers with his head high stumbled over the obstacle, but did not remove it.

These words are not what I think, they are Gods' Words. Let Gods' Words be the authority. God said, the soul that sinneth, shall die. Not maybe, but shall die. Romans 6:23 ... "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life." When we work for hire we receive wages. When we serve the Devil with sin, the wages we receive is death. Again, it is a choice. Adam lacked 70 years living out one of Gods' days, for the Bible teaches us that one day is a thousand years. Genesis 5:5... "And all the days that Adam lived were nine-hundred and thirty years; and he died." The death sentence was pronounced upon Adam for his disobedience and sin. Heb. 9:27... "And as it is appointed unto man once to die, but after this the judgement." The appointment of death has been kept by Adam through all generations. No one escapes this ap-pointment of death. Some make appointments and fail to show up, but this appointment has been made by God and man will keep it. Man will also experience the judgement. Rev. 20:13... "And the sea gave up the dead which were in it, and the death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them, and they were judged every man according to their works." verse 14: "and death and hell were cast into the lake of fire, this is the second death." So it is a SECOND DEATH to the wicked, not eternal hell. This is not my idea but Gods' Word, and His word is authority-His word will be there in judgement.

Let me answer the question of those who say it is the soul that is tormented and not the body. I will answer in the words of Jesus. Matt. 10:28 ... "Fear not them which kill the body but are not able to kill the soul, but rather fear Him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." SECOND DEATH Both body and soul Jesus said. Webster defines destroy as: bringing to nought by putting out of existence or to kill. Man will be destroyed-experience the second death in the lake of fire. One cannot make the doctrine of eternal hell out of Jesus' words and Websters definition of destroy. Praise His precious name, it is good to know Christ in reality! Malachi 4:1... "For behold the day cometh that shall burn as an oven and all the proud yea, and all that do wickedly shall be stubble and the day that cometh shall burn them up saith the Lord of Host, that it shall leave them neither root or branch." verse 2... "But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall. verse 3... "And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ASHES under the soles of your feet in that day I shall do this saith the Lord of Host." Aren't you glad to let Gods' Word answer all these questions? I certainly Praise Him for His Word of Truth, no book like Gods' Word! Matt. 13:12 ... "Whose fan is in his hand, and he will thoroughly purse his floor, and gather his wheat unto the garner; but he will burn of the chaff or wicked, with unquenchable fire. There's no way of putting this fire out until you are completely consumed or burned up, destroyed. In Luke 3:17, there are almost the same identical words. Praise His precious name for His wonderful truth. Truth will stand when all other fails. Thank God! Malachi 4:3 says that ye shall tread down the wicked for they shall be ashes under your feet. When anything is burned to ashes, the fire goes out. I have tried to use simple words and tongue to explain this truth and let the scripture answer for me.

Some say they are out to defend the Bible, but turn this thought around. If we will strive to live and protect the Bible, it will defend us. Praise His wonderful name! I worship Him who is worthy of all praise. I do not have much opportunity to preach from the pulpit anymore, but the Holy Spirit does annoint me to preach some messages on sound doctrine in the Report. So please pray for this ministry, I enjoy it as it allows me to work for the Lord.

There are many, many scriptures I haven't used in this message as space wouldn't permit. In closing, I would like to say this to the Preachers who teach eternal hell. They say the l6th chapter of Luke means, the beggar Lazarus was a type of Christian (or church)... the rich man a type of sinner.. and Abrahams bossom was Heaven. They also say this was not a parable but that it actually happened. In response; if this were true, all you would have to do to go to heaven would be, to be poor; and to go to hell, rich. Such nonsense! This scripture reading in Luke is a parable and has nothing to do with Heaven or Hell, but deals with the Jews or the Gentiles. Some go to seed (a manner of speaking) on Lazarus being a type of the Church. But the Church that Jesus purchased with his precious blood is a glorious Church, not having spot or wrinkle. This is the Church He is coming back for. Prasie His sweet name!

I do hope and pray you get as much of a blessing out of reading this as I did writing it. One last thought, Websters definition of perish: to destroy or ruin, pass away or die.

I would be happy to hear from my Dear Brothers & Sisters in the Lord. It would mean so much to me.

