NEW YEAR'S "REVOLUTIONS"



Have you made a New Year's resolution? Or perhaps more than one? I'm sure many of us do – perhaps to lose weight, eat healthier, get in shape, read more, or strive for some other type of personal improvement.

Resolutions are fine if you keep them. Sometimes it takes a new year, a fresh start, a conscious marking of time to set a goal. Just make sure the goal is attainable, otherwise you may deal with the feelings of guilt and failure that come with a broken resolution — which can cause you to be worse off than you were before.

Besides typical New Year's resolutions like those mentioned above, I suggest that we make a New Year's "Revolution." By "revolution" I mean that we consciously decide to *turn away* from old actions, an old habit, or an old way of living that may somehow be negative, self-seeking, or harmful. We may be in need of an abrupt about face when it comes to certain behaviors. So, this year, resolve to turn FROM the negative and TO the positive — God's way.

Does this theme sound familiar? It should. In the church, we call it repentance. It was a theme of John the Baptist during Advent and it will be a theme of Lent, which starts next month. To repent, by definition, means to "turn from." Hence... to "revolve." So, my idea of making a New Year's Revolution isn't a new one. It's just a different way of looking at the cliché of the New Year's resolution.

But turn we must. As John says in his first letter: "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves..." So, don't deceive yourself for we all fall short. Ask yourself: What revolutions can I make in my life? From what harmful attitude or negative behavior should I turn? How does God want me to respond in these areas of my life?

If this all sounds negative, it's not intended to be. We must identify the sickness before we can affect a cure. To make a New Year's Revolution is a positive thing! It's an act that brings us closer to the Good News, closer to the Kingdom. It's a great way to start the year! And it's a great way to begin living the rest of your life!



Changes have occurred within the Spiritual Council and CE Board as well. Thanks to those who have served and are about to serve.


