Lovely Orchestral Sound with New Contrabass

A new Paetzold F contrabass was recently purchased by Mike and Kathy Kuhrt and is shown above. At the last HMRS meeting on Dec 4th a beautiful recorder orchestra sound was created with the addition of the new F bass.

The contrabass doubled on the regular bass line, in affect playing the line an octave lower with the basses. In addition, a C great bass played by Linda Botimer, doubled on the tenor line, playing the tenor line an octave lower. This created a deeper and fuller sound on our Renaissance Christmas music, and we hope to hear more soon.

President's Message

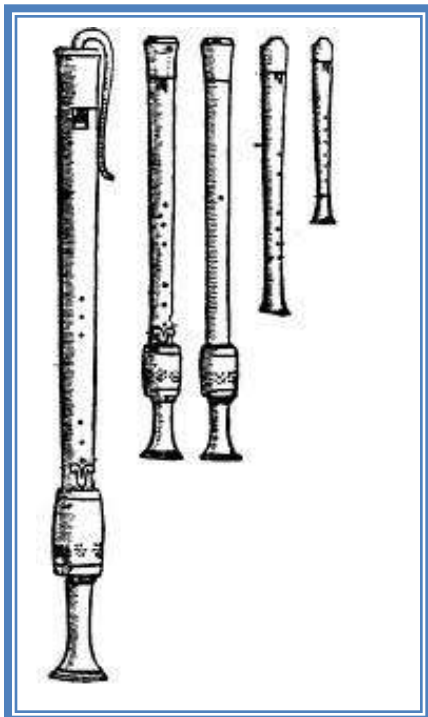
Happy New Year! I hope this year proves to be a happy, healthy and musical year for all.
