2018-2019 PROJECT WARMTH GUIDELINES

Program Description

Project Warmth is a United Way of Long Island <u>emergency</u> assistance program to help families and individuals with energy emergencies. It provides one-time assistance for fuel and fuel related electricity. The program period is scheduled to open December 2018 and will be available until funds are exhausted. A customer may use a Project Warmth heating grant to pay for any fuel source: oil, gas or electric, propane, kerosene, coal, wood and an electric bill if electricity is needed to operate the heating source.

Basic Eligibility Requirements

Among the eligibility guidelines applicants must meet are:

- > Residency in Nassau County, Suffolk County or the Rockaway area in Queens (PSEGLI service area).
- > Show a heating and/or fuel-related electric bill in applicant's name and address that is in termination, pending disconnect or severely overdue (for any fuel source) or be financially unable to secure heating oil/propane/kerosene etc. when the tank is empty/near empty.
- Demonstrate financial hardship and provide an acceptable explanation for arrears.
- ➤ Applicant may only receive one fuel and/or one fuel related electric assistance once within the program year.
- ➤ HEAP eligible clients <u>must</u> apply to Emergency HEAP before Project Warmth.

Some Ineligible Conditions

- ➤ Project Warmth is for emergencies only not continual assistance. Clients who received repeated Project Warmth assistance 2 consecutive years (2016-2017 and 2017-2018) are ineligible for assistance.
- Bill not in applicant's name or applicant not in residence at billing address.
- ➤ Non-active account or commercial account.
- Non fuel-related electricity accounts (heat included in rent).
- Current bill with no past due amount.
- Topped oil tank during a prior Project Warmth grant period.

Application

<u>Applications are not sent out or received by mail.</u> PLEASE NOTE, a referral is not a guarantee of acceptance. The Project Warmth agency staff will determine eligibility based on the documentation provided by the applicant and more detailed application requirements than are listed above.

United Way's Project Warmth Emergency Fuel Fund

Right now, some 30% of Long Islanders don't earn enough to make ends meet or heat their homes during the cold winter months. United Way of Long Island operates the Project Warmth Emergency Fuel Fund, Long Island's only non-government island-wide emergency fuel fund. Project Warmth is a safety net for struggling families and individuals in our region who are unable to pay a heating bill. The program provides one-time grants to provide payments to oil and utility companies on behalf of eligible residents facing heating emergencies. Hundreds of families, who may be choosing between heating their home and buying food or a medication, are assisted each year with an oil delivery or a utility arrears.

Project Warmth opens in December and operates in partnership with a team of 15 community based organizations that screen for eligibility and accept applications for assistance.
