## In the Kitchen with Joanna

I would like to thank everyone for the get well wishes, cards and visits during my convalescence after my knee surgery. I greatly appreciated it and it lifted my spirits tremendously.

## Pistachio Cake

1 yellow cake mix

1 small package of instant pistachio pudding mix

4 eggs

1 1/2 cups of water

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1/2 tsp. almond extract

7 drops of green food coloring

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 10 inch tube or bundt pan. In a large bowl mix together cake mix and pudding mix. Make a well in the center and pour in eggs, water, oil, almond extract and food coloring.

Blend ingredients for 2 minutes on medium speed. Pour into prepared pan. Bake for 50-55 minutes or until cake springs back when lightly pressed. Cool in pan for 15 minutes. Turn out onto rack and cool completely.

Dust with powdered sugar and serve.


