Business items:

1) Treasurer's report: No changes, current bank balance is approximately \$4187 with approximately \$200 cash-on-hand. Pending major expense is \$400 to update our website.

2) The trip to the American Armor Foundation (AAF) Museum, Danville, VA has been organized. We have reserved two, 7-pax rental vans (possible to reserve another). Currently have 12 members signed up with 2 seats left. Cost per head will be \$34.50 + share of the gas if we get 14 riders. (If we don't fill all 14 seats, we can either cancel one van or spread the prorated cost to everyone going.) Museum tickets will be \$9 if we reserve them ahead of time. Steve Reid and Mike Roof will drive, picking up the vans from CAE on Friday, 14 Oct, and returning them on Sunday, 16 Oct. **Request that all riders pay in advance NLT our 12 October regular meeting.** We have several members who will join us in Danville. Mike Roof will need a firm list of those folks to reserve the museum tickets.

3) We discussed and selected Saturday, 24 September as the date for our next "Club Build Day". We will hold the event at Mike Roof's house. Light refreshments and lunch (pizza?) will be served.

4) The November trip to Ft. Benning to tour the NACM is on. David Hobbs (our POC) has contacted me to say that he is open to any Saturday that month. During the August meeting we selected the weekend of November 4-6 for the trip. Tentative itinerary is to drive to Columbus, GA on Friday, tour the museum on Saturday, and return on Sunday. The travel option of taking private autos was also selected, so all attendees will either drive themselves or ride-share with another club member. The club will pay to take our host, David Hobbs and a guest out to dinner, probably on Saturday night. David Varetonni has offered to research hotel options in Columbus.

5) Floor was open for discussion of the 2016 IPMS/USA National Convention. Several club members won awards in armor and non-armor categories. See the article later in this newsletter for the list of Wildcat entries and their results, along with the link to the Official IPMS/USA Award

Pictures. Congratulations to all the winners! Also, our AMPS Club Display seemed to be well received by the convention patrons with lots of folks stopping by to look and chat.

6) New Business:

a) Club Group Build: "T-34 Based Subjects – All Eras, All Nationalities, All Scales." The subject just needs to be based on the T-34 hull / chassis, so self-propelled guns (SU-122/85/100) as well as other variants besides the standard gun-tanks are acceptable. Build will start this month, August, with a target end date of 15 February, 2017. This will allow us to present a club display at the Atlanta AMPS show, 17-19 Feb, 2017. Steve Reid will be guiding the build with advice, recommendations for kits and accessories, along with research assistance. Mike Roof will contact the Atlanta AMPS president, Mike Reaves to coordinate for the club display.

Our next regular meeting will be held on Wednesday, 14 September, 2016, 6-8 pm, at the HobbyTown store in the Publix Shopping Center (North Pointe Shopping Center), on Two Notch Road, Columbia (NE).

3) Our next Saturday "Club Build Day" is set for Saturday, 24 September, 2016, 11 am – 7:30 pm at Mike Roof's house. Members may arrive and depart on their own during the day. We will have light refreshments (drinks and snacks) available and will have lunch (pizza?). Members may bring anything to work on (doesn't even have to be armor). 4) The November trip to Ft. Benning to tour the NACM is on for the weekend of 4-6 November. David Hobbs (our POC) has contacted me to say that those dates are good. The itinerary is to drive to Columbus, GA on Friday, tour the museum on Saturday, and return on Sunday. Travel will be by personal auto, either drive yourself or ride with another club member. Tentatively we will take our POC and a guest to dinner on Friday or Saturday (paid for by the club). David Hobbs has suggested the "In Town Suites" 6040 Knology Way, Columbus, GA as a good place to stay. Dave Varetonni is also researching lodging options.

5) Mike Reaves, President, Atlanta AMPS has given us the go-ahead to do a club build (T-34 builds) display at their 17-19, February, 2017 show. You will be able to register and get your model judged and then have it placed by the runners with our club display. Mike Roof has also got a tentative OK from Mike Petty to do the same thing at the 2017 AMPS I-Con in Danbury.

6) We will discuss and get ideas for monthly "programs" for our meetings – SBS, How-to, Demos, etc. I would like to be able to schedule these out as far in advance as possible with volunteer presenters. Also, I would like to discuss the desirability of having monthly "Show & Tell Themes" – subjects, eras, tools, references, materials, etc. These could also be scheduled in advance and put on a meeting calendar.

7) Floor will be open for new business.

