According to Romans 10:9-10, "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved."

It's simple. All you have to do is believe and profess. You don't have to wait until you're perfect. Jesus died on the cross and was raised from the dead as payment for your sin. He died for you. Are you courageous enough to ask Him to forgive your sins and to come into your heart as your Lord and Savior? If so, from your heart, read this prayer aloud:

I'm asking You, Lord Jesus, to forgive me and to come into my heart and be my Savior. I ask You to live in me and to guide me from this day forward. Amen.
