## Why The Flag Is Folded Thirteen Times

As with many military ceremonies the folding of the American Flag that drapes a coffin, plays a symbolic role in the burial of a United States soldier.

Here are the reasons that it is folded thirteen times, according to the American Legion.

The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The fourth fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God. It is to Him we turn to in times of peace, as well as in times of war, for His divine guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country for the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with wother countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our hearts that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to the armed forces for it is through the armed forces that America and its flag is protected against all enemies where they are found within or without the boundaries of the country.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day and to honor our mother for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that the nation's men and women who have made their country great have been molded.

The tenth fold is a tribute to father, for he too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of the country.

The eleventh fold, in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
