School Safety and Emergency Procedures

School safety for our students, staff and VPE community is the most important responsibility here at Villa Park Elementary. As we continue to reflect on our lockdown that took place at various OUSD schools including VPE in December, one area we believe we could improve in, is the sharing of emergency procedures with our families. In this article I would like to share information on how we practice for possible lockdowns, what types of situations would constitute a lockdown versus a shelter in place, how I will communicate with teachers and staff in the classroom as well as how we will communicate with parents.

First, we practice for all types of school emergencies. Our VPE students practice for fire, earthquake, and lockdown emergencies during various times of day. Scheduled drills occur during class time, recess, assemblies, you name it. We have an extensive plan in place for all levels of emergency. In regards to our lockdown and shelter in place procedures there are two levels of lockdown when there is a possible threat on campus. We will call an immediate lockdown whenever there is a possible threat on campus or to our campus.

On December 7th, 2018 we called an immediate lockdown, called the police, and notified the district we

were on lockdown. The lockdown was communicated through our campus wide PA system. When a lockdown is announced, lock blocks are immediately removed, the lights

are turned off, and students move to a safe location away from visible windows. Students know not to open the door for anyone. In December, the lockdown was lifted to a shelter in place once the police arrived and deemed the campus not to be under immediate threat. During a shelter in place students and staff continue with instruction as usual however, they are to remain in locked classrooms and may not leave for any reason. If parents want to pick up their child during a shelter in place we are not able to release until the shelter in place has been lifted. This is for the safety of all children.

During emergencies the school uses the school messenger system to communicate with families. As soon as it is possible and safe I will notify parents we are sheltering in place. Please know that your children are safe at school as we have practiced for emergencies as well as received training on what to do in all types and levels of emergency.

I am also pleased to share that we have been able to purchase, through our School Plan for Student Achievement, a new set of walkietalkies for all teachers and classrooms. This will assist with our ability to communicate effectively and efficiently during emergencies. If you ever have questions regarding our lockdown or shelter in place procedures please feel free to contact me.



2019-20 School Year Pertussis (Whooping Cough) Immunization and Varicella Requirements

All 7th Grade Students will need to Provide Proof of a Pertussis Booster and 2nd Varicella vaccine.



On July 1, 2011, California Assembly Bill 354 requires that all 7th grade students entering school for the 2019-20 school year will be required to provide proof of a Tdap (Pertussis) booster. This may be met by receiving this booster on or after your child's 7th birthday.

Starting July 1 2019 all children will require





Safety for our Students, Parents and Staff!

Be Safe at Morning Drop Off and Afternoon Pick Up!

It is our intention and hope that all students and families arrive safe on campus. Please, please use caution and patience in the morning and afternoon. Please use the crosswalks at all times and avoid darting across Center Dr. and Lincoln Ave. Even drivers paying attention cannot see you or a young student suddenly running across the street. Please set a good example for your children, be courteous to other drivers and those using the crosswalk.

Morning Drop Off: 7:45 to 8:00 am

- Please DO NOT drop off early—especially in the back. Students are not supervised.
- Allow more time than you think you will need, traffic and parking do move slowly
- There is less traffic at 7:45am, so please plan and leave a few minutes earlier.
- Please check your parking spot, DO NOT park in stalls marked "STAFF"
- DO NOT park where curbs are painted red or with in 30 feet of a stop sign.

- Clarify your pickup location with your student(s)
- Post your name visibly in the front window for front lot drive up Older siblings should meet younger siblings
- Please be courteous and DO NOT cut in front of the drive up lane if there is cars already lined up waiting
- Please DO NOT ask your child to wait off campus