Regular Show & Tell to follow the business portion of the meeting. All topics and model subjects are welcome – completed builds, works in progress, "new stuff" (kits, books, tools, materials, etc.). Don't forget, if you can make it, the "meeting after the meeting" for dinner and socializing. This month, as usual, we'll probably go to Schianos next door, but we're open to other ideas...



New Technique – Reusable Paint Palette

Here's a little technique I found very helpful to aid in painting small pieces of your model where I didn't need a lot of paint.

You need:

- Metal or plastic Painter's Palette (available at your favorite hobby store such as Hobby Lobby or Michaels)
- a roll of Heavy Duty Aluminum Foil



As you can see in the left picture the paint trays have to be cleaned after normal use with pretty much any type of paint.

What I do is cover the tray with aluminum foil (such as the middle picture), placing my fingers in each indentation and smoothing out the center. (See right picture) This allows easy clean up by just replacing the foil. If you find there are remnants of thinner or paint left over before you remove the foil, just soak up the excess with a paper towel. If I only need a few drops of paint to do the intended job I place these in the center area and some thinner in one of the cups on the tray.

As to interaction of the paints with the aluminum foil I haven't seen any. I normally use acrylics and oils. If you use enamels or laquers I would suggest testing the foil first. In researching this article all sites suggested that acetone containing products do not react with aluminum foil.



Interesting Articles – Finishing Sequence

Here's an interesting article Carl Wethington sent to me last year when I was getting back into modeling. I have found this has helped me immensily especially keeping the finishing procedures in order.

"Because I can't seem to do anything without a checklist, here is my "method" that I put together for myself several years ago:

- D Primer
- □ Base Color Panel Fading

- □ Light Panel Fading
- □ Future for Decals
- Apply Decals
- □ Paint/Correct / Modify Decals
- □ Paint Wheels and Tracks
- Detail Painting
- Spray Weathering Colors on Lower Surfaces for Mud/Dirt/Dust (also on Tracks, Running Gear and Wheels
- Flat Clear Coat
- □ Dry Brush Highlights
- □ Light Overall Wash (Dark Wash on Lower Surfaces)
- □ Streaking / Dot Filters
- □ Reverse Dry Brushing
- □ Future
- □ Pin Wash (Dark Color)
- □ Flat Clear Coat

This list has only been a guide for me, and I have done steps in a different sequence many times. Also, I go back and repeat some of the steps as needed to correct repairs, improve weathering, etc. -- as Mike Roof once said there is no hard and fast process, use what works best for you".



Intersting Articles – Gator's Grip Hobby Glue

I remember at earlier AMPS meetings several of our members spoke of using Gator's Grip glue for attaching small parts. So I thought I would order some. In researching my purchase, I could not find it even on Amazon or Ebay. However, I was able to find the website link for this product. The following link takes you directly to Kenny Loup, the owner of Gator's Glue:


Ordering is a simple process by just emailing him, email address on his website. So I ordered 2 bottles at \$5.00 each plus \$2.60 in shipping. When he emailed me with the shipping information he included a PDF file of instructions for using the glue. With his approval the following are the directions he provided.




Below is a step-by-step on how I use my glue. The bottle I am using is from the same batch as your bottle.

• Step 1 Photo Etch & Plastic - I apply my glue with a brush the size of the part I am gluing.





• Step 2 Photo Etch & Plastic - I place the PE railing in the glue.







• **Step 3** Photo Etch & Plastic - Using the same brush cleaned with water and squeezing all of the water out, I carefully remove the excess glue.



• Step 4 Photo Etch & Plastic - Set aside to dry. Now, I always have a small fan blowing on the work bench to vent the fumes from plastic welding glue and assist with drying time for paint.



• Step 5 Photo Etch & Plastic - By the time I got everything cleaned up and the last photo taken, approximately 20 minutes from the first photo, the glue is dry and I can balance a pair of tweezers on the photo etch railing and the plastic strip. Drying time from start to finish is about 10 minutes or so. You will know when the glue is dry because it will be clear.




Additional instructions provided by Mr. Loup were: "If it has been a while since you used your glue, please take time to stir it up. The ingredients will try to separate over time and stirring it before use will take care of that problem.

Here's what one modeler does with his left over smaller kit parts and decals: Larger parts go in kit boxes.

"I have F-8 parts in an F-8 box, F-4 parts in multiple F-4 boxes, etc. I also have my conversion and upgrade parts in boxes that "mostly" match the aircraft types. I store spare and left over decals the same way as I store all of my aftermarket and kit decals when they are "new".