Compassed About With So Great a Cloud of Witnesses

My Testimony:

This is not meant to be a sermon or a Bible lesson so sciptures I shall refer to will probably not be quoted exact but used to bring the thought I wish to express. Hebrews 12:1 reads "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us." This is referring to the people of so great faith mentioned in the chapter before but I am reminded of another great number of witnesses-The Family of God. It is through their faith and their prayers that I have climbed this mountain of trial the past few months.

Last March 12th, I had a heart attack and spent 10 days in intensive care. The 10th day was on Sunday and I was moved to a bed by the window. I remember talking with the Lord and looked at the pretty blue sky and told Him that had it been possible I would have been doing my part to teach His Word in the Church Services. It was usual for me to teach the adult Sunday School class, as well as helping in the Church service. As I lay there in the hospital bed the presence of the Lord quietly spoke to me to stop, look and listen. These are signs along a railroad track when on a country road crosses the track. "Just stop doing and come along with Me" I heard His presence say. Then look all around you. The flowers of spring and the new leaves on the trees all speak of the glory of God then listen - the birds are singing the praises of Him who feeds them. I learned it is nice to be about the Master's business but He has witnesses in this great creation of His which can tell the story of His love without the help of man. The sky, the plants, the birds as Jesus said in the sermon on the mount-"Even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed as these." I improved steadily except the least exertion caused more chest pain and it was determined I was not getting oxygen to my heart so it was arranged for me to be transferred to Oklahoma City to determine where the blockage was and if it could be dissolved with medication. The Lord helped me to pass this test but at the very last some of the cholesterol broke lose, and entered the blood stream. A piece lodged in the brain causing me to be completely paralyzed. It had to be up to the prayers of God's people now and in only a couple of days I was able to turn myself in bed and to move my arm and legs. It was new courage again. One evening a knock came on my door and a couple of people whom I had never seen nor heard of, nor their church, came in saying they came to pray for me. God does work in mysterious way. On Sunday p.m. a young man I had seen a few times while he was in school in Canyon, Texas came to see me and said he had heard my name mentioned in a prayer request that morning. I did not know the one who made the prayer request. I have received at least three get well cards from people I do not know. Surely God can well manage without the feeble efforts of man, but I know one thing for sure - I need the help and the prayers of those I love. In ten days I was able to be transferred back to Enid and then after a total of five weeks and two days my husband brought me home.

It was not to be all sunshine though; Satan added a lump on the side of the mountain I have been climbing and I had a detour to the hospital again recently with my heart. The Dr. called it congestive heart failure. I've found much to learn from a short story I read several years ago. Some people were building a new house when a wren made her nest in the unfinished pantry. She was not in the carpenter's way so they just continued and left the nest alone. Finally the little birds hatched and grew. The day came for them to leave the nest but one which was left behind struggled to follow the rest. As it as observed by those watching discovered a single horse hair was fastened around the leg. Just then the mother returned with a quieting chirp then left again. The baby began to cry again so one of the men untied the little one to set him free. Just then the mother returned scolding loudly. When she left it was discovered she had retied the horse hair around the little one's leg. Early the next morning the mother bird broke the horse hair and began the flying lessons with the baby, letting him rest frequently. She had left him behind when she took the others in the group that she could spend her undivided attention with this one only. Sometimes we see people who feel "so tied down" because

Sometimes we see people who feel "so tied down" because of lack of money or sickness in the family but we need to think of the little bird. We may need to be tied down until our wings of faith gain more strength. In Psalm 37:5 we read "Commit thy way unto the Lord; trust also in Him; and He shall bring it to pass." I'm home again and back to teaching my class. My God is real. Isaiah 40:31 reads "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint."

I want to thank every one of you who has held me up to God in prayer and have sent me letters and cards of encouragement. May God bless each of you. I desire that you continue to pray for me.

A Prophecy Study Laodicea - Revelation 3

Laodicea-Rev. 3:14-22 The Laodicean church age represents the years from 1900 to the present day so let us take special heed to the last message presented to the seven churches of Asia. We are fulfilling prophecy everyday as we are the Laodicean church age!

The letter begins stating three positions of Christ: The Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, and the beginning of the creation of God. Christ as the Amen could indicate that He is the final authority on all that has been spoken and written, declaring "so be it" on all events past and those to come. Christ also is the faithful and true witness of all of man's actions and will judge accordingly with all truth and honesty. He will not fail in His duty to man or His Father but is faithful to do what is best for us because He seeks His Father's will, not His own. John 5:30. "I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me." Again, in John 17:5, Jesus is asking for His Father to glorify Him and stating that He was with God His Father before the world was created—the beginning of the creation of God. "And now, O Father, glorify Thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was." Jesus Christ–loyal, faithful and true both to the Father and His children.

