- 4. Susie acknowledged this is her last meeting. She is moving on to solely be the Clubhouse Chair along with helping out with her first grandchild. **Thank you** Sue for all your hard work the past two years!
- 5. **Approval of 2021 Minutes**: a motion was made by Mike G. to waive reading the minutes & move to approval. Bill A. 2nd the motion & all approved.
- 6. Due to a copier malfunction only 40 packets of 2022 revised Rules & Regulations were available. Watch the newsletter to see how to obtain a copy.

MANAGEMENT REPORT given by Jim Reuschlein:

- 1. The installation of vinyl siding. The clubhouse will be completed mid-October.
- 2. The concrete work will begin on October 10
- 3. Asphalt replacement will be completed the end of this week. Jefferson Court, Williamsburg, Valley Forge & the remainder of Heritage Blvd.
- 4. The brick facia for the LED sign has been completed.
- 5. Brick repair has begun & will continue throughout the summer.
- 6. Six foot stripping with unit numbers will be re-done starting October 3 over 4 days, weather permitting. Flyers will be distributed ahead of time. Be prepared to move cars, parking spaces will be swept before painted.
- 7. Six buildings were power washed this year. Now that all buildings are vinyl-sided we will increase the number of buildings for power washing next year.

Snowbirds & others who leave for warmer weather, no matter how long, must leave a key with someone close by. Be sure to put a sticker on your door with the name & phone number of your contact in case of emergencies. This person should also inspect your unit periodically to make sure everything is okay.

Set your thermostat no lower than 60 degrees. **DO NOT** shut off your heat when you leave. If you can, please turn your water off, if a pipe bursts only the water in your pipes will flood the area. If you do not turn off your water and pipes do burst not only your unit floods but your neighbor also.

If you leave a car behind you either must leave a key with your neighbor to move if it snows or park it off site.

BE PREPARED.....WINTER IS ON IT'S WAY!



It's almost that time of year we dread here at Colonial Acres! Snow, Snow, & more Snow. So, here's a reminder about moving cars after a 2 inch or more snowfall.

Plowing will begin early morning of Heritage Dr. & all other streets. By 8:00 am the plows will be plowing parking & courtyard areas.

As your street gets plowed the drivers will sound a loud horn to let you know to move your cars to plowed areas so they can plow the parking areas. Don't wait to hear the horn, be ready to move your car! **DO NOT MOVE CARS BEFORE YOUR AREA GETS PLOWED!**

Cars that are not moved will receive a warning ticket for violation of rules. If you still do not move your car, it will be towed by Wixom towing. IF you cannot move your car, please ask a neighbor or make arrangements to park your car off Colonial Acres streets.

MAKE SURE YOUR OUTDOOR AREA IS WINTERIZED

Any spigot exposed to winter weather will need to be winterized to avoid freezing line & property damage. This is each individual unit's responsibility. **Hoses must be removed, drained, & left off of the spigot to winterize**.



The Farmers' Almanac is predicting a **harsh winter across the United States** in 2022-23, and New York is expected to have it worse than many states. The Northeast winter is expected to have "significant shivers" and be "slushy, icy and snowy, according to the Farmers' Almanac.

The first bite of winter should come earlier than last year's. <u>December 2022</u> looks stormy and cold nationwide with an active storm pattern developing and hanging around for most of the season over the eastern half of the country, the almanac says.

It's predicting big snow the first week of January in the Rockies and Plains states, with good potential for heavy snow that may reach as far south as Texas and Oklahoma. Then bitter cold.

The almanac says that Jan. 16-23 is likely to bring heavy rain and snow across the eastern two-thirds of the country, then icy blasts that could reach minus 40 degrees. If you're wondering about snow, the almanac predicts cold rain and slush in the south, lots of snow storms in the north-central states, more snow in the Ohio Valley and Great Lakes area and heavy snow in the south-central states. If you believe The Farmers Almanac you better buckle up for winter!

Dinner for Two By: Christen Anttila **ORANGE GLAZED CHICKEN**

1 TLB Flour ½ tsp salt ¼ tsp pepper

1 boneless chicken breast 2 tsp vegetable oil dash nutmeg

½ tsp orange marmalade ½ cup orange juice

Coat chicken with flour, salt/pepper & brown in oil. Spread marmalade on chicken: sprinkle with nutmeg, & add orange juice. Simmer for 15 minutes.

HERBED RICE

1/2 top uncooked rice 1 green onion cut in 1" pieces 1 TLB butter

1/8 tsp each, tarragon, thyme, pepper, basil, parsley

½ cup chicken broth

Cook rice & onion in butter till tender. Add seasonings, cook 1 more minute. Add broth, cover, & simmer for 15 minutes or until rice is tender.

FRENCH PEAS

1 tsp butter 2 tsp water ½ cup frozen peas 2 thin onion slices

2 med. Mushrooms, cut thin pinch of salt

Melt butter in pan, add all ingredients, cover, & cook until tender
