

Documentary Film Examines Homelessness: *Desolation Slow*

A glimpse of hope into how to address homelessness comprehensively is the aim of a new documentary film playing at the Zeitgeist in Duluth.

Filmmaker Allen Killian-Moore says the impetus for the film, *Desolation Slow*, came from a program he visited in Utah called Housing First.

“The Housing First model puts housing first, instead of requiring that people have all their mental illness or chemical dependence needs together, they can move into housing with full support to work on all their issues,” said Killian-Moore, adding, “I hope people will take away that there are effective models out in the world of how to help people experiencing homelessness that have better results than you usually see.”

Going to Utah without a specific film objective, Killian-Moore says he just wanted to explore the idea of homelessness, and came out of the experience with a film that tells a story of Joe Ortega who was in the Housing First program after about 20 years of homelessness and struggles with alcoholism.

“I designed the film to more of a visual experience, it's not edited and designed in a conventional way,” said Killian-Moore.

Shooting all the film himself,

Killian-Moore says he approaches the work with a fine artist approach, weaving still and moving shots from a variety of cameras and on different film.

“It's about creating a certain aesthetic, gathering all the film shots together like an artist would gather colors of a palette to speak to one another and also to the subject,” Killian-Moore stated.

Desolation Slow will be playing at Zeitgeist Teatro Zuccone in Duluth on February 1st, 8:00 to 9:30 pm with an introduction by Killian-Moore.

The musical score was composed by Chicago musician Bill Tucker, who Killian-Moore says is an avant garde guitarist with a very cinematic sound that was a good fit.

“I took everything he recorded live in two long takes and cut it together into the film to create a tapestry of sound to compliment the visuals,” said Killian-Moore.

An artist question and answer forum will following the film. Tickets can be purchased in advance, or at the door. General Admission is \$10.

Killian-Moore is also scheduled to have a solo exhibition of video installations at the Duluth Art Institute in Spring 2019.