The Lord has no commendation for the Laodicean Church, but immediately states the church's saddened condition-that the people of the church were neither hot nor cold, only lukewarm. Because of their indifference and indecisiveness, they would be spewed out of the Lord's mouth; they would be rejected from His presence. Their sickening attitude was a detestable offense in the sight of God. This would indicate the church had lost its sight in the duties and entire priority in the King's service. We know the wicked have already sealed their fate for they have became enslaved in their own iniquity, much as today. Pro. 5:22. "His own iniquities shall take the wicked himself, and he shall be holden with the cords of his sins." Too many people think because they go to a church building, that is all that is required. People may want to do more, but even the greatest intention is a failure if not carried. To not become involved in events of life is such an overwhelming temptation. As Jesus said to His disciples in Matt. 26:41: "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak. Some people don't want to do anything. Wanting to be associated with a church because of its size or the social prestige it brings is pure hyprocrisy. To think that sitting in a church pew for a very few hours a week will earn the Heavenly reward is absurd. Not everyone may be physically able to work for the Lord, but ministering for Christ is much, much more that most people see. God excludes no one from benefits in the Christian life nor is anyone excluded from the sacrifices and efforts required of a true servant of God. A servant, literally, is what one has to be for God. There must be "Nothing Between" us and God. Desires of the heart; how foolish and selfish they are at times. One of the greatest desires a person can have: "Jesus use me, and please don't refuse me for surely there's a work that I can do. And even though it's humble, help my will to crumble. Though the cost be great, I'll work for you."Oh, that we would serve God how we should and not as we want! Man thinks he is so wise, so domineering, but why God is even mindful with humanity is sometimes more than the mind can conceive. "I stand amazed when I think the King of Glory would come to live within the heart of man He truly is "More than Wonderful"!

The Lord does nothing unjustly, as shown when He declares the cause of their rejection. Verse 17 explains the reason for lukewarmness: self-deception and the delusion of being independent that enflames masses of people. Rejection from the only Salvation of man is the terrible consequence for showing little or no concern to the destiny of one's soul. Is it actually possible for anyone to honestly say "I...have need of nothing?" Seemingly, no one is satisfied. The claim of the Laodicean Church of being rich, and increased with goods clearly shows that the church was snared by the false security of the world and the material splendor of their church. The church may have been rich financially, but actually was blind, poor in spiritual wealth, and naked before the eyes of God. Christ said "Blessed are the poor in spirit..."-highly honored or favored are those who realize that there is always the need for getting closer to the Lord. "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me. Psa 51:10. A spiritual cleansing should have been the church's plea instead, self-confidence overwhelmed them because of their increase in good. Consider the situation! A church boasting of sufficiency in spiritual wealth and abundant possessions. Does this describe any of the churches of today? Indeed it does. Millions of dollars are and have been spent to build massive, splendid churches. Seemingly, the church is trying to compete with the secular world in its production. The children of God do need a place to worship, and truly, the freedom of religion is one of the greatest freedoms that a person can possess! Only is it by knowing the Truth are we set free! Jesus Christ is the Truth. "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.!" John 8:36. Today, the word "religion" and the message of Christ doesn't necessarily mean the same. Many religions exist in the world. There is only one true Gospel! No man made opinions and speculations will ever replace the Word of God! Set free from the bondage of sin-oh what peace divine! Un-fortunately, due to the spirit of apathy, many people portray an act of spiritualism without wanting the righteousness; the profession without the experience! Spiritual blindness, caused by satan's deception, but also can not blindness be caused by simply a lack of interest within the heart to search the ways of God? The Laodicean Church professed they were not in need of anything but their true nature of spiritual bankruptcy was exposed before the Lord. Instead of being arrayed in righteousness, they had not on any garment, indicating again the indifference in not choosing the garments of God. He has promised to clothe us gloriously! To protect the precious life He has formed, the armour of God is provided. Properly attired, we have nothing to fear. "If God be for us, who can be against us.?" A terrible life and death lies ahead for those with no trust in God. While there is still time, the Lord advises people to buy of Him gold tried in the fire-precious faith that is able to withstand every trial of life. When Christ said to buy of Him so that we may be rich did not at all indicate that mere money can buy favor of God. Eter-nal life if offered to all,freely! Isa 55:1 "Ho, every one that thirsteth come ye to the waters, and he that hath no money; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price." The greatest cost had already been paid by Christ and in return all is asked is that we serve and pay honor to the One to whom we owe everything! The Lord lives but also has the power to take away, but we can have spiritual wealth beyond compare to all other riches that the world has to offer. Pro. 11:4 "Riches profit not in the day of wrath: but righteousness delivereth from death." Righteousness-a garmet of innocency and purity shall He clothe His people and cover all shame.

Today, at the present, it doesn't seem like people are ashamed of very many things. Perversion is flaunted before the public like a parade. The Laodiceans had shamed themselves in declaring their lives were in need of nothing-selfrighteousness-but we shame ourselves with many things, such as failing to stand for the Gospel. Can we have the same

testimony Paul stated in Rom. 1:16? "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth:..." Is the Church afraid to stand against the world? Are we afraid to make people upset because they don't agree with us? The Word of God is true, beyond any doubt, so there is no need to apologize for anything! Regrettably, some of the church and the world are accepting things that were once regarded as wrongdoing, but since the public cry for more freedom to "do their own thing," acceptance is becoming more widespread because so many people favor the hellenistic philosophy of "Live for today, tomorrow we may die."Christians cannot justify themselves by humanity! Pro. 21:2 "Every way of a man is right in his own eyes: but the Lord pondereth the hearts". Man is able to twist anything around, including the Scriptures, to suit his purpose. Outward appearance may deceive the world, but the Lord knows what evil lurks in the heart of man. His eyes behold the church trying to be something they aren't. Anyone that is "right in his own eyes," is selfrighteous and will diminish.

Isaiah 64:6 "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousness are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away." Notice "...our righteousness..." are as polluted garments. Ab-solutely nothing from the Lord is unjust or impure! Are we blind to the very sins that someday will take us away to a devil's hell or are we clay in the Potter's hand willing to be broken to be made perfect? Isa 64:8. Ignore not God's Words. With blinded eyes we look but do not see! There is no need to stumble in darkness any longer. John 8:12. "Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." In darkness, we lose our way until we take hold of His outstretched hand and are drawn into His marvelous light. To see clearly to follow Jesus and become light to a dying world will be the result of anointing the eyes through God's healing power. Christ has told the church what to do. Now He reveals that because of His love, they will be disciplined. We may think it harsh of Jesus to say this, but His reasons are the same as when parents discipline their children. The Lord corrects His own so that we may learn from our mistakes. When the Lord withdraws His correcting hand is the time to fear. Parents that have pampered their children or have totally neglected them, show no example of love. As His dear Children, lest we become rebellious, uses His assertive hand toward us. No matter how hard it seems when the Lord corrects us, We know that all things are possible through Christ and the final outcome will be for the best-deliverance and to rest with Him in eternity!" Pro. 23:13-14. "Withhold not correction from the child: for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die. Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and shalt deliver his soul from hell." "As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten..." ironically, strong words, yet words of His supreme love. Christ then adds "...be zealous therefore, and repent." To no one has been denied the opportunity to repent. To this invitation to this particular church age, He commands them to quit being lukewarm, but become interested in their Christian service. The ultimate decision of everyone is to choose-life or death. To the Church, Christ speaks, asking for entrance. At the door of the church Christ stands, assuring us that He will once again abide with us if we only hear Him and open the door. Too many churches have substituted formalism and ritualism for worship. It seems that the only place Christ has in the Church is sitting in a back pew. May we be so careful in service to the King! We are the Laodicean church age-wanting to work for the Lord, but yet just a little to secure or a little slothfulhoping to please the world but still be Christians. The following two statements are from a poem entitled "The Church and the World." "And so the Church and the World walked together, hand in heart. And none but the Master above, who knoweth all, could discern the two apart." The

expectant Bride of a Heavenly Groom is the harlot of the World." Are these statements true? Look around and decide for yourself.

Verse twenty-one, the promise is given! "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with my Father in his throne." As Christ overcame all He faced, we can overcome the world and receive of the Precious Lamb of God! Let us listen to every message given. John 8:51 "Verily, verily, I say unto you, If a man keep my saying, he shall never see death."
